HEREAS by a Proclamation duly made on the 15th day of October, 1885, a close time was declared for certain Birds therein named in a certain district therein mentioned; AND WHEREAS it is expedient to extend the close time for certain Birds in certain parts of the Colony: Now THERE-FORE I, the said Governor, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that within all that portion of the said Colony bounded on the west and south by the sea coast, including the Islands adjacent to it, on the north by the Murchison River, on the east by a line from Bompas Hill in the Great Northern bend of the Murchison River, through Wongan Hills and Mount Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River, and including a strip of land five miles wide along the south coast, the close time for Swans shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, November, and December; and the close time for the following birds:-

The various kinds of Wild Duck and Teal, and Rottnest Snipe,

Emu, Gnou,

Bustard, Quail,

shall be for and during the months of July, August, September, October, and November.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT.

Minutes of a Preliminary Court of Inquiry held at the Court House, Fremantle, on Thursday, the 24th October, 1889, before Leonard Worsley Clifton, Esq., Collector of Customs, and Robert Fairbairn, Esq., Justice of the Peace, under the provisions of the Local Ordinances, 28th Vict., No. 2, and 51st Vict., No. 6, to inquire into the circumstances attending a casualty that happened to the British s.s. "Maid of Lincoln," of 26 net tons, and owned by Messrs. Symon, Hammond, & Hubble, and commanded by Henry Daws, while lying in the South Bay, at Fremantle, on Saturday morning, the 19th October, 1889.

The Court having appointed Mr. William Owston, Master Mariner, the number of whose certificate of service is 75647, proceeded in his presence to take the following evidence:—

Henry Daws states: I am Master of the steamship "Maid of Lincoln." I hold a 2nd Mate's Certificate from the Board of Trade, London, 010425.

On the morning of the 26th inst., I was lying in the South Bay, Fremantle. I was not on board the steamer at the time of the casualty. I knew nothing as to the casualty except what I have been told.

The vessel was empty at the time. The weather was fine. In fine weather I generally sleep ashore. One man lives on board; there was a man on board that morning. I cannot say whether the vessel is insured. About 5:30 on the 19th I was at my house, when I heard the whistle on board. I went on board about 6:10 a.m.

The "Maid of Lincoln" is now used as a lighter, having a Collector's License.

My owners are aware of the arrangement as to my sleeping on shore. As master I have control over the internal management of the engine room.

H. Daws.

Frank Thomas states: I am Engineer on board the "Maid of Lincoln." I hold no certificate. I have never passed an examination. I slept ashore on the night of the 25th inst.

I went on board the vessel about 5.45 on the morning of the 19th. As I was leaving home I heard the steamer's whistle. As soon as I got on board I could see there had been a fire on the starboard side of the ship; some of the woodwork was burnt. The fire had been put out before I got on board.

I left the vessel between 5 and 6 p.m. on the 18th. When I left, the fires were banked.

Before I left the ship I instructed Ross to come ashore or me at the usual time. When I left, the lamp was not for me at the usual time.

The man would only require to go down and during the night to look at the fires. I cannot say what hour the lamp was lighted, the lamp was trimmed with kerosene.

I understand the meaning of 125 and 150 test. It means that if the kerosene is placed in 150 or 125 it will not explode when a match is applied. I do not keep a thermometer on board to register the heat of the engine

I think the test of the oil was 125, but I am not certain The lamp must have exploded; taking it at the lowest test there must have been 125 degrees of heat in the lamp.

I cannot give any reason for the explosion.

When I got on board in the morning I found about 46 lbs. of steam.

F. THOMAS.

Edwin Ross: I am an A.B. on board the "Maid of Lincoln." I slept on board on the night of the 18th inst. Lincoln." I slept on board on the night of the 18th inst. Thomas left the vessel for the shore between 5 and 6; I was left in charge; the fires were banked. I lit the lamp in the engine room about 4:30 on the morning of the 19th inst.

I did not enter the engine room during the night before; I went to light the lamp.

I saw nothing wrong in the engine room at this time.

About 5 o'clock I left the steamer for the shore; about 5.45 I was in High Street when I heard the sound of the steamer's whistle. I went to the jetty. I then saw flames bursting from the skylights of the steamer. When I got on board I could see that the fire had started from the lamp, which was lying on the floor of the engine room. I found that the fire had done a great deal of damage; the bench was destroyed. We have not always used kerosene oil in the engine room. I had not noticed kerosene oil before the night of the 18th inst. I lit the lamp at 4.30 because I could not see in the engine room. I saw no sign of fire before I left the vessel.

EDWIN Ross.

William Miller states: I am a Master Mariner. On the morning of the 19th inst., about 5.30, I was on the Jetty morning of the 19th inst., about 5'30, I was on the Jetty with Capt. Theakston, when I was attracted by the sound of a whistle on board the "Maid of Lincoln." I could see a man on board in the forehead. I then noticed fire coming through the skylight from the engine room. We got a boat and went on board. I saw that the tarpaulin was alight. This tarpaulin was thrown overboard by Capt. Theakston. The skylight was on fire. We put out the fire

Before we got the fire out, Ross came on board. I saw some cotton waste on fire on the bench in the engine room. There was no one on board when I got there. Some person must have come from the "Rescue" to sound the whistle, but there was no one on the steamer when I got on board.

There was a good sized bunch of waste on the bench. The lamp was lying on the floor of the engine room, and broken to pieces.

Edward Dounham states: I remember the morning of the Edward Dounham states: I remember the morning of the 19th inst. I was called on duty by the engineer about 5:30, he asked if I thought it was smoke coming from the "Maid of Lincoln." Sweeny, the Master, then came on deck and told me to board the "Lincoln," and see if a man named Ross was on board. I went on board. I could not go below on account of the smoke. I called out, but got no answer. I saw no one on board. I went forehead and started the whistle. I did not put out the fire because the started the whistle. I did not put out the fire because the men on board my vessel were calling me to come back. I went back to the "Rescue" without putting out the fire. The Master of the "Rescue" did not take any steps to put out the fire, he did not give any instructions as to the fire. I could see a large fire coming out of the skylight. The tarpaulin was on fire, the tarpaulin was lying over the skylight.

FINDING OF THE COURT.

Read in Open Court.

After carefully taking into consideration the evidence in After carefully taking into consideration the evidence in this case, we are of opinion that the casualty that occurred on board the s.s. "Maid of Lincoln," while lying at anchor in the South Bay, Fremantle, on the morning of the 19th October, 1889, arose through the bursting of a kerosene lamp left carelessly burning in the engine room (where the fires were banked) by Edwin Ross, A.B., whilst proceeding on shore for the one given who was not on board during the night. As no certificated person can be blamed, by virtue of the powers granted to us under the Local Ordinance 51st Vict., No. 6, Sec. 2, Sub-Sec. c. we agree that there is no case for further investigation, and therefore all proceedings then leaves and determine in this case. fore all proceedings shall cease and determine in this case.

We are of opinion that kerosene should not have been burnt in the engine-room by the master or engineer; the accident was occasioned through the ignorance of the danger in over-heating mineral oil.

We are of opinion that the owners of vessels lying in harbor who allow their servants to leave their vessels in-sufficiently protected at night are to blame, as shown in this and a like casualty that happened to the s.s. "Dolphin" recently.

We are of opinion that an unskilled night watchman is not a sufficient protection to a steamer with fires lighted, although banked up or recently drawn.
