**W**HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; NOW THEREFORE I, SIR FREDERICK NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on FRIDAY, THE TWENTY-FIFTH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

TENDERS (endorsed "Tender for [as the case may be] Mail") will be received at this office until noon of the 27th of November, 1889, for the conveyance of the undermentioned Mails, for one, two, or three years, viz. :—

1. From the General Post Office to Perth Railway Station, and *vice versa*, 10 times daily, or oftener if required, in a spring vehicle.
2. From Geraldton to Moorarrie, and *vice versa*, *via* Yuin, Murgoo, Yalgoo, Kally, Nookawarra, and Berringarra, and from Murgoo to Gullawa, and *vice versa*, *via* Mount Wittenoom, Meka, and Warra Warra, once in every four weeks, on horseback.
3. The same service with the following addition:—From Murgoo to Annean, *via* Mount Wittenoom, Willarra, and Coodardie, and thence to Gullawa, *via* Warra Warra, returning to Murgoo, *via* Warra Warra, Meka, and Mount Wittenoom, once every four weeks, on horseback.
4. The same services (Nos. 2 and 3), but performing that portion between Geraldton and Nookawarra in a spring vehicle.
5. From Carnarvon to Williamsberry, and *vice versa*, receiving and delivering letters, &c., at the various homesteads *en route*, once every four weeks, on horseback.
6. From Carnarvon to Minginoo, and *vice versa*, receiving and delivering letters, &c., at the various homesteads *en route*, once every four weeks, in a spring vehicle.

7. From Arthur River to Wagin, once a week, in a spring vehicle.
8. From Perth to Wanneroo, and *vice versa*, calling at the various homesteads to receive and deliver letters, &c., once a week, on horseback.
9. From Bunbury to Hampden, and *vice versa*, *via* Australind, Rosamel, Parkfield, Spring Hill, Runnymede, Myalup, and the homesteads of Messrs. Piggott and Perrin, on Long Swamp, once a week, on horseback.
10. The same service, but commencing at Australind instead of Bunbury.
11. Between the Jarrahdale Post Office and the Crossing at Cockram's, on the Bunbury Road, once a week, on horseback.
12. For the conveyance of Mails, when required, in a steam launch, from the Albany Town Jetty to the steamers of the Peninsular and Oriental and Orient Steam Navigation Companies, and from the said steamers to the said Town Jetty.
13. From Newcastle to Southern Cross, *via* Goomalling, once a fortnight, on horseback.
14. Tenders will also be received for:—

(a.) The supply of two spring vehicles, with drivers, as often as required, for the delivery of newspapers, &c., in Perth, on the arrival of the English and Inter-colonial Mails.

(b.) The supply of one spring vehicle, with driver, when required, for the clearance of the Letter Receivers throughout the City.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alterations at any time during the year.

Every Tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures, duly witnessed, of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the due fulfilment of the Contract, in a sum not exceeding the gross amount of the Contract for the whole period over which it extends.

Every Tender must be accompanied by the written consent, duly witnessed, of persons proposed as bondsmen as hereinbefore provided, to execute the bonds as aforesaid for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of such Tender being accepted.

When mails are conveyed in wheeled vehicles, a free passage must be provided for any officer of the Postal and Telegraph Department travelling on duty.

The Government reserves the right of terminating the Contract at any time, by giving three months notice to the Contractor.

Special forms of Tender, with conditions attached, may be obtained on application to the various Postmasters, and at the General Post Office, Perth; and no Tender will be entertained unless rendered on the prescribed form.

6. Preference to be given to bonded goods so that none of such goods remain on the Jetties after 3 p.m. on all days except Saturdays, when they must be removed by noon.

"That a road one chain wide be declared to start from where the present road cuts Swan Location 22 at South corner, thence through the Commonage in a due South direction to Location 28, then along the North-East boundary of Location 28 till it joins the surveyed line of road to Canning. The exact route of this road to be defined by the Officer who may be appointed to survey the line."
