The Control of Trade in War Time Act.

WHEREAS by "The Control of Trade in War Time Act" it is provided that the Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission appointed under the said Act, may, by Order in Council, fix the maximum price that may be lawfully charged for the necessaries of life: And whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of September, 1915, the maximum price to be charged for fresh milk in the Metropolitan Area was fixed as therein provided: And whereas it is desirable that the prices so fixed shall not apply to local fresh milk as hereinafter defined, and that the maximum prices to be lawfully charged in the Metropolitan Area for local fresh milk shall be fixed as hereinafter provided: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the Order in Council made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of September, 1915, shall not apply to local fresh milk as hereinafter defined, and doth hereby fix the maximum price to be charged for local fresh milk in the Metropolitan Area as follows:—Wholesale: Maximum selling price to be charged by producers to retailers or distributors, One shilling and fourpence per gallon delivered on the premises of the retailer or distributor within the said area. Retail: Maximum selling price to be charged by retailers or distributors to consumers within the said area, Sevenpence per quart. The term "local fresh milk" shall mean fresh milk distributed to the consumer within twelve hours of the time of production. The conditions of trade as existing on the 1st August, 1915, shall not be varied without the consent of the Royal Commission appointed as aforesaid, on application made to the Commission in that behalf. For the purposes of this Order the Metropolitan Area means any land situated within twelve miles of the General Post Office, Perth.

This Order shall come into operation on the 27th day of September instant.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applicants who are officers of the Public Service of a State should state the date of their appointment to the service, present position, and salary.

Applicants from outside the service should state their qualifications for the office they seek. Copies only of diplomas, references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Applications should be addressed to the "Commonwealth Public Service Inspector" of the State in which the vacancy exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries, where shown, indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.
