PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, } By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK

WHEREAS by "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," it is provided that it shall be lawful for me, the said Governor, to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purpose of the said Act; AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, all that piece or parcel of land, being part of Fremantle Town Lot 119, situate along 47 feet of the wall of the Police Stables in Fremantle by a depth of 22 feet, and bounded on the East by a wall, and on the South by Wharfage grants, now used as a stockyard for shipping purposes.

NEW REGULATIONS.

95. The powers conferred on the Commissioner of Crown Lands under Clause 88 of the Goldfields regulations of the 1st October, 1886, shall until further notice be exercised by the Warden of a Goldfield.

96. Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands or by any other authority, other than the Warden, shall have no force or effect within a proclaimed Goldfield; but the Warden of the Goldfield shall, on application, issue a miner's right free of charge in substitution therefor, for the unexpired period of such Miner's Right.

97. Miner's Rights issued by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, Wardens of Goldfields, and any other authority shall have full force and effect over any Crown lands outside of a proclaimed Goldfield.
