Repeal

4. Clause 2 of Alteration of Statutory Designations Order (No. 2) 1983 is repealed.

RURAL AND INDUSTRIES BANK ACT 1944
RURAL AND INDUSTRIES BANK ACT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 1986
MADE by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under section 65C.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Rural and Industries Bank Act Amendment Regulations 1986.

Principal regulations

2. In these regulations the Rural and Industries Bank Act Regulations 1945* are referred to as the principal regulations.

Commencement

3. These regulations shall come into operation on the day on which section 7 of the Rural and Industries Bank Amendment Act 1984 comes into operation.

Part IA inserted

4. After Part I of the principal regulations the following Part is inserted—

PART IA**Savings Bank Division**

17A. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name of any person, including a body corporate or any unincorporated body or association of persons.

(2) An account so opened and kept for a body corporate or an unincorporated body or association of persons may be operated on by such person as is, or persons as are, authorized for the time being to do so by the body or association.

17B. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name of an infant.

(2) An account so opened and kept may be operated on—

(a) by the infant if he has attained the age of 12 years, or appears to an officer of the Bank making a payment to have attained that age, in the same manner and upon the same conditions as apply to persons who are not infants; and

(b) in the case of an infant who is under the age of 12 years, by a parent or guardian of the infant or by any other person if the Commissioners are of the opinion in respect of any payment that the payment is necessary or desirable.

17C. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name or names of one or more trustees, and may, on proof of appointment to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, allow the name of any person to be substituted or added as trustee.

(2) An account so opened may be operated on—

(a) by the trustee or trustees for the time being;

(b) on the death of a trustee by the surviving trustee or trustees; or

(c) on the death of the sole trustee or the last surviving trustee, by the beneficiary or beneficiaries if the Commissioners are satisfied that he or they are absolutely entitled to the money standing to the credit of the account.

(3) The Commissioners may if they think fit, before they make a payment to a trustee or trustees under subregulation (2), require the consent of the beneficiary or beneficiaries.

(4) Where money has been deposited by a person or persons in trust for any other person, a person other than the trustee or trustees shall not, except as provided in subregulation (2) (c), have any claim against the Commissioners in respect of the money, but this regulation does not operate to relieve the trustee or trustees from any liability to account for or apply the money in accordance with law.

17D. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the names of 2 or more persons jointly.

(2) An account so opened and kept may with the approval of the Commissioners be operated on—

(a) by such person or persons and in such manner as may be authorized by the persons in whose name the account is kept; and

(b) subject to subregulation (3), on the death of any one of those persons, by the survivor or survivors.

(3) Subregulation (2) (b) does not apply where the persons in whose name the account is kept have given to the Commissioners a written direction that there is to be no right of survivorship on the death of any one of those persons.

17E. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name of the estate of a deceased person.

(2) An account so opened and kept may with the approval of the Commissioners be operated on by any executor, administrator, or trustee for the time being of the estate.

17F. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name of any person who desires to deposit money therein for a special purpose approved by the Commissioners.

(2) In subregulation (1), "person" includes—

(a) a body corporate or an unincorporated body or association of persons, and regulation 17A (2) applies to an account kept under this regulation by such a body or association; and

(b) 2 or more persons jointly, and regulation 17D (2) applies to a joint account kept under this regulation.

17G. (1) The Commissioners may open and keep a savings bank account in the name of any insolvent, bankrupt, sequestered or assigned estate, or any company in liquidation and may—

(a) assign to it such name or style as the Commissioners determine; and

(b) on proof of appointment to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, allow the name of any other person to be substituted or added as assignee or liquidator.

(2) An account so opened and kept may be operated on by the person or persons who hold office as assignee or liquidator for the time being.

17H. Where the Commissioners are satisfied that—

(a) a person who is authorized to operate on an account has become incapable of managing his affairs by reason of mental or physical incapacity; and

(b) the urgent closure of, or an urgent payment from, the account is necessary, they may pay the whole or any part of the sum standing to the credit of the account to such person or persons as they consider proper.

17I. A depositor shall not have any claim against the Commissioners in respect of any deposit unless it was made at a branch or agency of the Commissioners and during the hours when the branch or agency was open for receipt of deposits.

17J. Interest on deposits shall be calculated in such manner, and credited to the depositor's account at such times, as the Commissioners determine.

17K. (1) The Commissioners may—

- (a) refuse to open an account for a person, body or association of persons;
- (b) refuse to continue a person, body or association of persons as a depositor.

(2) The Commissioners may refuse to accept from any person a deposit of less than \$1.00.

(3) Where the Commissioners refuse to continue a person, body or association of persons as a depositor, the Commissioners shall pay to that person, body or association of persons any money standing to the credit of his account including accrued interest, or if it is impossible or impracticable to do so, the Commissioners shall carry such money and interest to the Fund referred to in section 65V of the Act to be dealt with as part of that Fund.

17L. (1) Where a savings bank account is opened a passbook may be issued to the depositor or the person, body or association of persons at whose request the account is opened.

(2) A passbook so issued is the property of the Bank and shall, when required by the Commissioners, be produced at such time or times and at such place or places as the Commissioners specify.

17M. (1) Before any money standing to the credit of a savings bank account is withdrawn, the Commissioners may require a withdrawal form, in the form provided by the Commissioners, to be presented to the Commissioners signed by the person or persons authorized to operate on the account.

(2) Money withdrawn from a savings bank account may be paid to the person or persons presenting the withdrawal form and if that person is, or those persons are, not the person or persons authorized to operate on the account, the receipt of the money by the person presenting the withdrawal form shall, for all purposes, have the same effect as the receipt of the money by the person or persons authorized to operate on the account.

(3) Where a period of notice prior to any withdrawal from a savings bank account is required by the Commissioners, a person or persons authorized to operate the account is not entitled, without the approval of the Commissioners, to make a withdrawal until the required notice has been given and has expired.

(4) Notwithstanding subregulation (1), the Commissioners may allow the savings bank account of a depositor approved by them to be drawn upon by cheques signed by the depositor or a person or persons authorized to operate on the account; and the payment of any cheques so drawn is a complete discharge to the Commissioners for that payment.

17N. (1) If a depositor loses his passbook he shall forthwith give notice in writing of the loss to the Commissioners.

(2) The Commissioners may require a depositor who has lost his passbook—

- (a) to make a statutory declaration as to the loss; and
- (b) satisfy the Commissioners as to his identity.

(3) Subject to compliance with subregulation (2), the Commissioners may—

- (a) issue to the depositor a new passbook showing the amount standing to the credit of the account in the records of the Commissioners; or
- (b) pay that amount to the depositor.

17O. Where a depositor has died but notice in writing of his death has not been given to the Commissioners, they shall not be under any liability by reason only that they have allowed any withdrawal of, or other dealing with, any money standing to the credit of the account in the name of that depositor during the period from the time of his death to the giving of such notice.

17P. A payment made by the Commissioners in accordance with these regulations and the receipt of the person to whom the payment is so made is a complete discharge to the Commissioners for that payment. ”

PSYCHOLOGISTS REGISTRATION ACT 1976

PSYCHOLOGISTS BOARD AMENDMENT RULES 1986

MADE by the Psychologists Board of Western Australia and approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These rules may be cited as the *Psychologists Board Amendment Rules 1986*.

Principal rules

2. In these rules the *Psychologists Board Rules 1978** are referred to as the principal rules.
[*Published in the Gazette of 14 July 1978 at pp. 2420-2432.]

Rule 2 repealed and a rule substituted

3. Rule 2 of the principal rules is repealed and the following rule is substituted—

“ Interpretation

2. In these rules, unless the contrary intention appears—

“public comment” includes a lecture, talk, discussion, statement or other comment given or made to, or in the presence of, the public or a section of the public. ”.

Rule 16A inserted

4. After rule 16 of the principal rules the following rule is inserted—

“ 16A. Where the Board is of the opinion that a person to whom the Board has authorized the grant of a certificate of registration has qualifications which entitle that person to use a specialist title, then the appropriate specialist title shall be entered in the Register. ”.

Rule 36 amended

5. Rule 36 of the principal rules is amended by deleting “54” and substituting the following—

“ 21 ”.

Rules 69 to 80 repealed and rules 69 to 75 substituted

6. Rules 69 to 80 of the principal rules and the headings thereto are repealed and the following rules and heading are substituted—

“ Advertising

69. Subject to rules 70, 71 and 73, a registered psychologist may—

- (a) publish or cause to be published an advertisement;
- (b) exhibit a sign at or adjacent to the premises at which that psychologist conducts his practice.

70. An advertisement published, or a sign exhibited under rule 69 may contain only the following information relating to a registered psychologist—

- (a) the information referred to in section 53 (5) of the Act;
- (b) his telegram or telex number;
- (c) his consultation hours;
- (d) any languages he speaks;
- (e) the fact that he is a psychologist;
- (f) the name of any firm of which he is a member;
- (g) any other information approved by the Board.

71. An advertisement published, or a sign exhibited under rule 69 shall not—

- (a) be false in any material particular;
- (b) be misleading or deceptive or likely to mislead or deceive;
- (c) be vulgar or sensational; or
- (d) claim or imply that the registered psychologist is superior, or uses superior apparatus, methods or materials to any other psychologist.

72. A registered psychologist may make use of a business card containing only the information or part of the information, in full or in abbreviation, set out in rule 70.

73. (1) Where a registered psychologist publishes or causes to be published an advertisement he shall cause a copy or recording of it to be kept at his principal place of business for 3 years from the date that the advertisement was last published.

(2) Upon receiving written notice from the Board a registered psychologist shall, within the time specified in that notice, produce the copy or recording referred to in subrule (1) to the Board for inspection.

74. Where the Board is of the opinion that an advertisement, sign or business card does not comply with rules 69, 70, 71 or 72 the Board may, by written notice served upon a registered psychologist direct—

- (a) the alteration or discontinuance of the advertisement;
- (b) the alteration or discontinuance of the use of the business card;
- (c) the removal or alteration of the sign.

75. (1) Subject to subrule (2), a registered psychologist shall not make a public comment where the subject matter or any part of the subject matter concerns a case with which he has been professionally involved unless—

- (a) he has the express consent of any client involved in the case; or
- (b) it is not contrary to the interests of any client,

to include that subject matter in the public comment.

(2) In making a public comment under subrule (1), a registered psychologist—

- (a) shall ensure that he does not reveal the identity of a client;
- (b) shall make only objective statements regarding the case;
- (c) shall not give undue publicity to his part in the case; and
- (d) shall comply with the provisions of these rules relating to advertising generally. ”.

FISHERIES ACT 1905

Notice No. 231

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by virtue of section 17 of the Act, I hereby direct all licensing officers to impose the following conditions in respect of fishing boat licences—

1. A fishing boat shall be relicensed each year under the same name given it the previous year irrespective of whether there has been a change of ownership or of registration number. No boat shall be licensed if it has been given the same name as a previously licensed boat: provided that this shall not apply if the name of each such licensed vessel is given a distinguishing serial number or an additional distinguishing name.
2. (FD 742/73) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, in accordance with Fisheries Notice No. 162 shall not be used and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used for the purpose of taking, transporting or storing Southern Bluefin Tuna (*Thunnus maccoyii*) in any Western Australian waters.
3. (FD 742/73) A fishing boat not authorized to take Southern Bluefin Tuna in accordance with Fisheries Notice No. 162 may with the prior approval in writing of a Licensing Officer be used to take up to five tonnes of Southern Bluefin Tuna by longlining or trolling during any one year of the Southern Bluefin Tuna Fishery as defined in Fisheries Notice No. 162.
4. (FD 134/75) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by the Director of Fisheries, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used during the period of 1 January to 30 September in each year, for the purpose of taking prawns by means of trawling in any waters of the Indian Ocean lying between Parkes Reef and Beadon Point, near Onslow, with a width seawards of two nautical miles from high water mark as delineated and shown bordered in red on Lands and Surveys Miscellaneous Plan 732.
5. (FD 374/78) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used, for the purpose of taking snapper (*Chrysophrys unicolor*) by means of fish traps.
6. (FD 506/77) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used, for the purpose of taking, transporting or storing any Western Rock Lobster (*Panulirus cygnus*) in any waters south of 34 degrees 24 minutes south latitude and west of Pt D'Entrecasteaux.
7. (FD 1111/82) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used for the purpose of taking scallops (*Amusium balloti*) in the waters of the Indian Ocean and Shark Bay below high water mark lying between the parallels of 23 degrees and 27 degrees of south latitude and east of 112 degrees 50 minutes of east longitude.
8. (FD 5/49) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to set a net known as a herring trap in any Western Australian waters.
9. (FD 598/83) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to operate a trawl net in Western Australian waters enclosed by a line commencing 800 metres west of the high water mark at Becher Point and extending generally southerly parallel to the high water mark to a point 800 metres west of the intersection of the westerly extension of the southern boundary of Reserve No. 26469 with the high water mark: thence in a generally southwesterly direction in a line tangential to a circle 1 600 metres radius from the northern end of the western groyne at the mouth of the Channel Entrance to the Peel Inlet at Mandurah; thence anticlockwise around that circle to a point due west from the high water mark at Robert Point; thence west along that line to longitude 115 degrees 40 minutes east; thence north along that longitude to a point due west of Becher Point; thence east to the starting point.
10. (FD 576/84) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit a boat to be used for the purpose of taking scallops (*Amusium balloti*) in the Western Australian waters of the Abrolhos Islands.
11. (FD 491/75) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used for the purpose of taking prawns by the method known as beam tide trawling in Western Australian waters within a radius of 800 metres from the northern end of the western groyne at the mouth of the Peel Inlet.
12. (FD 13/31) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used, to take any species of fish by means of bottom trawling during the months of January, November and December in any year in any Western Australian waters lying between latitudes 26 degrees 30 minutes south and 34 degrees 24 minutes south with the exception of the waters enclosed by a line commencing at the intersection of 31 degrees 57 minutes south latitude and 115 degrees 39 minutes east longitude drawn due west along latitude 31 degrees 57 minutes south to its intersection with 115 degrees 36 minutes east longitude; thence north along longitude 115 degrees 36 minutes east to its intersection with 31 degrees 53 minutes south latitude; thence east along latitude 31 degrees 53 minutes south to its intersection with 115 degrees 39 minutes east longitude; thence south along longitude 115 degrees 39 minutes east to the starting point.
13. (FD 25/25) A fishing boat, unless so authorized in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used, for taking fish in the waters of Cockburn Sound defined by a line commencing at a point on the high water mark at the western extremity of the South Mole and extending westerly to the southernmost rock of the Stragler Rocks; thence south easterly to the high water mark on the northernmost point of Mewstone; thence generally southerly along that high water mark on the eastern shore of that island to its southernmost point; thence southerly to the high water mark on the northernmost point of Carnac Island; thence generally southerly along that high water mark on the eastern shore of that island to its southernmost

point; thence southerly to the high water mark at Entrance Point on Garden Island; thence generally southerly along that high water mark on the eastern shore of that island to McKail Point; thence southerly to the high water mark at John Point on the mainland; thence along that high water mark to the starting point.

14. (FD 326/86) A fishing boat, unless so authorised in writing by a Licensing Officer, shall not be used, and a person shall not permit or suffer a boat to be used for the purpose of taking mulies (*Sardinops neopilchardus*) in the waters of King George Sound enclosed by a line commencing at a point on the high water mark at the easternmost extremity of Bald Head and extending north easterly to a point on the high water mark at the easternmost extremity of Breaksea Island; thence north westerly to a point on the high water mark at Herald Point; thence generally westerly along the high water mark to a point due east of Emu Point; thence due west to a point on the high water mark at Emu Point; thence generally southerly along the high water mark to a point due south of the lighthouse at King Point; thence southerly to a point on the high water mark at Possession Point; thence generally southerly and easterly along the high water mark to the starting point.

DOG ACT 1976

The Municipality of the Town of Kwinana
By-law Relating to Dogs

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 29 January 1986, to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-law:—

By-laws of the Town of Kwinana Relating to Dogs published in the *Government Gazette* of 30 November 1973 and amended as published in the *Government Gazette* of 31 January 1975 are hereby repealed.

Part I—Preliminary

1. In this by-law unless the context otherwise requires—

"Act" means the Dog Act 1976;

"Council" means the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Kwinana.

Expressions used in this by-law have the meanings given to them by the Act.

2. This by-law applies throughout the whole of the district of the Town of Kwinana.

Part II—Impounding of Dogs

3. The charges payable in relation to the seizure and impounding of a dog and maintenance thereof are specified in the First Schedule.
4. If the owner or person acting on behalf of the owner of a seized or impounded dog claims such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the First Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person, providing satisfactory evidence of ownership or authority to take delivery of the dog is produced.
5. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
6. If the Council destroys a dog at the request of its owner that owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the First Schedule hereto. This charge is payable regardless of whether the dog has been detained or impounded or not.
7. The payment of fees in respect of the care, detention, or destruction of a dog, shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provision of the Act, Dog Act Regulations 1976, or this by-law.

Part III—Regulation of Dog Kennels

8. In this part the following interpretation shall apply:—
- “Applicant” shall mean a person who makes an application for an approved kennel establishment licence;
- “Approved Kennel Establishment” shall mean the kennel or kennels and yards appurtenant thereto which are subject of an application for an approved kennel establishment licence as prescribed by Clause 10;
- “Approved Kennel Establishment Licence” shall mean a licence granted by the Council to an Applicant pursuant to Clause 11;
- “Licensee” shall mean a person who holds an approved kennel establishment licence.
9. (a) A person shall not keep, permit or suffer to be kept more than two dogs over the age of three months on any premises within the district of the Town of Kwinana unless such premises are situated within the appropriate zone wherein kennels are permitted under the Town of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme and unless such premises are licensed as an approved kennel establishment.
- (b) A person wishing to keep more than two dogs but not more than six dogs on any premises may seek exemption for those premises under the provisions of section 26(3) of the Act.
10. (a) Any application for a licence to keep an approved kennel establishment shall be submitted in writing in the form of the Second Schedule of this by-law and shall be supported by evidence that due notice of the proposed application has been given to persons in the locality.
- (b) Unless the Council otherwise decides, an applicant for a licence shall give notice by:—
- (i) Advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the Municipality giving one month's notice of intention to apply.
- (ii) Giving written notice to owners and occupiers of all adjoining properties advising of intention to apply.
- (c) The application shall be submitted with three copies of a plan showing the specifications of the kennels and yards appurtenant thereto with the relationship of the kennels and yards to the boundaries of the lots and other information as the Council may require.
11. Subject to the provisions of the Dog Act the Council may grant or refuse an approved kennel establishment licence and if granting an approved kennel licence shall forthwith issue to the Applicant an approved kennel establishment licence in the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
12. On the granting of the approved kennel establishment licence the approved kennel establishment shall be deemed to be licensed and the Licensee shall thereafter cause to be paid to the Council an annual licence fee in the amount prescribed in the First Schedule hereto.
13. No person shall erect a kennel establishment until plans, specifications and location plan showing the proposed site for such a kennel establishment have been approved by the Council and are in conformity with the Town of Kwinana Town Planning Scheme as amended or any other Town Planning Scheme then in force or any by-law adopted by the Council.
14. The licensee shall ensure that the approved kennel establishment complies with the following conditions:—
- (a) Each kennel shall have a yard appurtenant thereto;
- (b) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 9 metres from any dwelling house, church, school room, hall or factory;
- (c) Each kennel and each yard and every part thereof shall not be at any less distance than 25 metres from any road or street;
- (d) Each kennel shall be of a height and width sufficient to permit the dogs having the use thereof to move in it without restraint with a minimum height of 1;8 metres and a minimum width of 1.2 metres;
- (e) Each kennel shall have walls constructed of concrete, brick, stone, timber, fibrocement sheeting or such other materials as the Council shall approve and the roof shall be constructed of an impervious material;
- (f) All untreated external surfaces of kennels shall be painted and kept painted with good quality paint;
- (g) The upper surface of the floor of each kennel shall be set at least 100 mm above the surface of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed of granolithic cement finished to a smooth surface and shall have a fall of not less than 1 in 100 to a drain which shall be properly laid, ventilated and trapped; all floor washings shall pass through this drain and shall be disposed of in accordance with the health requirements of the Council;
- (h) Each kennel shall have an area of not less than 1.8 square metres of floor space and the yard shall have an area of not less than 2.25 square metres for each dog kept therein;

- (i) All kennels and yards and all feeding and drinking vessels therein shall be maintained in a clean and disinfected condition;
- (j) Each yard shall be securely fenced and kept securely fenced with a fence not less than 1.8 metres in height constructed of galvanised iron, timber or galvanised steel link mesh;
- (k) All gates shall be provided with proper catches or means of fastening.

15. A licensee shall not keep or permit dogs to be kept on premises on which there is an approved kennel unless he ensures that a person in charge of the dogs either resides on such premises or within reasonably close proximity so as to enable such person to have effective control over the dogs.

16. The licensee shall maintain any area of those premises frequented or occupied by a dog in clean condition. Refuse, dog faeces and food wastes must be disposed of daily in an approved manner. Odours, fleas, flies and other vermin must be effectively controlled.

Part IV—General

17. The occupier of premises on which a dog is kept shall:—

- (a) Cause the premises or portion thereof on which the dog is kept to be fenced in a manner capable of confining the dog;
- (b) Ensure that every gate or door in the fence has a proper latch or other means of fastening;
- (c) Maintain the fence and all gates and doors in good order and condition.

18. Except for a dog used in guiding a blind person, the owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building;
- (b) A theatre;
- (c) A house of worship;
- (d) A public swimming pool;
- (e) Any shop premises not being a shop where dogs are sold or treated for illness.

19. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sportsground;
- (b) A car park;
- (c) A beach;
- (d) A recreational reserve.

Part V—Penalties

20. Any person who commits a breach of this by-law shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

The Municipality of the City of Cockburn

By-laws relating to Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act, the Council of the abovementioned municipality hereby records having resolved on 10 September 1985, to amend the By-law relating to Caravan Parks and Camping Grounds as published in the *Government Gazette* of 20 December 1974, as follows:—

1. By-law 2: The definition of the word "caravan" be amended by adding at the end of the definition the words "and for the purpose of Schedule 3 of these by-laws a caravan shall include an abode, consisting of two compatible vehicles, each conforming with the first part of this definition of a caravan, designed and constructed to form one single unit".

2. By-law 2 be amended by deleting "The Town of Cockburn" at the end of the definition "The Council" and substituting therefor "The City of Cockburn".

3. By-law 6 (1) be amended by deleting all the words following the words "in any one year" in line four (4) and substituting in their place the words "except when the caravan complies with Schedules 2 and 3 of these by-laws but notwithstanding By-law 19 (b) of these by-laws".

4. By-law 6 (2) be amended by deleting all the words after the words "in any one year" in lines two (2) and three (3) of the by-law and adding in their place the words "except when the caravan and ancillaries comply with Schedules 2 and 3 of these by-laws".

5. By adding a new sub-by-law: "6 (3) The Council may by way of a condition limit the number of caravans referred to in sub-by-laws (1) and (2) of this by-law by specifying the number of bays that are to be set aside for short term occupancy not exceeding six months in any one year".

6. By amending By-law 18 and making it By-law 18 (1).

7. By-law 18 (C): By deleting the words "of light construction" after the word "annexe" in line one.

8. By adding a new By-law: "18 (2) That any caravan and/or annexe on a registered caravan park shall be in accordance with the conditions specified in Schedule 3 of these by-laws."

9. By-law 12: By deleting all the words following the words "Annual Registration" in line six (6) of the by-law and adding in their place the words "which shall be calculated at the rate of (\$1.50) One Dollar Fifty Cents for each site for the park is registered with a minimum of \$100.00.

10. By adding a new Schedule "2".

Schedule "2"

Requirements for Caravan and Ancillaries for the Purpose of By-laws 6 (1) and 6 (2).

1. Siting of Caravans.
 - 1.1 Setback from the side and rear boundaries of the caravan bay to be a minimum of 2.25 metres.
2. Private Sheds and Barbecues. These are not permitted in the vicinity of caravans. Barbecues may be used in designated recreation areas only or as otherwise agreed to by the Health Surveyor.

A common store area may be provided by the caravan park proprietor in a place approved by the Council.

11. By adding a new Schedule "3".

Schedule "3"

Annexes—Construction and Conditions

1. Annexes must be of light construction, capable of being easily dismantled and moved by one or two persons.
2. Type of construction allowable—
 - 2.1 Conventional folded welded plastic or canvas type with supporting poles or frames.
 - 2.2 Prefabricated construction—consisting of:
 - 2.2.1 Walls of lightweight easy to erect rigid modular panels, maximum width of 1.3 m. Panels are to be clad in caravan type prepainted aluminium sheeting or vinyl inserts, framed and supported by extruded aluminium section channelled T-bar or angle configuration, secured by metal thread type screws or gutter bolts.
 - 2.2.2 Roof either—
 - 2.2.2.1 Welded plastic sheeting over horizontal metal supports or frame.
 - 2.2.2.2 Self supporting lightweight rigid modular panels, maximum width 1.3 m. Panels are to be clad in caravan type prepainted aluminium sheeting or vinyl inserts and framed and supported by extruded aluminium section channelled T-bar or angle configuration, secured by metal thread type screws or gutter bolts.
3. Annexes shall have a maximum width of 3.2 m, the annexe not to project beyond the roof and alignment of the caravan.
4. Restricted to one per caravan.
5. Structures other than annexes to be subject to Council approval.
6. Double wide type unit shall not have any other annexal structure.

7. Metal jacks supporting timber framed floors shall be heavy duty and adjustable steel jack legs, purpose designed to adequately support the floor, which shall be independent of the caravan.

The Municipality of the Town of Kwinana

By-law relating to Reserves and Foreshores

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 29 January 1986 to submit for confirmation of the Governor, the following amendment to its by-law relating to Reserves and Foreshores as published in the *Government Gazette* No. 93 of 2 December 1983.

1. In Clause 1, before the definition "owner" insert the following:—

Function means and includes any show, exhibition, gymkhana, sport, match or test between opposing teams in any game.

2. Following clause 6, insert the following:

6A (1) No person shall organise, arrange or take part in any Function on a Reserve unless a permit to hold or organise that Function has been granted by the Council.

(2) The Council may grant a permit to a person to hold or organise a Function on a Reserve. The person to whom a permit is granted shall, as a condition of hiring, comply with any terms imposed.

(3) The Town Clerk of the Council or his deputy is authorised to grant a Function permit subject to conditions to any person or persons making application to hold a Function upon a Reserve.

- (4) A permit to hold a function on a Reserve shall specify:—

- (a) The purpose for which such permit is granted.
(b) The dates and times during which the Function may be held.
(c) The portions of the Reserve allocated to the permit holder.
(d) The conditions and terms imposed, if any, which have been authorised by the Council.

(5) The permit shall not be granted for a continuous period in excess of fourteen days.

(6) Any person who has been granted a permit in accordance with this by-law and who does not comply with the terms of such permit commits an offence.

(7) No person or body of persons issued with a permit to hold a Function shall be authorised to use any building or structure except those open for public use on any Reserve unless such permission is expressly granted and stated under the conditions of the permit.

(8) Subject to this clause no person to whom a permit has been granted shall exclude any member of the general public from attending a Function, which is open to the public, if such person requests admission.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1960
The Municipality of the Shire of Collie
By-laws Relating to Hawkers and Stallholders

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the abovementioned Act and of all other powers enabling it, the Council of the abovementioned Municipality hereby records having resolved on 24 September 1985 to make and submit for confirmation by the Governor the following By-laws.

1. Definitions

“Act” means the Local Government Act 1960 (as amended).

“Clerk” means the Shire Clerk or the person acting for the time being in that capacity.

“Community Association” has the meaning assigned to it by section 242 of the Act.

“Council” means Shire of Collie.

“Hawker”, “Stall” and “Stallholder” have the meanings assigned to them by sections 217 and 242 of the Act.

“Licensee” means a person to whom a licence is granted under these By-laws.

“Licence” means a licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.

“Member of the Police Force” means a member of the Police Force of Western Australia.

2. No person shall hawk any goods, works or merchandise within the district without first holding a current licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.

3. No person shall conduct a stall for the sale of goods, wares or merchandise on any street, way or public place within the district, without first holding a current licence issued pursuant to these By-laws.

4. Subject to these By-laws, the Council may issue licences, and may, at its discretion, issue a licence for an annual, monthly or daily period.

5. (1) A licence shall be in the form set out in the First Schedule to these By-laws; and the licence fees shall be the fees set out in the Second Schedule to these By-laws and those fees shall be paid by the licensee to the Council, forthwith upon the issue to him of the licence.

(2) A licence is not transferable.

(3) The license granted to a hawker is valid for the hawking of the goods, wares or merchandise therein described, only; and in the case of a licence limited to a part of the district is valid for that part of the district only.

6. (1) Every person wishing to obtain a licence shall make application in writing therefore to the Council.

(2) An application for a hawkers licence shall specify—

- (a) The kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant requires to hawk;
- (b) The type of vehicle, conveyance or means of carriage to be employed in hawking;
- (c) The period for which the licence is required; and
- (d) Where the licence is required to be limited to a part of a district, the part of the district to which it is so to be limited.

(3) An application for a stallholders licence shall specify—

- (a) The kind of goods, wares or merchandise which the applicant desires to sell;
- (b) The location of the stall;
- (c) The period for which the licence is required.

7. (1) The Council shall not issue a Hawker's licence (other than a renewal of a licence) to an applicant, unless he produces to the Council a Certificate signed by two Justices of the Peace certifying that he is of good character and reputation, and is a fit person to exercise the trade of a Hawker.

(2) The Council may refuse to issue a Hawkers or Stallholders licence or may cancel a licence in the event that the applicant or licensee (as the case may be)—

- (a) Is an undischarged bankrupt or becomes bankrupt;
- (b) Has been twice convicted during the preceding five years or is twice convicted in the space of five years of an offence against the By-laws of any Local Authority relating to Hawkers or Stallholders;
- (c) Does not conform with the requirements of the Health Act, 1911, or the Model By-laws made under that Act.

(3) Council may refuse to issue a licence if in its opinion the needs of the District or the portion thereof for which the licence is sought are adequately catered for by established shops or by persons to whom licences have been issued.

8. The Council may revoke any licence issued by it on any of the grounds set out in By-law 7 hereof, or on the grounds—

- (a) That the licensee has committed a breach of the terms or conditions of the licence;
- (b) That the licensee is not conducting his business in a respectable or sober manner;
- (c) That he has assigned his licence or does not himself carry on the business or;
- (d) That he is not regularly carrying on the business for which the licence was granted.

9. Upon the cancellation of a licence the holder thereof shall forthwith return the licence to the Clerk and shall forfeit all fees paid in respect of the licence.

10. (1) The Council shall issue to every licensee a badge in the form set out in the Third Schedule of these By-laws and the licensee shall pay for such badge a fee of fifty cents.

(2) A licensee shall display his badge while hawking or conducting a stall.

(3) A person shall not display a hawkers or stallholders badge unless he is the holder of a current licence.

(4) Upon cancellation of a licence the holder shall forthwith return his badge to the Clerk and shall forfeit the fee paid in respect thereof.

11. A hawker while hawking or stallholder while conducting a stall shall—

- (a) Carry with him his licence and shall produce the same to any officer of the Council or to a Police Officer on demand;
- (b) Have his name legibly and conspicuously displayed on his vehicle, barrow, bag or tray; and
- (c) When selling goods, wares or merchandise by weight, carry and use for that purpose, scales, tested and certified in accordance with the provisions of the Weights and Measures Act, 1915.

12. A hawker or stallholder shall not—

- (a) Hawk or conduct a stall between the hours of sunset and the next sunrise, or on any Sunday, or on Christmas Day or Good Friday, without the consent of the Council;
- (b) Loiter within a distance of two hundred metres of any shop or permanent place of business that has for sale any goods, wares or merchandise of the kind being hawked or offered for sale by the stallholder;
- (c) Call his wares or make or cause to be made any outcry, noise or disturbance likely to be a nuisance or annoyance to any person in that vicinity;
- (d) Deposit or store any box or basket under his vehicle or on the roadway or footpath;
- (e) Obstruct the free passage of pedestrians or vehicle on any footpath or roadway; or
- (f) Act in an offensive manner.

13. The person to whom a stallholders licence is issued shall maintain the stall in good order or condition.

14. No person shall conduct a stall on private property unless there is adequate provision on the private property adjacent to the stall for parking of customers' vehicles.

15. Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these By-laws, the Council may grant licences to conduct stalls in any street or way or on any land for any period specified in such a licence if such stalls are conducted solely for the purpose of raising money for any community association. No fee shall be payable for a licence issued to a community association under this By-law.

16. Any person committing a breach of these By-laws shall be liable upon conviction to—

- (a) A maximum penalty of \$200; and
- (b) A maximum daily penalty during the breach of \$20 per day.

1. "Delete the headings "Schedule", "Schedule X" and "Schedule Y" on each of the respective
 Schedules, and substitute Schedule 1, 2 and 3 respectively."

2. Schedule 2: "Requirements for Caravan and Ancillaries for the purpose of By-laws 6(1)
 and 6(2)"—

(a) Clause 9—Delete Clause 9 and substitute—

Clause 9—"Barbecues. Wood fired barbecues are not permitted in the vicinity of
 caravans. Portable barbecues are permitted in the vicinity of caravans, provided
 there is a 2 metre clearance from a caravan, annexe or vehicle."

(b) Add after Clause 9, a clause as follows:—

10—Private Sheds: Private sheds will be permitted subject to the following con-
 ditions:—

10.1 No storage shed will be permitted on a caravan site of less than 100
 square metres.

- 10.2 Sheds to be no larger than 2.4 metres x 2.4 metres with a minimum wall height of 2.1 metres and a maximum height of 2.4 metres.
- 10.3 Sheds shall be anchored by steel stakes, wire looped at each corner, or pre-cast concrete footings bolted to the bottom wall angle at each corner, or in any other way approved by the Building Surveyor.
- 10.4 Materials—The sheds shall be constructed out of Zincolume sheet metal, Colorbond metal cladding, or other material as approved by the Building Surveyor.
- 10.5 Sheds shall be located on the opposite side of the entrance side of the caravan, and not less than 1 metre from the side and rear boundary of the caravan site.
- 10.6 No person shall erect or install a private shed pursuant to the by-laws except with the prior approval of Council.

3. Schedule 3: Insert after Clause 5 the following—

5a Pergolas shall only be permitted for the purpose of providing shade for shrubs and plants only. Impervious material shall not be permitted to be attached to the top or side of the pergola. The pergola shall be constructed of timber only. The pergola shall not be attached in any way to the caravan or annexe.
