WHEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now **THEREFORE** I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a **SESSION** OF THE **LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL** OF **WESTERN AUSTRALIA** shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on **WEDNESDAY, THE THIRTEENTH DAY OF MARCH proximo**, at the hour of **THREE o'clock** in the **AFTERNOON**, in the **LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS**, in the **CITY OF PERTH**, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880," the Governor in Executive Council may from time to time make such orders as he may think expedient for preventing the introduction into Western Australia of insects or of matter destructive or prejudicial to vegetation; **AND WHEREAS** certain insects highly destructive and prejudicial to vegetation are or may be imported into the said Colony enclosed or embedded in Apples or Pears; Now **THEREFORE** I, the said Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation make the Order following, that is to say:—

"No Apples or Pears except in a preserved or dried state shall be imported into Champion Bay, or into any port to the South thereof."

And all persons whom it may concern are hereby enjoined to take notice of this Order and govern themselves accordingly, and are hereby warned that any person who shall import or attempt to import fruit in contravention of this Order is liable to forfeitures and penalties under the said Act.

FINDING OF COURT.

Read in Open Court.

After carefully reviewing the evidence taken in this case, we are of opinion that Albion Jarvis Hayward, the master of the vessel, took every precaution that a master mariner should take: he fixed the position of his vessel at noon before the casualty by observation, and there is no reason to suppose that any error existed in his chronometer, and he shaped a proper course accordingly; that he was on deck all night; a proper "look-out" was kept on the fore-castle; and that the boatswain was stationed on the main royal yard before the casualty.

At the time of the stranding, the course steered and the distance run should have placed his vessel 20 to 25 miles west of the spot where the "Coorong" took the ground. Under these circumstances, it would be unreasonable to expect the lead to be hove.

We, therefore, under the provisions granted to us under the Local Ordinance 51 Vic., No. 6, Sec. 2, s.s. (c.) "Agree that there is no case for an investigation." Therefore, "all proceedings in this case shall cease and determine."
