# PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances where passed by me the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony. in the 31st year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled :--

- No. 1.—" An Ordinance to declare the "Trusts upon which Churches, "Chapels, and Minister's Dwel-"lings belonging to the Religious "Society called Wesleyan Meth-"odists shall be held."
- No. 2.—"An Ordinance to provide for "the Appropriation of the Casual "Revenue of the Crown arising "from Escheated Estates."
- No. 3.—"An Ordinance to declare the "Law and Practice in cases of "Escheat."
- No. 5.—" An Ordinance to naturalize "Bartolomi Ramis."
- No. 7.—" An Ordinance to facilitate pro-"ceedings by persons having "claims against the Govern-"ment."
- No. 8.—" An Ordinance for adopting cer-"tain Acts of the Imperial Par-"liament."
- No. 10.—" An Ordinance further to amend " the Laws relating to Trespasses " by Live Stock."
- No 11.—"An Ordinance to naturalize "Herman Look."
- No. 14.—"An Ordinance to naturalize "August Bothe."

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N Pursuance of the authority in me vested by the 16th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled "an Ordinance to consolidate "and amend the Laws respecting the Li-"censing of Boats and Boatmen," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed are and shall be Regulations to be observed by persons using the Causeway Bridge over the River Swan at Perth, and the Bridge over the River Helena at Guildford, and also for the preservation of the Public Jetties at Perth, until altered or amended as occasion may require. Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, Perth, this Twentieth day of December, 1867.

#### GOD SAVE THE QUEEN. !!!

Regulations to be observed by persons using the Bridges over the River Swan at Perth, and the Bridge over the River Helena at Guildford.

1 There shall not be on the Bridges, at one and the same time. a number of horned Cattle not being Milch Cows, exceeding ten.

2. No Cattle save Milch Cows and Draught Oxen shall be driven over the said Bridges excepting during the hours of ten at night and eight in the morning.

### Regulations for the Management of the Public Jetty at William Street, Perth.

1. No Vessel or Boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetty at William Street, Perth, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as are, or may be expressly provided for that purpose; and no Vessel or Boat shall lie alongside such Jetty unless so fastened. All Cargo Boats, Vessels, or Flats so fastened shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetty as much as possible from weight of such Craft.

2. No Vessel or Boat shall be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

3. Passenger Boats only shall be allowed alongside the steps of the Jetty, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark Passengers.

4. No Vessel. Cargo Boat, or Flat shall make fast, or lie alongside the Jetty at William Street, Perth, for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo, after sunset or before daylight.

5. The N.W. side of the Perth Jetty shall be appropriated to the use of Steamers carrying Passengers; and no Cargo Boat shall discharge there, or anchor within 100 yards of that side of the said Jetty.

6. No fishing nets to be hung or spread about any part of the Jetty; no fishing off the Jetty permitted on Sunday, and at other times with only a rod and line.

7. No Stone, Bricks, Sand, Lime, Firewood, or Timber in Logs, to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetty, Firewood may be carted on the Jetty for the use of Passenger Steamers but taken direct from the Cart to the Steamer.

8. All goods to be removed from the Jetty before sunset.

9. No Bullock Teams shall be driven on the Jetty. 10. No Gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetty without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.

11. No Goods shall be landed on the Jetty on Sunday, except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of the Police Magistrate or Chairman of City Council, of Perth, being first obtained.

12 No Stones or any kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the Water from the Jetty, or Boats lying alongside.

13. No Fire or Fires shall be made on or near the Jetty.

#### Regulations for the Management of the Public Jetties at Barrack Street and Mill Street, Perth.

1. No Vessel or Boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetties at Barrack Street and Mill Street, Perth, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as are, or may be expressly provided for that purpose; and no Vessel or Boat shall lie alongside such Jetties unless so fastened. All Cargo Boats, Vessels, or Flats so fastened shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetties as much as possible from weight of such craft.

2. No Vessel or Boat shall be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

3. No fishing nets to be hung or spread about any part of the Jetties; no fishing off the Jetties permitted on Sunday, and at other times, with only a rod and line.

4. All Goods to be removed from the Jetties within 72 hours after landing.

5. No Gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetties without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.

6. No Goods shall be landed on the Jetties on Sundays, except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of the Police Magistrate or Chairman of City Council, of Perth, being first obtained.

7. No Stones or any kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the Water from the Jetties or Boats lying alongside.
