# Bunbury Municipality.

THE following By-Laws, in addition to those Gazetted on 29th November, 1888, were duly passed and adopted at a monthly meeting of the Bunbury Municipal Council, held on the 1st July, 1889.

No. 22.—To Prevent the Danger from the Driving of Vehicles at Night.

Any person who between any sunset and the following sunrise, from and after the first day of September, 1889, shall in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, or any vehicle constructed

for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, and merchandise, or of persons only, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

- 23. The owner or owners of all premises within the Bunbury Townsite shall have erected thereon privies, with either watertight cess pits constructed of brick and cement, or proper earth closets with buckets or pans for the reception of night soil, and the occupier or occupiers of such premises shall cause such cesspits to be emptied at least once in three months, or oftener if considered necessary by the Inspector of Nuisances, and such buckets or pans shall be emptied once a week, or so often as the Inspector may direct; and any person neglecting or refusing to do so after receiving forty-eight hours notice from the Inspector of Nuisances shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws.
- 24. No privy or cesspit shall be emptied, nor any night soil removed or carted away, nor any offensive liquor or matter of any kind whatever emptied out of or removed from any house, cellar, or premises within the Bunbury Townsite between the hours of 5 a.m. and 11 p.m. of any day.
- 25. Every bucket or pan kept for the reception of night soil shall be first approved by the Inspector of Nuisances, and shall be free from leaks and holes.
- 26. No closet shall in future be erected or allowed to remain within the Townsite, except in such position as shall be approved by the Inspector of Nuisances or other person appointed by the Council.
- 27. No person shall exercise or practise the business of a nightman, or drive any night cart within the Bunbury Townsite unless he shall first obtain a license to do so from the Town Clerk, for which license a fee of five shillings per annum shall be paid.
- 28. Any licensed nightman who shall ask, demand, or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, any sum greater than that fixed by the following scale shall be guilty of an offence.

# Scale of Charges.

For cleansing and removing the contents of any bucket or pan kept for the reception of night soil ... ... 4d.

For cleansing and removing the contents of any cesspit not to exceed... ... 10s.

29. For every offence against the provisions of these By-Laws, to which no penalty is herein attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

IIS Excellency the Governor in Council has ordered that the following addition be inserted in all Leases of Pastoral Lands in the South-West, Eucla, and Eastern Divisions of the Colony:—

"Provided also, and it is hereby declared, that this Lease is granted subject to the provisions of any contract which heretofore has been, or before the expiration of the said term may be, made between the Government of Western Australia and any person or company contracting therewith for the construction of a Railway. Provided also, and it is hereby further declared, that after the date of the making of any such contract the right of selection in the fiftieth of the Land Regulations of 1887 mentioned shall not be exercised in respect of the land by this Lease demised; and in the event of the whole or any part of the land hereby demised being selected under such contract by such person

or company so contracting as aforesaid, or by his or their assigns, thereupon this Lease and every provision, matter, and thing herein contained shall, in respect of the land so selected, cease and determine."

N.B.—In the Leases for Pastoral Lands in the Eucla and Eastern Divisions, the words printed as above in *italics* are to be omitted, not being applicable.

To the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, Perth.

SIR.

Geraldton, 19th July, 1889.

I have the honor to submit, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, a further report relating to the disposal of funds intrusted to me for the relief of sufferers by the Greenough Flood.

- 2. As shown by the Balance Sheet accompanying my last report, my cash receipts up to 10th August, 1888, had been £1,175 13s. 8d., and my disbursements £977 14s. 10d., leaving on hand a balance of £197 18s. 10d.
- 3. Since that date I have received £1,632 4s., and have disbursed £1,253 4s. 7d., leaving a balance on hand of £576 18s. 3d., as shown by Balance Sheet\* herewith.
- 4. It will thus be seen that my total cash receipts have amounted to £2,807 17s. 8d., and my total disbursements to £2,230 19s. 5d.
- 5. Of the Government Grant of £500 to assist the Greenough sufferers £250 is still available in the Treasury, and when that amount shall have been added to the funds already intrusted to me for disbursement it will bring up my cash receipts to £3,057 17s. 8d.
- 6. Of the receipts disclosed by the accompanying Balance Sheet I desire to particularise the following, viz.:—

1. A moiety of the Government contribution...£250002. From the Perth-Greenough Relief Committee...650663. From the Perth Central Relief Committee...70000

- 7. The immediate object of this report is to submit the accompanying statement marked A,\* showing the disposal of the £650 6s. 6d. forwarded to me by the Perth-Greenough Relief Committee—Miss Eliot, Hon. Secretary; Rev. J. Allen, Hon. Treasurer.
- 8. It was stipulated by the Committee that this amount of £650 6s. 6d. should be distributed in cash, by way of gift, as soon as possible, and a hope was expressed that I would report direct to the Committee the particulars of its distribution.
  - 9. Such particulars I purpose forwarding direct to the Committee by this mail.
- 10. In connection with the large disbursement in cash since August last of the donations of a number of sympathisers to sufferers by the Greenough Flood, I enclose (marked B) a copy of resolutions passed at a numerously attended meeting of the Greenough people, convened by me for the specific purposes indicated by the resolutions, as well as a copy of resolutions submitted and negatived.

In making the disbursements I have adhered as strictly as possible to the terms and spirit of the resolutions passed at the meeting referred to, and I feel assured that particular attention need only be drawn to resolution No. 9 dealing with the question of the publication of the names of recipients of relief to insure that the decision of the meeting thereon will be respected. A decision which I doubt not every donor would regret to find disregarded.

- 11. If it be decided to publish the Balance Sheet\* herewith, I trust the names of persons disclosed by it will be omitted.
- 12. Certain recipients of seed corn during last year have returned what they borrowed, but in the majority of instances I have thought it well not to require return of the seed; and, instead, to charge its value to the recipients as a donation.
- 13. Owing to the scanty rainfall during last season the crops at the Greenough were at best but moderate. This season however there has, so far, been a bountiful supply of rain; a large area of land has been brought under cultivation, and the prospects of the farmers are certainly encouraging.
- 14. Before the commencement of winter the area of flood waters remaining had been reduced to about four acres, a result due to the combined effects of evaporation and shafts sunk at the expense of the Relief funds for the purpose of draining off the water. One such shaft when first sunk carried off water at the rate of two hundred thousand gallons per twenty-four hours.

# Resolutions dealt with by Meeting of Greenough sufferers.

- 1. That all persons who have suffered loss by the Greenough flood, and desire to participate in the funds placed in Mr. Maitland Brown's hands for distribution, should be held entitled to share in such funds in proportion to their losses. The meeting, however, think that a sum of (say) £250 should be set aside to be used in the future, in Mr. Brown's discretion, to meet special cases that may arise, at present unforeseen. (Carried unanimously).
- 2. Resolved that the loss of stubble feed shall be estimated in the apportionment of losses. (Carried, with only four dissenting voices).

- 3. That where uncultivated feeding land is shown to have been under water for a considerable period, say about four months, the loss of the feed should be estimated. (Proposition lost by a considerable majority).
- 4. Proposed that no bush feed should be taken into consideration as an element of the losses. (Carried by a large majority, minority being only four).
  - 5. Prices of grain and other property ranked at losses decided upon—

Wheat, per bushel 4s. Barley " 3s. 6d. Oats Hay, per ton £4 (by a large majority). Sheep, per head 7s. (by a large majority). Pigs, per head 15s. (by majority of 10). Fowls, 3s. per pair. Stubble feed, 3s. 4d. per acre.

- 6. Decided that the covering of fallowed land by the flood, from which the waters receded in time to allow fresh ploughing before cropping season, was not a loss, and should not be estimated as such except where the flood washed away all the loss fallow soil. (Carried unanimously).
- 7. Decided that fallowed land entirely washed away should be estimated as a loss, and valued (Carried unanimously).
- 8. Decided that wire fencing washed down should be estimated at the rate of 4s. per chain. (Carried unanimously).
- 9. Proposed that the losses of each person should be published in the newspapers of the Colony; also the names of the recipients of relief, together with the details of such relief. (Negatived by the whole meeting).
