**H**IS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations for the Management of the New Jetty at Fremantle, made under the provisions of the third section of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878," by the Governor in Executive Council, which Regulations come into force from and after this publication thereof:—

I. All steamers and sailing vessels, before coming alongside the new Jetty at Fremantle for the purpose of taking in or discharging cargo, are required to let go an anchor in a suitable position for relieving the Jetty of as much weight as possible by keeping a strain upon their cable.

II. When there is no buoy in a suitable position, any steamer or sailing vessel lying alongside the Jetty shall, if called upon by the Harbor Master to do so, lay out a kedge anchor and keep a warp fast to it from the vessel's quarter, for the same purpose.

## FINDING OF THE COURT.

*Read in the presence and hearing of L. Z. Coriton, master of the French barque "Aristide."*

We find—

1. That the stranding of the vessel was caused by both cables parting in a heavy W.S.W. gale.
2. That the master and officers are not in any way to blame for the casualty.
3. That every precaution appears to have been taken by the master to prevent the stranding and wreck of the vessel.

We, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in us under Sec. 2 and Sub-sec. c. of the 51st Vic., No. 6, agree that there is no case for further investigation, and that all proceedings shall now cease and determine.

Minutes of a Preliminary Court of Inquiry held under the provisions of the 25 Vic., No. 2, and 51 Vic., No. 6, at the Hamlin, this 29th day of October, 1889, before Robert J. Lepper, Esq., Sub-Collector of Customs, and Joseph Cookworthy, Esq., Justice of the Peace, to inquire into the circumstances attending the stranding on the beach at Port Hamlin, on the morning of the 25th inst., of the French barque "Aristide," Official No. 2858 of Nantes, 399 tons burden, commanded by Louis Zachair Coriton.

The Court having appointed William Moore, Master Mariner, the number of whose certificate of competency from the Board of Trade is 23736, as Nautical Assessor, proceeded to take the following statement in the presence of L. Z. Coriton.

*L. Z. Coriton* states: I arrived here (Hamlin Bay) from Fremantle, on the 17th, in ballast, and anchored by Mr. Davies' pilot's instructions in 7 fathoms of water, with Prah Island and Point marked 58 on the chart in a line. I discharged some ballast and had taken two lighter loads (about 20 loads, 30 tons timber) in. At 6 o'clock in the evening of the 24th, the weather threatening from the N.W., and barometer falling, I took every possible means to ensure the vessel's safety, by sending down the gallant yards, paying out 150 fathoms of chain on the starboard, and 100 on the port cable, placing a heavy 18" hawser, supplied by Mr. Davies, on the starboard, as a spring, from the main mast, and also a spring on the port cable.

The anchors down weighed about 22 cwt. each. I had another large bower anchor ready, weighing about 24 cwt. At 10 o'clock the squalls increased to hurricane force, and the wind shifted to W.S.W.; my port cable parted.

I immediately bent the cable remaining on deck (about 30 fathom) on to the spare anchor, and let it go, but in the meantime putting out the stream anchor, bent on to a 9" tow rope (Europe rope), and paying it out as I found the vessel dragged, which she did between 12 and 1, when the squalls were furious, and the barometer still falling. At 2 o'clock we dragged past the bq. "Mentone," and shortly after the hawser of the stream anchor parted; the vessel continued to drag the 2 heavy anchors until about 3:30, when her stern reached close to the breakers on the beach; she held there some time (15 or 20 minutes) when she again dragged, and striking heavily, almost immediately came broadside on to the beach, deck falling to sea. The crew just had time to get over the bulwarks on to the vessel's side. About 4:30 the mate tried to get a line to the shore in the dingy but failed, the dingy capsizing, and he with difficulty reached the shore. One of the boys (Fortune Morjan) then tried to swim with the line, but had to let go; he reached the shore safely. At daylight a boat brought a line from the shore, and the crew were saved by this means. The vessel commenced to break up about 5:30, and by 8 a.m. she was completely broken up. Nothing belonging to the crew or myself has been saved.

*Examined by Nautical Assessor.*

I feel confident that the starboard cable did not part when the vessel brought up at 3:30.

She drifted broadside on to the beach. One of the cables was new, the other in good order. I overlook them yearly. They were 35 millimetres in diameter (one and a half inch). I did not set any sail, being in hopes that the anchors would hold. My vessel was surveyed in July last, and the anchors and chains passed as being in good order.

I have lost my certificate with all my effects; it was a first class certificate.

L. Z. CORITON.

*Pierre Marie Le Robellie*, Mate, no certificate, states: On the night of the 24th inst., the barometer was falling, the Captain gave me orders to slack chain. I paid out about 100 fathoms on the starboard. The port had about 75. The whole of the chain was paid out on the starboard (150 fathoms), and both cables were assisted by springs. When the port chain parted I fastened the heavy anchor to the cable still on deck (we could not recover any) and let it go, previously putting out the stream anchor bent on to a heavy hawser.

When the ship struck both chains were straight out, but I cannot say whether the starboard had parted or not.

LE ROBELLIE.

*Jean Baptiste Le Roujie*, Second Mate, states: On the night of the 24th inst., the weather was very rough (heavy squalls with rain and hail from W.S.W. to S.S.W.) The Captain gave orders in the evening to slacken chain and put springs on. The starboard had 150 fathoms and a spring to the main mast. The port 100 with a spring to the bitts. Shortly after the port chain parted the vessel dragged. The stream anchor was made fast to a heavy tow-rope, and let go. Meanwhile, a heavy spare bower anchor was shackled on to the chain on deck, and let go with about 30 fathoms of chain; the parted chain could not be recovered. The anchors held for some 15 or 20 minutes near the breakers. On striking the beach the ship fell over, deck to sea.

JEAN BAPTISTE LE ROUJIE.

*Herbert Davies* states: I have not seen the cables myself, but my pilot (James Nicholas) informed me, on the vessel's arrival, that he considered the chains too light for a vessel of her tonnage (400 tons). I therefore that evening sent off a coir rope spring.

I have visited the wreck this morning, together with Captain Nielson of the barque "Mentone;" and we examined all round by the aid of a water glass. We found one anchor with about 16 fathoms of chains attached. We traced the starboard chain out to the end, but could not find the anchor. On our return to the jetty, we found a buoy with a portion of the port chain attached.

HERBERT DAVIES.

*James Nicholas* states: I am in Mr. Davies's employ, as Pilot for this Port. I boarded the "Aristide," on the 17th inst., and anchored in about 6½ fathoms, on the spot now indicated on the chart. I did not take bearings. She was anchored with the starboard anchor, and I noticed that the cable was too small for a vessel of her tonnage, and I moored her so that in the event of her drifting with either a N.W. or a S.W. wind she would not foul the "Mentone."

I have been at sea about 30 years, and hold a master's certificate.

I consider the ground in the bay where I anchored the "Aristide" to be good holding ground. I have seen 2 flukes lost there in merely lifting anchors.

I believe both the "Aristide's" cables parted.

JAMES NICHOLAS.

Alfred Nielson, Master of the Norwegian barque "Mentone": On the morning of the 25th inst. I saw the French barque "Aristide" drifting towards the beach. She passed my vessel about 4 a.m. She was drifting at the rate of about 1 mile an hour, broadside on. At about 5 o'clock I saw her on the beach. I consider the vessel was not dragging her anchors, that the cables had parted.

I went over to the wreck with Mr. Davies to look for the anchors. We saw one attached to about 17 fathoms of chain. We traced the other cable for some distance and found the end. No anchor on it.

The chains were lighter than vessels of the "Aristide's" tonnage would carry in my country.
