M.R.B. 588/27. WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," it is enacted that the Governor may on the re-commendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any main road shall cease to be a main road; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of June, 1927, declared that the road described in Schedule I hereto shall be a main road; and whereas it is deemed expedient that that portion of the said road described in Schedule 2 hereto shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore I, the shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore 1, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that that portion of the Coolgardie-Esperance Road described in Schedule 2 hereto, heretofore declared to be a main road as aforesaid, shall cease to be a main road and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly.

Schedule 1.

Coolgardie-Esperance Road. (Esperance and Norseman Road Districts.)

A strip of land, one chain wide, commencing at the Jetty on the Eastern boundary of the Townsite of Esperance and continuing North-Easterly and North-Westerly along Roads Nos. 3787 and 3784, through the Road Board District of Esperance to the Townsite of Gibson; thence leaving Road No. 3784, and continuing North-Westerly and North-Easterly to the Townsite of Scaddan; thence North-Westerly, again joining and continuing along Road No. 3784; thence North-Easterly along Roads Nos. 4693 and 7007 to the railway line on

the East boundary of the Townsite of Grass Patch; thence along the Western side of railway line to the South boundary of and thence through the Norseman Road Board District generally North-Easterly to the South boundary of the Townsite of Norseman. (Plans 350/80, 371/80, 392/80, 402/80:)

Schedule 2.

Coolgardie-Esperance Road. (Esperance Road District.)

A strip of land, one chain wide, commencing at the junction of Road No. 3784 and the Northern boundary of Road No. 7980 at the South-West corner of Esperance Location 526; thence North-Westerly and North-Easterly along said Road No. 3784 to the junction with Road No. 4693; thence North-Easterly along said Road No. 4693 to Road No. 7265; thence North-Easterly, crossing said Road No. 7265 to its Eastern side; thence North-Easterly, passing through Locations 30 and 29 to the junction with Road No. 7007; thence along said Road No. 7007 to the Western side of a one-chain road adjacent to the Coolgardie-Esperance Railway Reserve, as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 847. WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," the Governor may on the recommendation of the Board declare by Proclamation that any road shall

be a main road: And whereas the Main Roads Board has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule hereto shall be a main road within the meaning of "The Main Roads Act, 1925," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.
