IS Excellency the Governor, in Executive Council, has been placed to Council, has been pleased to approve of the following By-Laws passed by the Geraldton Municipal Council.

At an adjourned General Meeting of the Gerald-ton Town Council, held on Monday evening, April 8th, 1889, it was resolved that the following By-Laws be added to those already in force in the Municipality, and published in the *Government* Gazette of July 12th, 1888.

By-Law No. 21.

Any person residing within the boundaries of the Municipality of Geraldton who shall keep or use a carriage, car, cart, wagon, or other vehicle, for seven days, without having obtained a license signed by the Collector of the Council, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction any sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

By-Law No. 22.

Any person who shall keep or use any vehicle in the course of trade or for hire within the boundaries of the Municipality, without having the owner's name and the licensed number painted thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length, in some conspicuous place on the off side of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction for every such offence any sum not exceeding Two pounds.

By-Law No. 23.

Any person who shall keep cattle, horses, sheep, or goats within the boundaries of the Municipality and depasturing the same on the Commonage without having obtained a license signed by the Collector of the Council, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding One pound.

By-Law No. 24.

All Licenses issued by the Collector of the Council shall continue in force until the 31st day of December in each year, and no license shall be issued for a less period than six months.

By-Law No. 25.

Any person who shall in the course of trade or business within the boundaries of the Municipality use any false weights or measures shall forfeit and pay upon conviction thereof, for every such offence, any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

By-Law No. 26.

Any person who shall sell or offer for sale within the boundaries of the Municipality any meat, fish, or vegetables unfit for human food, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

By-Law No. 27.

Any person allowing stock of any description to stray on the Sand Hills, or who shall remove therefrom any bush or growth whatever within the Municipality, without the consent of the Mayor in writing, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound, nor more than Ten pounds for each and every offence.

By-Law No. 28.

The owner or owners of any cattle, horses, or any other stock whatever which shall be found trespassing in or upon any lands or streets whereof the Municipality shall have jurisdiction, or in or upon any lands within the limits of the said Municipality which shall not be enclosed by a sufficient fence, shall, upon conviction before one of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the Colony of Western Australia, forfeit and pay for every such offence the following fines, viz. —For every entire horse, ass, or bull, not less than Three pounds, or more than Five pounds. For every other head of cattle or any other stock, any sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

By-Law No. 29.

Any person or persons who shall be the owner or owners of any dog or dogs, within the Municipality of Geraldton, which shall have the mange or any other infectious disease, shall cause such dog or dogs to be chained up, and that all dogs at large so infected shall be destroyed by the Inspector of Nuisances, or any other person appointed by the Council, after 48 hours notice having been given to the owner or owners of such dog or dogs.

By-Law No. 30.

Any person who shall lay, cast, throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast, or thrown any bottle, bottles, broken glass, china, crockeryware, empty tins, or other rubbish or refuse, in or upon the carriage way, foot way, street, beach, reserve, or other public place within the Municipality shall, upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace for the Colony, forfeit and pay for the first offence a sum not exceeding 10s., for the second offence a sum not exceeding 30s. for each such offence.

By-Law No. 31.

Any person or occupier of any land, house, or premises within the boundaries of the Municipality, who shall neglect or refuse for 14 days after notice from the Inspector of Nuisances to abate or remove all nuisances which are or shall arise thereon, or to remove any inflammable building, or pile or stack of wood or any material dangerous to the adjoining or contiguous property, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

By-Law No. 32.

No privy or cesspool shall be emptied, nor any night soil carted away, nor any offensive liquor or matter of any kind whatever pumped out of or removed from any house, cellar, or premises, within the townsite of Geraldton, between the hour of 5 a.m. and the hour of 11 p.m. of any day, and that any person or persons being guilty of a breach of this By-Law shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

I IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws made by the Swan Roads Board, under the provisions of Section 62 of "The Roads Act, 1888."

> JOHN FORREST, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. The Board shall meet in the Board-room at the Guildford Court House on the first Monday in each month, at 3:30 p.m., for transaction of general business, and each member shall have at least three days notice of such meeting as a reminder.

2. There shall be a secretary, who will have custody of all deeds, records, books and writings, to be kept in the Board-room, and open to inspection of any member of the Board at all reasonable hours.

3. All licenses authorised by the Board shall be issued by the secretary, and the fees arising therefrom be placed to credit of the Board in the Bank.

4. All notices issuing from the Board, unless specially directed, shall be posted at the Court House, Guildford, and at one other conspicuous place.

5. Any person obstructing the traffic of a main or minor road in the district by camping thereon, at other than places defined for such purpose, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ (two pounds).

6. Any person camping on any bridge in the district, fishing therefrom, or in any other way obstructing the traffic, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ (two pounds).

7. Any person bathing within 200 yards of any bridge, public road, or dwelling house, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ (two pounds).

8. Any person wilfully allowing his horses, cattle, camels, sheep, or pigs to stray on any main or minor road in the district, except when travelling, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ (two pounds).

9. Any horse, cow, sheep, pig, or other animal suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, straying or being driven or ridden on any road in the district, shall be liable to be seized by any person employed by the Board, and the owner of such animal shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 (twenty pounds).

10. Any person wilfully allowing any dead animal to remain unburied near any public road, so as to constitute it a nuisance, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$ (five pounds).

T is hereby notified, for public information, that 15 blocks of land, averaging from 139 acres to 313 acres each, have recently been surveyed between Nobby's Well and Derby, and on and after the 1st of October next will be open to sale to the first applicant, under the provisions of Clause 52 of the Land Regulations.

For convenience, and general information, the conditions of Clause 52 of the Land Regulations referred to above are here inserted :---

- (a.) The land within an area shall only be disposed of after survey and sub-division, under conditions of improvement as prescribed by these Regulations.
- (b.) The price of land within areas shall be fixed by the Governor in Council, but shall not be less than ten shillings an acre, payable in ten yearly instalments or sooner, as prescribed by these Regulations.
- (c.) No person under the age of eighteen years shall be eligible to apply for land within an area.
- (d.) The total quantity held by one person under this clause of the Regulations, within any division, shall not exceed five thousand acres, and the minimum quantity, except in special cases approved by the Commissioner, shall be one hundred acres. Provided that not more than five applications shall be entertained from one person.
- (e) Not more than one sub-division with an area shall be included in any one application unless the subdivisions applied for adjoin and lie side by side and together form one complete block. The first year's instalment, as prescribed by Clause 101 of these Regulations, shall accompany each application.
- (f.) Upon the approval of the application by the Commissioner, a lease shall be issued for ten years.
- (g.) Within two years of the approval by the Commissioner, the lessee shall fence in the whole of the land on the surveyed boundaries, or, in special cases, as near thereto as shall by approved of by the Commissioner; the fence to be of the description prescribed by the interpretation clause of these Regulations. Provided that the Commissioner, on the application of the lessee, may grant an exception from fencing any part of the land which has frontage to a permanent river, creek, or other natural boundary held by the Commissioner to be sufficient.
- (h.) In the event of the required fencing not being completed at the end of two years, the land shall be forfeited to the Crown, together with any improvements existing upon it.
- (i.) At the expiration of the lease, or at any time after the issue of the lease, provided that the required fencing is in good order, and that an amount equal to the full purchase money has been expended on

the land in prescribed improvements, in addition to the cost of such fencing, and further provided the full purchase money has been paid, a Crown grant shall issue.

- (j.) If the required improvements and conditions have not been fulfilled at the end of the lease, or if at any time the annual instalment is not paid as required by these Regulations, the lease shall be forfeited, and shall thereupon revert to the Crown.
- (k.) If any lessee shall die or be declared a lunatic before the fulfilment of the prescribed conditions of fencing and improvement, his land may, with the approval of the Commissioner, be held by his representatives or their assigns, subject to the fulfilment by them of all unfulfilled conditions; but in trust for, and for the benefit of the persons rightfully entitled.

Schedules of the articles required, and printed forms of tender, may be had at the office of the Railway Storekeeper, Fremantle, where samples can be seen and all particulars obtained.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule (or for Separate tenders will be received for each schedule (or for classes under a schedule) but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article. Each sheet, and the whole of a schedule, or any class thereunder, must be signed. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be con-sidered the property of the Railway Department, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the con-tractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. tractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

The rates, extensions, and additions must be without erasure or discrepancy, otherwise the tender may be set aside and not entertained.

Security will be required either (1), by Bank deposit receipt in favor of the Commissioner of Railways; (2) by cash deposit; or (3) by the bond of two responsible persons for the due performance of the contract; as the tenderer may elect.

The security under the two first methods will be calculated at ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000; but on contracts exceeding £1,000 the security will be calculated at ten per cent. up to £1000, and five per cent. on the amount over such sum.

In the event of the security by bond being selected, the tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures, duly witnessed, of the tenderer and of two responsible per-sons (to be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Railways) willing to become bound for the due fulfil-ment of the contract, in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the contract calculated for the whole period over which it extends.

Every tender must be accompanied by a deposit receipt for a sum equal to five per cent. of the annual amount for

which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service, but in no case will the deposit be required to exceed £100. The money to be lodged in a bank in the name and to the The money to be lodged in a bank in the name and to the credit of the Commissioner of Railways, and to be ab-solutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the security or bond to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Railways within fourteen days of the date of notice being received by the tenderer of the acceptance of his tender. The deposit will be returned to the successful tenderers on their security or bond being completed, and to unsuccessful tenderers on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The whole of the Articles in the foregoing schedules, required for the service of the Government Railways of Western Australia, are to be strictly in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture—subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Railways, the General to the approval of the Commissioner of Railways, the General Manager of Railways, Locomotive Superintendent, and the Railway Storekeeper. The goods will be subject to the examination and test of an inspecting officer appointed by any of the above. The Commissioner of Railways (herein-after called "The Commissioner," which shall also mean his Deputy or Appointee), will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Commissioner may order from the contractor from time to time; neither will the Commis-sioner be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than the orders which have been issued during the period of contract, viz., from 1st been issued during the period of contract, viz., from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1892, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should schedules for which orders have not been source. the Commissioner require a larger supply of any article there the quantity stated in the schedules, or should than the quantity stated in the schedules, or should articles of a particular manufacture be ordered, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

All orders for articles required under these contracts will be issued by the Commissioner, the General Manager, and the Railway Storekeeper, or such officers as they may appoint, and contractors will be required to forward the goods in such quantities and to such places as the orders specify, but the department will carry the goods free from any stations on the Railway named on tenders, provided they are properly addressed to the officer who is to receive them, marked "O.H.M.S.," and accompanied by the departmental consignment note. Delivery will not be taken until the goods have been received and accepted by the receiving officer named on the order.

Each separate order must be completed and the articles included therein delivered at the Railway Store or station whence they are to be forwarded within forty-eight hours after its receipt by the contractor, failing which the articles may be procured elsewhere at his risk, and any expense incurred by the department over and above the contract price deducted from his account.

4. Each delivery of goods must be accompanied by invoice, together with the departmental order.

5. The Commissioner, General Manager, Locomotive Superintendent, and Railway Storekeeper, or such inspect-ing officer as they may appoint, will have full power to reject any goods which in their opinion are not in accord-ance with contract, and the contractor, on receipt of rejec-tion notice, must remove such articles immediately, and supply others in their stead, failing which they will be procured elsewhere, and any expense incurred will be

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deducted from contractor's account. Contractors will be required to pay the ordinary carriage both ways upon all rejected goods.

6. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Commissioner may direct. It will also be in the power of the Commissioner, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

7. In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract may, in the case of the security being in money, be cancelled, and the security money will be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages for breach of contract. Should the security be by bond, the contract may either be declared to be cancelled, or the bond be enforced, as the Commissioner may elect.

8. The contractors in all cases will be liable for any expense which may be incurred by the Government in consequence of the non-performance of their contracts.

9. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly on the prescribed form, including all purchases to the 22nd of each month, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper, on the 23rd of each month, for certification previously to payment at the Treasury.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of a power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Commissioner.

11. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the manufacture or importation by the Commissioner of any of the articles for the use of the Railway Department, or by the purchase of any of the articles manufactured in the Penal or other Government establishments, or by other contracts made by the said Commissioner.
