WHEREAS the Legislative Council now stands prorogued until Tuesday, the 11th June next; And whereas it is expedient further to prorogue the same; Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Legislative Council from Tuesday, the 11th day of June, to Tuesday, the 16th day of July next ensuing.

PROPOSED NEW REGULATIONS.

Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands or by any other authority, other than the Warden, shall have no force or effect within a proclaimed Goldfield; but the Warden of the Goldfield shall, on application, issue a miner's right free of charge in substitution therefor, for the unexpired period of such Miner's Right.

Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Wardens of Goldfields, and any other authority shall have full force and effect over any Crown lands outside of a proclaimed Goldfield.

2. The purchases will be made in Madras, Calcutta, and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in Iudia, by Remount Agents, under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

 3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depôt will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st October to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th September. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

 4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, four to six years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to classes I and III, remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

 5. Grave will not be purchased for hower and 12 artilliant.
 - 5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.
- 6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at Rs. 650, which will be paid at the Indian port of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 550, for other horses according to their merits, but every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the averages fixed above are not exceeded.

Mails for the Australian Colonies, New Zealand, Fiji, Canada, and the United States of America, for despatch per Railway to Albany and thence per P. & O. Steamer, will close at this Office on Friday, the 7th June, at 11:30 a.m.

Late Letters.—Late Letters for Europe, India, &c., on payment of a fee of 6d. in addition to the postage, will be received at the General Post Office up to 12·15 p.m.; and with a fee of 9d. in addition to the postage, at the Sorting Carriage, Perth Railway Station, up to 12·50 p.m. The late fee, in addition to the postage, on Letters for the Australian Colonies will be 2d. at the General Post Office, and 5d. at the Perth Railway Station, the hours being the same as for the European Mails. Late Letters without the fee will not be forwarded.

Letters for Registration will be received up to one hour before the time of closing the Mails.

Newspapers and Book Packets must be posted one hour before the time of closing the Mails, otherwise they will not be forwarded until the next Mail.

Parcel Post. — Parcels, for despatch per Parcel Post, must be booked by noon on the day preceding the closing of the Mail by which they are to be forwarded.

Money Orders for Europe, India, and the Australian Colonies can be obtained up to 2 p.m. of the day preceding the despatch of the Mails.

Stoppage at Pick-up Platforms.

Trains marked thus * will only stop at platforms when required to pick up or set down passengers. Passengers desiring to alight at any of the platforms must give notice to the Guard at the previous Station, in order to prevent their being carried beyond their destination.

The departure of Trains will be delayed or otherwise, under special circumstances, at the discretion of the Commissioner.

Departure or Arrival not Guaranteed.

The Commissioner of Railways does not guarantee the departure or arrival of the Trains at the time stated, nor will the Department be responsible for delay or any consequence arising therefrom.

Periodical Tickets.

Periodical Tickets between all Stations can be obtained on application to the Traffic Manager through Station Masters. They are not available by Special or other Trains than those notified in this Time Table.

Periodical Ticket holders, when travelling by Train, will be required to produce their Tickets when called upon to do so by any of the Officers or Servants of the Commissioner of Railways. A Passenger holding a Periodical Ticket neglecting or refusing to produce or deliver it up for inspection, when so required, must pay the regular fare.

A Periodical Ticket is not transferable; and if any such Ticket be found in the possession of any person to whom it was not issued, who shall attempt to travel therewith, it shall be retained, and absolutely forfeited, unless it shall appear that the proper holder thereof had not connived at such improper use.

Commissioner of Railways' Office, Perth, 27th May, 1889. In addition to the usual charge, a deposit of 10s. will be required on all Periodical Tickets, which will be returned on delivering up the said Ticket; but if not so delivered up within 24 hours after the expiration of the time for which the Ticket was issued, the said deposit shall be absolutely forfeited.

A new Periodical Ticket in lieu of one lost will only be issued on payment of ten per cent. on the original cost of such lost ticket (See By-Laws 13 and 14).

Note.—All Periodical Tickets are issued subject to any alteration which may be made in the Trains during their currency, and no allowance or compensation will be made to the holders on account of any alteration in the time, or reduction in number of Trains. No allowance or extension of time will be made on the ground of the holder of a Periodical Ticket having through sickness or disaster, or any other cause whatever, failed to use the ticket during the period or any part of the period for which it was issued.

Passengers' Tickets.

Any person (unless having a free pass) taking a seat, or remaining in any carriage used on the Railway, as a passenger therein, without having first paid his fare, and obtained a ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 (See By-Law No. 1).

Children

Children under three years of age, Free; above three and under twelve years, Half-fare.

Return Tickets.

Return tickets will be available only on the day of issue, or from Saturday to Monday, with the exception of Tickets issued to or from places beyond Guildford, which will be available for seven days, inclusive of day of issue, but exclusive of Sundays.

Return tickets issued to Stations beyond Beverley will be available for one month.

Special Trains. Excursions. Picnics.

Rates for Special Trains can be obtained from the Traffic Manager, Perth, to whom persons wishing to engage Special or Excursion Trains must give at least three days Notice in writing; and it is to be distinctly understood that the Commissioner of Railways does not bind himself to let Special or Excursion Trains on Public Holidays. A concession of single fare for the double journey will be made to bona fide Excursion or Picnic parties of not less than 20, on special application to the Traffic Manager.

Passengers' Luggage,

First Class Passengers are allowed, of ordinary luggage, 84fbs.; Second Class, 56fbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged for at Parcels Rates. Passengers are strongly recommended to have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and to satisfy themselves that it is placed in the Train. The Commissioner of Railways will not be responsible for any luggage unless it is specially booked and paid for, and the owner's name and its destination distinctly marked thereon (See By-Law 15).

Smoking.

Smoking will only be permitted in the compartment of a Carriage set apart for that purpose (See By-Law 26).

Gratuities.

Servants of the Commissioner of Railways are prohibited from receiving any gratuity from the public, on pain of dismissal.

Irregularities.

It is requested that any irregularity may be immediately reported to the Traffic Manager, Perth.

Passengers to and from Eastern Railway change Carriages at Beverley.

NOTE: —These Tables show the times at which the Trains may be expected to arrive and depart from the several Stations. Every exertion will be made to ensure punctuality; but the arrival and departure of the Trains at the time stated will not be guaranteed; nor will the Company be responsible for delay, or any consequence therefrom.

Perth Time will be kept at all Stations.

Passengers can be booked at the Stations only on condition that there is room in the carriages. The tickets furnished to Passengers on payment of their fares will be required to be produced or given up whenever demanded by any Railway Officer or Servant, it being distinctly understood that the tickets remain the property of the Company and are not sold to passengers. Any passenger unable or refusing to produce the required ticket or travelling with one that is illegible will be charged the fare from the most distant station whence the train started. These tickets are not transferable, but are available only for the persons to whom they are issued.

The departure of trains will be delayed or otherwise, under special circumstances, at the discretion of the Company.

Trains will only stop when required to pick up or set down Passengers at Stations marked thus. Passengers desiring to alight must give notice to the Guard at the previous Stopping Station.

Return Tickets at Single fare and a half for the double journey will be issued at all Stations available by all ordinary trains for the undermentioned periods. For distances of one hundred miles and under, Seven Days; for distances over one hundred miles, One Month. The period of computation will date from the day of issue, and the return journey must be completed before the expiration of the corresponding day in the week, or the corresponding date in the month following respectively.

Passengers breaking their Journey.—The holder of any Single or Return Ticket may break his journey at any Station which may be short of the Station to which he is booked; always provided:—

1st. That the passenger on alighting presents his ticket to the Station Master, to be nipped and initialled.

2nd. That it has not been nipped at the same Station, or any Station in advance previously.

The Passenger may resume his journey at the Station where he alights, or at any Station ahead with the same ticket if it has not been previously so used.

Passengers' Luggage.—First Class Passengers are allowed of ordinary luggage, 84lbs.: Second Class, 56lbs. Any excess and articles of merchandise will be charged at Parcels' Rates.

Excess Luggage must be in the Booking Office fifteen minutes before the starting of the Train, so as to give sufficient time to have it weighed and stowed.

Passengers should have their names and the Station to which they are proceeding distinctly marked on their luggage, and see that it is properly labelled. If left behind and forwarded by a subsequent Train through neglect of this precaution, ordinary Parcels' Rates will be charged. To prevent mistakes, all old labels should be removed.
