#### PROCLAMATION

Mestern Australia,

(L. S.) F. Napier Broome, Governor.

By His Excellency SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS under the provisions of an Act of the Legislative Council, passed in the 43rd year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 23, intituled "An Act for the prevention of the Importation of Diseased Stock," the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is empowered, by Proclamation, to prohibit the introduction into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any cattle within the meaning of the said Act and of "The Cattle Diseases Ordinance, 1865," and "The Imported Stock Act, 1876," or either of them: AND WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the 20th day of June, 1888, the importation into, and landing in Western Australia of horned cattle, sheep, and swine from Europe were placed under certain restrictions: AND WHEREAS, under the provisions of the said Act, the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to vary or annul the restrictions imposed on importation by any such Proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to prohibit altogether the introduction into the Colony of swine from Europe or from any other place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers possessed by me under the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do by this Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, vary the said Proclamation of the 20th

June, 1888, by annulling the restrictions under which swine may be imported from Europe, and do prohibit the importation into, and landing in, Western Australia from Europe, or from any other place beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies, of all swine.

COLONIAL OFFICE TO THE AGENT-GENERAL FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

SIR.

Downing Street, November 15, 1888.

I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 18th in-stant, conveying the renewed request of your Government that they may have an opportunity, before any appointment is made, of expressing an opinion with regard to the person whom it may be proposed to appoint as Governor of South Australia.

Lord Knutsford regrets that he is not able to give to this request any other answer than that returned to the Government of Queensland last month, in the letter which was read in the House of Commons by the Under Secretary of State on Monday last. It would be a great satisfaction and assistance to the Secretary of State in the performance of a very responsible duty, if it were possible in some manner to ascertain, before the Queen's pleasure is taken, that the gentleman whom he thinks suitable is also acceptable to the Government and people of the Colony in which he is to represent Her Majesty for several years. And Lord Knutsford trusts that it will be understood that the inebility of Her Wajesty's Government to comply with And Lord Khutsford trusts that it will be different that the inability of Her Majesty's Government to comply with the wish of your Ministers in this matter is in no way connected with any indisposition to consult their views in other cases whenever practicable.

As Lord Knutsford stated to the Agent-General for Queensland, Her Majesty's Government feel precluded, by the conditions of the Governor's office, from having recourse to the advice of the Colonial Ministry in regard to the selection of a Governor. There are certain extra-Colonial functions in the discharge of which the Governor must be responsible to the Crown alone, and his action in must be responsible to the Crown alone, and his action in regard to which does not interfere with or affect the full responsibility of the Ministry in the internal affairs of the Colony. But, independently of his more strictly imperial duties, the Governor occupies a position in regard to political matters which appears to preclude the local Ministry from taking any part in his selection. The antagonism between parties in the Colonial Parliaments has frequently been very strong, and on the retirement of the Ministry, which had virtually controlled the selection of the Governor, the succeeding Ministry might not improbably feel doubt as to his impartiality. For example, in dealing with the question—often one of much difficulty—whether a dissolution of Parliament ought to be granted or withheld, if the Governor should, however bona fide, act in accordance with the political interests of the party which had approved his appointment, his fairness might not improbably be called in question by the other side.

Indeed, it seems obvious that in this and similar cases the relations of the Governor to the Colonists, as well as to the Crown, might be gravely embarrassed.

I am further to point out that a public man of high standing could not well be asked to undertake an office to the approval of others at a distance who may have little information as to his fitness, but beyond such personal considerations the constitutional obstacle which has been referred to appears to Lord Knutsford to be insurmountable.

Minutes of a preliminary Court of Inquiry held at the Court House, Fremantle, this 12th day of August, 1889, before Leonard Worsley Clifton, Esq., Collector of Customs, and R. Fairbairn, Esq., Justice of the Peace, to inquire into the circumstances attending a Casualty that happened to the British Barque "Minero," of London, Official No. 54939, 1478 tons burther commanded by D. Davies the number of 478 tons burthen, commanded by D. Davies, the number of whose Certificate of Competency is 23859, when on a voyage from London bound to Fremantle, Western Australia, and held under the provisions of the 1st Section of the Local Ordinance 28 Vic., No. 2, and the 51 Vic., No. 6.

The Court having appointed William Owston, Master Mariner, the number of whose Certificate of Service is 75647, proceeded in his presence to take the following

David Davies states: I am master of the British Ship "Minero." I left London for Fremantle on the 26th of April last. We had a fair voyage up to the 16th July, when in Latitude 44 South and Longitude 52 East, the ship being under top-gallant sails, the wind North, steering East,—we were going at about 6 knots per hour—a sudend curst struck the ship, and carried away the bowsenidend gust struck the ship, and carried away the bowsprit and No. 6 stay. The bowsprit was of iron. We cut away and let the bowsprit go. It took us 24 hours to cut away.

The ship received no other damage. The stays all went th the jib-boom. Before cutting away I secured the The stays all went with the jib-boom. foremast with a fish and other tackle.

From that time till we reached Fremantle we had strong westerly winds. I cannot say whether or not the ship is insured.

We reached Fremantle on the 3rd inst.

#### FINDING OF THE COURT.

Read in presence and hearing of D. Davies, Master of the British Barque "Minero."

WE find that this casualty was caused by the breaking of a link in the bob-stay in a squall, whereby the bowsprit and jib-boom were carried away, and that none of the certificated officers or members of the crew are in any way to blame; therefore, by virtue of the powers granted to us under section 2 and sub-section c of the 51st Vict., No. 6, we agree that there is no case for further investigation, and therefore all further proceedings shall cease and determine.

IIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the following Amended By-Laws passed by the Northampton Commonage Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Commonage Lands.

JOHN FORREST, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- 1. That no stock whatever (except bond fide travellers or travelling teams) be allowed to run free of charge on the Commonage, and that all large stock be charged at the rate of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per head per annum, or any part thereof, calves and foals above six months old to be chargeable; and that bond fide butchers only be allowed to keep 300 (three hundred) sheep at one time, and no more, at the rate of 2d. (twopence) per head per annum; teams, whose owners do not reside within the limits of the Commonage, shall be considered travelling teams and shall be allowed to remain a period not exceeding 7 (seven) days free of charge; goats to be charged at the rate of 6d. (sixpence) per head per annum, and that only 2 (two) shall be kept by one family; kids, when 6 (six) months old to become chargeable. Bond fide butchers shall be considered those who reside within the townsite of Northampton, and keeping a butcher's shop for the convenience of the public; and that no rams, store or breeding sheep be kept under any pretext whatever on the Commonage; and, further, that no stock shall be allowed to run on the Commonage unless they be the property of persons residing within the limits of the said Commonage. Pigs not to be allowed to run on the Commonage.
- 2. That each householder be allowed to run 10 (ten) head of large stock, and that a lodger be allowed to run a number not exceeding 2 (two) horses.
- 3. That the Chairman of the Northampton Commonage be empowered to grant a special license to persons wishing to keep a dairy herd, such herd not to exceed 20 (twenty) in number, and the period of such license not to exceed 3 (three) months, at a charge of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per head.
- 4. That one month after the publication in the Government Gazette of His Excellency the Governor's approval of the said Rules and By-Laws, and on or before the same date of each and every succeeding year, all stock found depasturing on the Commonage, the fees chargeable on them not having been paid, then, and in every such case, the said stock may be impounded in any safe place within the neighborhood of Northampton, and in every sense of the word be dealt with under the provisions of the Trespass Act. Provided always, that in the event of the ownership of the said stock being satisfactorily proved to the Chairman of the said Commonage Board, then, and in every such case, the Chairman shall, at the request of the owner of the said stock, release them from the pound on payment of the Commonage fees, and all expenses incurred in running in and impounding the said stock.
- 5. That it shall be compulsory for each and every owner of stock residing within and making use of the Northampton Commonage to send in in writing, addressed to the Secretary of the Commonage Board for the time being, a return showing the number and description of such stock, not later than one month after His Excellency the Governor's approval of the said Rules and By-Laws, and on or before the same date in each and every succeeding year, and obtain the necessary certificate under the hand of the Chairman for the time being.
- 6. That all fees and fines shall be paid to the Chairman of the Northampton Commonage for the time being, and be placed to the credit of the said Commonage account.
- 7. That travelling sheep be allowed to remain on the Commonage for 24 (twenty-four) hours and no more.
- 8. That the owners or occupiers of unfenced freehold property, within the Commonage, shall have the right of depasturing 4 (four) head of large stock within the said Commonage, free of charge, for every 100 (one hundred) acres, on condition of allowing other stock depasturing on the Commonage to have free access to the said unfenced freehold land.
