Extract from the Minutes of a Meeting of the Executive Council, held on the 12th August, 1889.

THE following Order was made under the 37th Section of "The Public Health Act, 1886":—

"Ordered by His Excellency the Governor in Council that the provisions of the 38th Section of 'The Public Health Act, 1886,' giving the Central Board of Health power to make the necessary regulations for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases, be put in force in Western Australia."

The following Regulations are made this day by the Central Board of Health, pursuant to an Order of the Governor in Council, dated the 12th inst.

Regulations under Section 38 of "The Public Health Act, 1886."

1. In these Regulations the word "Magistrate" shall mean the Government Resident or Resident Magistrate of the District, except in the Perth, Fremantle, and Swan Districts, when it shall mean the Colonial Secretary. The words "Medical Officer" shall mean the Government Medical Officer of the District.

2. The following shall be deemed to be diseases within the scope and meaning of these Regulations:—Cholera; Small-pox; Typhus, Typhoid, Scarlet, or other infectious or contagious Fever, and Leprosy.

3. Any householder who may have reason to believe that any person upon his premises is suffering from one of the diseases aforesaid shall immediately report the same to the Magistrate. Any Medical Officer or Medical practitioner aware of a

case of such disease shall also immediately make a similar report.

4. The Magistrate, on the report of the appearance of any one of the diseases aforesaid within his district, shall forthwith communicate with the Medical Officer, and upon the existence of the disease being certified to him in writing by the Medical Officer, shall take, and is hereby empowered to take, in conjunction with the Medical Officer, such steps as to the said Magistrate may seem necessary for carrying out the following measures:—

(a.) Provision of proper medical attendance, treatment, medicines, nursing, accommodation, clothing, and other necessaries for the sick.

(b.) Isolation of patients and such persons as may have been in contact with the patients or with any other means of infection or contagion.

(c.) Removal of the patients, and those who have been in contact with them, to any convenient temporary hospital, building, or place of quarantine.

(d.) Prevention of intercourse between patients (or those who have been in contact with them or with any means of infection or contagion) and other persons.

(e.) Destruction of infected clothing or other articles, and disinfection of persons, houses, conveyances, or materials.

(f.) Burial of the dead at such time or in such mode as to the Medical Officer may seem best calculated to prevent the spread of disease.

5. In carrying out the above measures and these Regulations, the Magistrate shall act in conjunction with, and with the concurrence of the Medical Officer.

6. The Magistrate may employ the Police, and any other persons he may deem fit and proper to be engaged, to assist him in carrying out these Regulations.

7. When and so long as the Magistrate and Medical Officer shall have reason to apprehend the existence of any such disease aforesaid within the district, the said Magistrate, the Medical Officer,

and, subject to the control of the Magistrate, any persons authorised and employed by the Magistrate for the carrying out of these Regulations shall have, and may exercise such restraint of persons and things, and such power of entry into houses, buildings, and premises, as to the Magistrate may appear reasonable and necessary for the prevention of the spread of the disease.

8. The Magistrate, acting in conjunction with the Medical Officer and persons authorised by the Magistrate, may exercise any powers and perform any acts which are reasonable and necessary in order to prevent the spread of disease, even though such powers and acts are not specified in these Regulations.

9. All Municipal authorities shall co-operate with the Magistrate in carrying out these Regulations.

10. The Magistrate, if within telegraphic communication, shall report daily, for the information of

the Central Board of Health, proceedings taken by him under these Regulations. If not within reach of telegraph, such report shall be made by the earliest and by every opportunity.

11. The Magistrate and Medical Officer shall, in carrying out these Regulations, conform to such instructions as shall from time to time be issued to them by order of the Central Board of Health.

12. These Regulations shall come into force, after approval of the Governor, on their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall remain in force until repealed or altered.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Order by Her Majesty in Council carrying into effect a Declaration of the 19th of February last, amending the Extradition Treaty of 1878 between Her Majesty and the King of Spain.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted that where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, between Her Majesty and the King of Spain for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the twenty-seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, it was directed that the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should apply in the case of Spain:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provisions of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Declaration was concluded on the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, between the Government of Her Majesty and the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, for amending paragraph 5, Article II, and paragraph 5, Article VI, of the above-mentioned Treaty of the fourth June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight, which Declaration is in the terms following:—

"The Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, being desirous to provide for the more effectual repression of crimes and offences in their respective territories, have authorized in due form the undersigned to agree as follows:—

"ARTICLE I.

"The English and Spanish texts of paragraph 5, Article II, of the Extradition Treaty of the 4th June, 1878, are cancelled, and the following text is substituted therefor:—

"Unlawful carnal knowledge or any attempt to have unlawful carnal knowledge of a girl under sixteen years of age. Indecent assault."

"ARTICLE II.

"The Spanish text of paragraph 5, Article VI, of the aforesaid Treaty

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the said Declaration of the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, with the Government of His Majesty the King of Spain, as fully to all intents and purposes as in the case of the said recited Treaty of the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight:

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered, that the operation of the said Acts shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to the Kingdom of Spain and to the said Treaty and Declaration, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

is amended by the substitution of the words 'no menor' for the words 'que no podrá exceder,' so that the Spanish text shall run, "A la terminacion de un plazo no menor de quince dias desde que se ordenó la prision y sujecion a juicio del preso, &c."

"ARTICLE III.

"The present Declaration shall come into force ten days after its publication in the manner prescribed by law in the respective countries.

"In witness whereof the Undersigned have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

"Done at Madrid, in duplicate, the nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

PEARL SHELL FISHERY.

Additional Instructions for the guidance of the Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries and all other officers concerned.

- a. Duty paid goods, or goods not subject to duty, may be transhipped between Coasting Steamers and Pearling Vessels at sea or at any anchorage. Provided that all such goods shall be duly specified in a Customs sufferance accompanying the same.
- b. Goods in bond, required for sea consumption by any Pearling Vessel, can only be obtained at a declared port by the vessel for consumption on board of which the goods are required, or from a lighter licensed under the Act 42 Vic., No. 21, having a Customs permit and under sealed hatches. Goods so obtained must be entered on the manifest of the vessel, and must be accounted for to the satisfaction of an Officer of Customs before further supplies are permitted to be shipped in bond.
- c. Dutiable goods may, at any declared port, be stored, shipped, or forwarded, in bond, coastwise, as required, the proper documents being had.
- d. Pearl Shells may be transhipped, at sea or at any anchorage, between Pearling Vessels and Coasting Steamers, and may be stored or forwarded coastwise, in bond, as required, at or from the first port of arrival.
- e. Pearl Shells may be entered for export, and duty paid thereon, at any port. Duty will be levied upon all pearl shells not accompanied by a statutory declaration, in due form, setting forth that they have been raised beyond the three-mile limit.

GASCOYNE ROADS BOARD.

BY-LAW.

After the publication in the *Government Gazette* of this By-law, all leading horses in teams, travelling upon any of the roads under the control of the Gascoyne Roads Board, shall be driven in couples. Any person or persons infringing this By-law shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recovered summarily as provided by the 108th Section of the 52nd Vict., No. 16.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the following By-Laws passed by the Carnarvon Commonage Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Commonage lands.

Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. That an annual sum of five shillings per head for horses and cattle, and three-pence per head for sheep for killing purposes, and 1s. per head for sheep not kept for killing purposes, shall be levied upon every owner of stock residing within the Carnarvon Commonage, and paid to the Gascoyne Roads Board on the first days of January and July in each year.

2. That it shall be compulsory for every owner of stock situate within the Carnarvon Commonage to give to the Board the correct number of horses, cattle, sheep, and goats owned by them, on the thirty-first day of December and the thirtieth day of June in each year, and obtain a

certificate from the Chairman of the Gascoyne Roads Board showing the number and description of such stock.

3. No stock shall be kept on the Commonage unless the property of persons residing within it.

4. That all stock depasturing on the Commonage the property of one person shall not exceed of cattle and horses fifty, and of sheep shall not exceed fifty, except sheep for killing purposes which shall not exceed two hundred; and, if they exceed that number, thirty shillings for horses and cattle, 6d. per head for sheep kept for killing purposes, and two shillings and sixpence per head for sheep not kept for killing purposes; for pigs, twenty shillings per head shall be charged.

5. That all arrears of taxes levied on account of the Carnarvon Commonage remaining unpaid on the first day of February and the first day of August in each year after these By-Laws come into force shall be sued for by the Chairman of the Gascoyne Roads Board in the Local Court of this district, and on recovery thereof any stock in respect of which proceedings are taken shall be liable to be seized and sold by order of the Court to defray such arrears together with expenses and costs.

6. That all owners of stock neglecting to comply with these By-Laws shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, together with costs and all fees due under By-Law No. 1.

7. All fees and fines shall be for and on account of the Carnarvon Commonage.

8. That the only persons exempt from these rules shall be *bonâ fide* travellers with stock, provided such travellers stay not more than forty-eight hours on the Commonage; and also teams travelling, not more than one week; and if any person shall exceed the time allowed for staying on the Commonage, the sum of Threepence per head for horses and cattle, and One penny per head for sheep, shall be charged per week or for any part of a week. Camels shall be allowed to stay on the Commonage forty-eight hours, and if they exceed that time Two shillings per head per week, or for any part of the week, shall be charged.

9. That it shall be compulsory for all travelling stock to depasture on the South side of the river, between the Southern telegraph line and the sea coast; such stock being permitted to travel for water and to the port for shipping. Sheep kept for killing purposes shall be permitted to depasture on the North of the river westward of the road running to Coolilee, and on the South side one mile west from the eastward boundary of the Commonage and thence South.

10. That the Gascoyne Roads Board shall have full power to farm, let, or make any other arrangement for carrying out the above By-Laws.

11. That all horses and cattle under the age of twelve months shall be exempt from the above By-Laws.
