EXEMPTION NOTICE

Exemption for DevelopmentWA (Western Australian Land Authority) for the provision of non-potable water services at OneOneFive Hamilton Hill, Cockburn

In accordance with section 7 of the *Water Services Act 2012*, the Minister for Water, Hon Simone McGurk MLA, has granted an exemption from the application of section 5(1) of the Act to DevelopmentWA (Western Australian Land Authority) for the provision of non-potable water services at OneOneFive Hamilton Hill, Cockburn.

The water service is a non-potable water supply service provided as a community bore scheme for the residents of an infill urban development. Water is sourced from a community bore and used to water public open space and residential gardens at OneOneFive Hamilton Hill.

The exemption will come into effect on the day it is published in the *Government Gazette* and is valid for an indefinite period.

Summary of the reasons for the decision

Granting this exemption is not contrary to the public interest. It is considered that—

- the regulatory burden imposed by licensing would be disproportionately high given the small scale of the service;
- the risks of the abuse of monopoly power are low. The service is operated on a not-for-profit basis;

- the services avoid reliance on scheme water for the irrigation of public open space and gardens; and
- the service represents a low risk to public health (as the supply is sourced from groundwater and is not for potable use).
