Sir,

I am commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of His Grace the Duke of Buckingham and Chandos, that H. M. S. "Galatea" under the command of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh is about to proceed on service, and will leave Marseilles about 20th May to visit Rio Janiero and the Cape of Good Hope—from thence H. R. H. will proceed to the West Coast of Australia, and will visit Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane, Hobart Town, Van Diemen's Land, and also Auckland and Wellington

in New Zealand, and may probably proceed from thence to Tahiti, calling at Rio or St. Helena, on his return to England via Cape Horn in the year 1868.
