### SOUTH ENTRANCE TO MORETON BAY.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Channel across the Bar, at the South Entrance, has shifted farther to the eastward. Vessels should now enter with the Northern shoulder of Mount Cotton open of Amity Point, about one-third of the distance across to Moreton Island, and steer for it, passing the elbow of the South Break on the port hand. When the first black buoy off the South end of Moreton Island is sighted, they should haul up and pass it as usual.

The depth on the Bar at low-water springs does not exceed 12 feet.

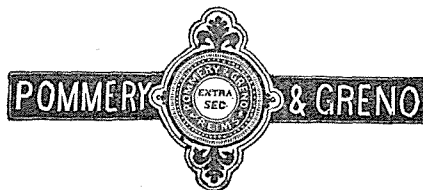
