IS Excellency The Governor, under the Authority of the Ordinance 30th Victoria, No. 13, for the prevention and cure of Scab in Sheep, has been pleased to establish and fix the following as the boundaries or limits of "Scab Districts" in the Colony, and to appoint the undermentioned Gentlemen as Inspectors of Sheep for the several districts.

DISTRICT.

- Plantagenet District, within the jurisdiction) No. 1. of the Resident Magistrate thereof.
- Sussex and Wellington Districts, within the jurisdiction of the respective Resident No. 2. Magistrates thereof.
- No. 3. Murray, Perth, Fremantle, and Swan Districts, within the jurisdiction of the respective Resident Magistrates thereof, such districts to include Victoria Plains and to extend as far North as the Hill River.
