#### NEW REGULATIONS.

- 95. The powers conferred on the Commissioner of Crown Lands under Clause 88 of the Goldfields regulations of the 1st October, 1886, shall until further notice be exercised by the Warden of a Goldfield.
- 96. Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands or by any other authority, other than the Warden, shall have no force or effect within a proclaimed Goldfield; but the Warden of the Goldfield shall, on application, issue a miner's right free of charge in substitution therefor, for the unexpired period of such Miner's Right.
- 97. Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Wardens of Goldfields, and any other authority shall have full force and effect over any Crown lands outside of a proclaimed Goldfield.


