WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1781/30.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part, in the following manner:—(a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Twenty-first day of October, 1930, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 26, by excising those portions of such State Forest as are described in the Schedule hereto:—

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19.

Food and Drug Regulations, 1929—Amendments.

M.P.H. 1062/28; Ex. Co. No. 1016.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," His Excellency the Governor may make Regulations, and may repeal, alter, or amend any Regulations so made: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the advice of the Advisory Committee,

doth hereby make the following amendments of the Food and Drug Regulations, 1929:—

Regulation 44 is hereby repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:—

REGULATION 44.

(1) Confectionery is the product made from sugar, glucose, or other saccharine substances, with or without the addition of permitted colouring and harmless flavouring substances, and with or without other food substances, such as butter, wholesome edible fats, fresh eggs, milk, chocolate, nuts and fruits. It shall not contain any paraffin, resin, foreign mineral substance, nor any drug against which there is a restrictive law or regulation in force. It shall not contain more than one-half of one per cent. of alcohol, nor shall it contain any whole or crushed uncooked grain:

Provided that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be taken to prohibit the manufacture by confectioners of lozenges and the like which contain a drug concerning which any restrictive law or regulation is in force for wholesale supply to the order of a registered pharmacist.

(2) No person shall refill with confectionery for sale any once-used package which is made wholly or in part of wood, paper, cardboard, or the like absorbent material.

Labelling.

(3) There shall be written in the label attached to every package which contains confectionery medicated by the addition of any drug named or included in Regulation 72 the word **MEDICATED** in bold-faced sans-serif capital letters of not less than twelve points face measurement.

REGULATION 59A

Is amended by deleting the word "fifty" in the third line and inserting in lieu thereof the word "twenty-five."

REGULATION 61

Is amended by the additional paragraph as follows:—
Preservative.

(4) The preservative substance, benzoic acid in proportion not exceeding 3 and 5/10ths grains per pint, or sulphur dioxide in the proportion not exceeding 5/10ths grains per pint—one, but not both—may be added to summer or temperance drinks.

"(1.) By omitting Regulation (2) of the amending Regulations dated the 13th day of June, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the said 13th day of June, 1930.

(2.) By the addition of the following Regulation:—

The wages prescribed in pursuance of Section 128 (2) shall, from time to time, automatically become increased or decreased so that they may be in conformity to the basic wage as last determined by the Court."
