PROCLAMATION

Mestern Australin, to wit.

By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick Napier Broome, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Tuesday, the Twenty-third day of JULY INSTANT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

Mestern Australia, to wit.

(L. S.) F. Napier Broome, Governor. By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the provisions of an Act passed in the fiftieth year of Our Lady the Queen, and intituled "An Act for the Management of Goldfields," I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim the portion of Crown Lands bounded on the West by a line extending South from a spot on the Sea Coast East by South from Depuch Island, and passing through the summit of Mount Negri to a spot due West from Trigonometrical Station B 3; on the South by a line extending East to said Station B 3, then South to a spot East from Mt. Vigors, and then East to a spot South from the summit of Mt. Macpherson; on the East by a line extending North through the summit of Mt. Macpherson to a spot East from the junction of the Shaw River with the DeGrey River; and on the North by a line extending West through the said junction to a spot North from aforesaid Station B 3; then North to the Sea Coast and along it Westwards to the starting point, to be a Goldfield, and to be known and called by the name of "The Pilbarra Goldfield."

The Proclamation of the 1st of October, 1888, (C.S.O. No. 3599) is hereby cancelled from this date.
