# "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885."

By His Excellency Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

#### A PROCLAMATION.

W HEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict. Ch. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the First Session thereof shall be held in such Colony as the Council shall from time to time determine; and, further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation: And whereas in the Second Session of the Federal Council, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the months of January and February, in the Fifty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was, on the Twentieth day of the said month of January, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held in Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: Now therefore I, Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation,

summon the Federal Council of Australasia as constituted by the said Act to meet at the Parliament Buildings in Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, on Tuesday, the Twentyninth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at the hour of eleven in the forenoon, for the dispatch of business.

Given under my hand at Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, this Twentieth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE following Regulations for the management of the Jetty Shed at Albany, framed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council on the 31st day of October, 1888, under the provisions of the 42nd Victoria, No. 18, are published for general information.

- 1. The Jetty Shed at Albany shall be under the control of the Sub-Collector of Customs at that port.
- 2. The part of the Jetty Shed set apart for Bonded Goods shall be a Queen's Warehouse, and the Goods placed therein shall be subject to the same Rent and Charges as collected at the Queen's Warehouses throughout the Colony.
- 3. Any Goods remaining over forty-eight hours on the Platform set apart for Free Goods shall be subject to the following charges:-

4. The following hours will be observed at the Jetty Shed, viz.:-

From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., with one hour for dinners from Monday to Friday, and on Saturday, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., when the work will cease, except under special orders from the Principal Officer of Customs; and the Officer attending to receive or deliver Goods will be entitled to a fee of 2s. 6d. per hour overtime to be paid by the party on whose account the Officer is employed.

5. These Regulations will come into force on the 15th November, 1888.

Notice is hereby given that on and after November 15, 1888, until February 28, 1889, a Red Buoy, with a red flag and the words "Torpedo Buoy" painted on it, will be placed in the entrance to Trincomalee Harbour between Ostenburg Point and Little Sober Island, and 400 yards west of the former.

The water in the triangle formed by this Red Buoy, the N.E. Point of Great Sober Island and Clappenburg Point, will be obstructed by mines.

All vessels should pass between the Buoy and Ostenburg Point.

THE attention of Bankers and the public generally is particularly requested to the provisions of "The Gold Declaration Act, 1888," which are as follows.

By Command,

#### MALCOLM FRASER,

Colonial Secretary.

- 1. ANY banker or other person exporting from the Colony any gold, gold ore, gold dust, or gold bullion, if such gold, gold ore, or gold dust shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, or if the gold contained in such bullion shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall at the Customs declare the weight or value of the same at the time of export.
- 2. ANY person failing to comply with the provisions of this Act may, on summary conviction before two Justices, be fined any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, or any sum not exceeding an amount equal to Five per cent. on the value of the undeclared articles, whichever sum shall be the greater.
- 3. NO person exporting from the Colony articles manufactured of gold, although such gold shall have been found in or procured from the soil of the Colony, shall be bound to declare the weight or value of such articles.
- THIS Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1889.
