A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council 1879.)

TO PROHIBIT THE SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS TO NATIVES OF THE WESTERN PACIFIC ISLANDS.

[L.S.] JOHN B. THURSTON.

26th December, 1888.

I REGULATIONS Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of 1879 Prohibiting the Supply of Intoxicating Liquors to Natives of certain Islands of the Western Pacific are hereby repealed.

2. In this Regulation the expression—

“Western Pacific Islands” shall mean and include any of the following islands or places namely:—

The Groups of Islands known as,—

The Friendly Islands,
The Navigator's Islands,
The Union Islands,
The Phoenix Islands,
The Ellice Islands,
The Gilbert Islands,
The Solomon Islands,
The New Hebrides Islands,
The Santa Cruz Islands;

All other islands in the Western Pacific Ocean not being within the limits of the Colonies of Fiji Queensland New South Wales or New Guinea and not being within the jurisdiction of any civilised power.

“Native” shall mean and include in its reference every person in the Western Pacific not of European descent.

“Intoxicating Liquor” shall include all spirituous compounds and all fermented liquors and any mixture part whereof is spirituous or which contains fermented liquors and any mixture or preparation containing any drug capable of producing intoxication.

3. If any British subject in the Western Pacific sells or gives or otherwise supplies either directly or indirectly any native of any island or place within the Western Pacific Islands any intoxicating liquor he shall on conviction thereof before the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner be liable to punishment as follows:—

- (1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months with or without hard labour and with or without a fine not exceeding ten pounds; or,
- (2) A fine alone not exceeding ten pounds without any imprisonment.

4. It shall not be an offence under this Regulation for any person to give to any native for any urgent cause or necessity and without recompense or remuneration any intoxicating liquor when such intoxicating liquor is given solely and purely for medicinal purposes but it shall rest with the person giving such intoxicating liquor to prove to the satisfaction of the Court the existence of such urgent necessity and failing such proof such person shall be liable to the punishment provided in section 3 hereof.

5. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

FINDING OF COURT.

Read in open Court.

After careful consideration, we are of the opinion that the British ship “Benan,” on the twenty-third day of December last past, stranded at Point Cloates, on the North-West Coast of Western Australia, in consequence of strong current setting from the North-west, and wrongly laid down on the Admiralty Charts and in Directories commonly used by shipmasters, and as no blame can be attached to the certificated master, mate, and second mate for the same, by virtue of the powers vested in us under the 2nd section of the 51st Vic., No. 6 (c), all proceedings in this matter shall cease and determine.

From the Chief Harbor Master to the Honorable the Colonial Secretary.

I beg to draw the attention of the Government to the Finding of the Court at this Inquiry, which runs as follows:—

“After careful consideration, we are of the opinion that the British ship ‘Benan’ stranded at Point Cloates, &c., in consequence of strong current setting from the North-west, and wrongly laid down on the Admiralty Charts and Directories commonly used by shipmasters, &c. . . .”

The Sailing Directions published by the Admiralty (page 27 of Supplement to Vol. III.) run as follows:—“The beach inside this part of the reef was strewn with wreckage, some portion of which had evidently been lying there for years; this fact tends to show that the current, owing to the tendency of the prevailing winds blowing from some Western quarter, is apt to set a vessel towards the land when in the vicinity of the coast.”

How these directions can be wrongly laid down I cannot see.

WHEREAS by section ten of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to restrict or absolutely prohibit for any specified time the importation or introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings from any other Colony or country in which there is reason to believe any infectious or contagious disease in stock exists: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, published in the Government Gazette of the 6th February, 1888, pursuant to the provisions of the "Imported Stock Act of 1871," amongst other things Scab in Sheep was declared to be an infectious or contagious disease: And whereas there is reason to believe that Scab at the present time exists in sheep both in the Colony of New Zealand and also in the Colony of Western Australia: Now, therefore, I, CHARLES ROBERT, BARON CARRINGTON, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, absolutely prohibit for a period of twelve months from the date of this Proclamation, the importation or introduction of any sheep, or any fodder or fittings put on board any vessel with, or for the use of, any sheep from either of the Colonies of New Zealand or of Western Australia.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

SUPPLEMENTARY Return of Leases and Licenses, &c., of Crown Lands, showing Rents or instalments of Purchase Money due for the year 1889, and payable in advance to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, or to his agents, at the various Resident Magistrates' Courts in the Colony, on or before the first day of March next.

Should any lessee fail to pay his rent on the 1st of March as aforesaid, he shall forfeit all right to the land and the improvements thereon, unless within thirty days after such date it shall be paid, together with an additional sum of five per cent.; or within sixty days with ten per cent. added; or within ninety days with fifteen per cent. added; or within one hundred and twenty days with twenty per cent. added.

After such one hundred and twenty days have elapsed without payment of rent, with required addition, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with any improvements existing thereon.

METEOROLOGICAL OBSERVATIONS for the week ending 7th February, 1889.
