NEW SOUTH WALES, to wit.

(L.S.) CARRINGTON, Governor. Proclamation by His Excellency the Right Honorable Charles Robert, Baron Carrington, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

W HEREAS by section ten of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infections or country in which there is reason to believe any infections or country in which there is reason to believe any Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the Government Gazette of the 6th February, 1888, pursuant to the provisions of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things Scab in Sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease: And whereas there is reason to believe that Scab at the present time exists in sheep both in the Colony of New Zealand and also in the Colony of Western Australia: Now, therefore, I. Charles Robert, Baron Carring. lia: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRING-Ton, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Execu-Too, the Governor aroresard, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, absolutely prohibit for a period of twelve months from the date of this Proclamation, the importation or introduction of any sheep, or any fodder or fittings put on board any vessel with, or for the use of, any sheep from either of the Colonies of New Zealand or of Western Australia.
