HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following Regulations for the Management of the New Jetty at Fremantle, made under the provisions of the third section of "The Jetties Regulation Act, 1878," by the Governor in Executive Council, which Regulations come into force from and after this publication thereof:—

I. All steamers and sailing vessels, before coming alongside the new Jetty at Fremantle for the purpose of taking in or discharging cargo, are required to let go an anchor in a suitable position for relieving the Jetty of as much weight as possible by keeping a strain upon their cable.

II. When there is no buoy in a suitable position, any steamer or sailing vessel lying alongside the Jetty shall, if called upon by the Harbor Master to do so, lay out a kedge anchor and keep a warp fast to it from the vessel's quarter, for the same purpose.
