HEREAS by divers Acts of the Imperial Legislature, it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia, for the time being, to fix such place within any part of the said Colony, and such time for holding every Session of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, as he may think fit; Now therefore I, Sir Frederick NAPIER BROOME, K.C.M.G., being Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so in me vested, do hereby announce and proclaim that a Session of THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA shall commence and be holden for despatch of business on Friday, the Twenty-fifth day of OCTOBER INSTANT, at the hour of THREE o'clock in the AFTERNOON, in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the same time and place accordingly.

IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following amended Rules, which have been approved for the conduct of the Examination for the Government University Exhibition.

The Rules published in the Government Gazette of the 11th March, 1886, are hereby rescinded.

Government University Exhibition.

CONDITIONS AND RULES.

- 1. An Exhibition, to be held at any one of the Universities hereinafter mentioned, shall be open for competition to any boy between the ages of 16 and 18 years, whose parents, or either of them, shall be bona fide residents in the Colony of Western Australia, and who himself shall have been a resident therein for a period of 3 years at least previous to the holding of the Examination provided for by these Rules.
- 2. The said Exhibition shall be tenable for a period of 3 years, and shall be of the value of £100 for each of the said 3 years.
- 3. All competitors for the said Exhibition shall pass an examination to be held in Perth by 2 examiners appointed by the Governors of the High
- 4. The Examination shall be held during the month of May in each year, and shall comprise the following subjects, viz.:-
 - 1. Arithmetic: all.
 - 2. Algebra: including quadratic equations.
 - 3. Trigonometry: including solution of tri-
 - 4. Euclid: Books I., II., and III., and riders thereon.
 - Virgil, either Books I., II., III. of the 5. \(\frac{\pi}{\pi}\) \(\frac{\text{Wirgil, either Bool}}{\pi}\) \(\frac{\text{Eneid, or the}}{\text{Livy: Book XXI.}}\) Æneid, or the four Georgics.

 - 7. Greek: Homer's Iliad, Books I., II., and III.
 - 8. French: Fénelon's Télémaque.
 - 9. English Composition and Modern Geography.
 - 10. Outlines of English, Greek, and Roman History.
- 5. Every competitor shall give to the Secretary of the said Board at least one month's notice of his intention to compete at such Examination, and, together with such notice, shall forward
 - (a.) A certificate attesting his good character and repute.
 - (b.) A certificate of the date of his birth.
 - (c). Proof of residential qualifications.
- 6. In the case of competitors from any school, the certificate (a.) shall be signed by the Head Master; in all other cases such certificate shall be signed by the clergyman, priest, or minister of the religious denomination to which such competitor shall belong, and of the district in which such competitor shall be residing, or by the Resident Magistrate of that district.
- 7. The said examiners shall within a reasonable time, and without previous communication to any other person, report to the Board the result of such examination, showing the marks obtained by each candidate in each subject; and the Governors shall proceed to adjudicate thereon, and shall award or withhold the Exhibition accordingly, submitting their decision to the Governor, which decision shall,

on the approval of His Excellency, be notified in the Government Gazette.

- 8. The Exhibition shall be held under the following conditions, viz.:-
- (a.) The Exhibitioner shall, within 12 months of the Gazette notice, obtain admission as a resident at one of the following Universities, viz.:—Oxford, Cambridge, London, Dublin, Sydney, Melbourne, ${f A}$ delaide.
- (b.) He shall begin residence at the University as soon as the regulations thereat shall allow.
- 9. The holder of the Exhibition shall be entitled to receive the said sum of £100 by half-yearly instalments, so long as he shall continue in residence at such University, subject to the production of such certificates or other evidence as the Governors may from time to time direct.
- 10. The Board of Governors of the High School may from time to time, with the approval of the Governor, revoke, add to, or amend these rules.

g REEF AND 6-FATHOM SHOAL, ABREAST CAPE FLATTERY.

THE following information respecting the position of g Reef, abreast Cape Flattery, has been supplied by Lieutenant Pirie, R.N., commanding H.M.S. surveying vessel "Paluma":—

 $\underline{\alpha}$ Reef is 4 cables long, East and West, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables wide. It is steep to all round, and has a small sandbank near its West extreme, which dries 6 feet at low-water springs.

From the sandbank Cape Flattery bears N. 83° W. 13.3

As marked on the chart, g Reef does not exist.

Also,-

A Coral Shoal, with 6 fathoms of water over it at low water, lying to the N.E. of the Two Isles. It is about 8 cables long N.E. and S.W., and from its shoalest part Cape Flattery bears N. 76° W. 7.65 miles.

SHOAL OFF POINT LOOKOUT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Shoal ground to the Northwards of Point Lookout, having been examined by Lieutenant G. C. Frederick, R.N., Commanding H.M. surveying ship "Dart," a Shoal Patch, with 1 fathom at low-water springs, has been found to lie N. 45° W. 2 miles from the summit of the Point.

This patch is steep to on the North-eastern side, dropping suddenly from 2 to 7 fathoms, while to the North-westward the water deepens more gradually.

The Beacon upon No. 1 Reef (sand), in line with the summit of Cape Flattery S. 38° E. leads clear to the Eastward of the shoal ground; while Round Hill on with the "End of Range" S. 82°½ W. passes 4 cables North of the Spit.

IIIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve the following By-Laws passed by the Roebourne Commonage Board, relative to the depasturing of Cattle, Sheep, &c., on the Commonage lands.

JOHN FORREST,

Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. That the sum of (20s.) twenty shillings per head, per annum, be charged for all horses and cattle up to (12) twelve head running on the Commonage, and (30s.) thirty shillings per head per annum if they exceed that number; the total number allowed not to be over (20) twenty head, the property of one owner.

That sheep kept for killing purposes to be paid for at the rate of (3d.) three pence per head per annum, and sheep kept for other than killing purposes at the rate of (2s.) two shillings per head per annum; butchers to be allowed to run not exceeding (200) two hundred sheep for killing purposes, private houses or firms not exceeding (50) fifty head

That goats be charged for at the rate of (5s.) five shillings per head, per annum, and that no person be allowed to run more than (12) twelve head.

- 2. That it shall be compulsory for all and every owner of stock situated within the Roebourne Municipality or Commonage, and making use of the Commonage, to give a correct list of horses, cattle, sheep, goats or any other stock he or they intend running during the year, and to obtain from the Council, or the lessee of the Commonage, a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 3. That no stock be kept on the Commonage unless the property of persons residing within the bounds of the Roebourne Municipality or Commonage.
- 4. That all arrears in respect of Commonage remaining unpaid for three months after they have become due, shall be sued for by the Council in the Local Court.
- 5. All fees and fines recovered shall be for and on account of the Roebourne Municipality.
- 6. That the only persons exempt from these rules shall be bonâ fide drovers, travelling stock, and teams or packers travelling; drovers to be allowed to remain free of charge on the Commonage for not exceeding (24) twenty-four hours, and teams or packers (48) forty-eight hours.

Should they remain over and above the time allowed, they are liable to be charged (5s.) five shillings per head, per week, for Horses and Cattle, and threepence per head, per week, for Sheep.

- 7. That any person running stock on the Commonage may change them at any time irrespective of brands, so long as such person does not exceed the number for which he pays.
- 8. That stray stock from adjoining runs, if proved to be accidentally upon the Commonage, shall be liable only to Poundage and Trespass Fees if at once removed.
- 9. That no entire horse or bull, except the property of the Municipality, be allowed on the Commonage.

T is hereby notified, for public information, that under the provisions of Clause 8 of the Land Regulations, "all applications for land shall take "priority according to the order of their being "lodged with the Commissioner at the Land and "Survey Office, Perth."

- 2. Applicants who are unable to make their applications personally, owing to distance from Perth or any other cause, can do so by post, forwarding a description of the land required, with the necessary rent; and such applications will "take priority ac-"cording to the order of their being lodged with the "Commissioner at the Land and Survey Office, "Perth."
- 3. Applicants who wish to make their applications by telegraph must do so through their agents in Perth, who must lodge their applications with the Commissioner, with the necessary rent.
- 4. Applications which are not accompanied with the necessary rent cannot be considered, and have no priority.
- 5. Applications can be made, as heretofore, at the various Resident Magistrates' courts in the Colony, where all information regarding land can be obtained. The applications and rent will be received by the Resident Magistrates and forwarded to the Commissioner of Crown Lands; but it must be clearly understood that such applications will have no force or effect, or have any right of priority, until they have been received at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, as provided by Clause 8 of the Land Regulations.
- 6. Applications will be received at the Land and Survey Office, Perth, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., and on Saturday between 9 a.m. and noon.

IS Excellency the Governor, under the powers conferred upon him by the Land Regulations, has been pleased to set apart, as a Stock route and Commonage for travellers and stock, the land as herein described, viz.:—

When Beef is issued, fore and hind quarters, or portions thereof, are to be delivered alternately; six inches at least to be cut off the hough and neck bones. Mutton to be delivered in carcasses, excluding heads, necks, shanks below the knee, and hough joints.

The Government reserves the right to cancel the contract for Meat at the end of March, 1890.
