ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1781/30.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Twenty-first day of October, 1930, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 39, by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

THE INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1925.

In the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

In the matter of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in the matter of Part VII. of the said Act—Basic Wage.

The tenth day of June, 1931.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Part VII. of the above Act, the Court of Arbitration hereby determines and declares the basic wage to be paid to adult male and female workers shall be as follows:—

- (a) Adult males—The sum of £3 17s. 0d. (Three pounds seventeen shillings) per week;
- (b) Adult females—The sum of £2 1s. 8d. (Two pounds one shilling and eightpence) per week.

Provided that, in the Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State which is comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth, the basic wage to be paid to adult male and female workers shall be as follows:—

- (a) Adult males—The sum of £3 18s. 0d. (Three pounds eighteen shillings) per week;
- (b) Adult females—The sum of £2 2s. 2d. (Two pounds two shillings and twopence) per week;

payment being *pro rata* where the term of the employment is for less than one week.

These rates apply to unskilled workers.

NAREMBEEN DISTRICT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL
BY-LAWS.

M.P.H. 1348; Ex. Co. No. 1043.

1. The name of the Institution shall be the Narembreen District Memorial Hospital.

2. The object of the Institution shall be—to afford medical or surgical aid or midwifery attendance to all persons, as hereinafter provided.

Board of Management.

3. The Board of Management shall consist of nine members appointed by the Governor. They shall be selected by ballot in the month of July in each year, at the annual general meeting. Those entitled to vote shall be residents of the district over the age of twenty-one years. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-selection.

The Board of Management shall be responsible for the entire control of the Institution.

Annual General Meeting.

4. The financial year shall close on 30th June, and the annual general meeting of the public shall be held in the month of July. The chairman or secretary shall give notice of the annual general meeting at least fourteen clear days before the day of meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in one or more newspapers circulating in Narembreen and district. The order of business at such meetings shall be:—The report of the Board for the previous year; balance sheet; Medical Officer's report; receive nominations for Board; selection of new Board; election of auditors.

A copy of the balance sheet shall be published not less than seven days before the annual meeting.

Special General Meetings.

5. Special general meetings of the public may be called by the chairman or secretary, with the authority of the Board of Management, on requisition addressed to them and signed by at least ten residents. The same notice, stating the business to be transacted, shall be given as in the case of the annual general meeting.

Officers.

6. The Board shall, at their first meeting after appointment, elect one of their number to be chairman.

7. The chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board. In the absence of the chairman from any meeting, the members present may elect one of their number to be chairman for that meeting.

Auditors.

8. Two auditors shall be elected annually, one to be elected by the public at the annual meeting and one by the Board. The auditors shall audit the books every twelve months.

Board Vacancies.

9. The Board shall nominate persons for appointment by the Governor to fill any vacancies. It shall also fill any vacancies of chairman, secretary, treasurer, and auditor, or any other office which may become vacant.

Quorum.

10. A quorum of the Board shall be a majority of the members.

Order of Business at Board Meetings.

11. The order of business at Board meetings shall be:—Minutes of previous meeting, Correspondence, Accounts, Reports, General.

12. In the case of any member of the Board who is absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Board without having obtained leave of absence, the Board shall recommend to the Governor that the seat of such member shall be declared vacant as from the date such vacancy is gazetted.

Special Meetings of Board.

13. A special meeting of the Board may be called at any time or place, by the chairman or by the secretary, on requisition of three members in writing, and shall state the business proposed to be transacted.

Meetings of Board.

14. The Board shall meet on the second Tuesday in each month, unless otherwise arranged by the chairman,

Notice of Meeting.

15. Each member of the Board shall receive notice of such special meeting, which shall be posted at least five days previous to the day of meeting.

Visiting Committee.

16. At the first Board meeting in each financial year a Visiting Committee of three shall be appointed, one to retire each month and a new one to be appointed, according to roster.

Persons eligible for Selection to the Board.

17. Any permanent resident over the age of twenty-one years shall be qualified to stand for selection as a member of the Board, and must be nominated and seconded by a person qualified to vote at the annual general meeting.

Complaints from Public or Patients.

18. Complaints from the public or patients shall be made or taken in writing and lodged with the chairman of the Board or secretary, within fourteen days of the occurrence. Such complaints shall be dealt with by the Board, and their decision shall be final and binding on all parties. The Board may refuse to inquire into any complaint which is not lodged within the time specified.

19. No member of the Board, other than the Medical Officer, shall in any way interfere with the management of the hospital, unless acting under the instructions—

(a) of the Board;

(b) of the Chairman, who will report at the first meeting of the Board held thereafter; or

(c) a special committee called by reason of some urgent necessity, who will also report at first meeting of the Board held thereafter.

Patients.

20. All patients shall be examined by the Medical Officer before admission, except in cases of emergency. The admission of patients shall rest with the Medical Officer, or, in his absence, the matron or officer left in charge.

21. Patients shall have the privilege at any time of asking for and obtaining a consultation with one or more medical men, such consultation (if obtained at the request of the patient) shall be paid for by the patient or relatives, or guaranteed by same beforehand.

22. Should a patient be dangerously ill, the matron shall report such at once to the secretary, who shall immediately notify same to the friends or relatives of such patients, and should the patient desire that a clergyman be sent for, his or her wishes in that respect are to be immediately attended to. In the absence of the secretary, the matron shall have authority to act.

23. Meals shall be punctually observed as under:—Breakfast, 8 a.m.; dinner, 12.45 p.m.; tea, 5.30 p.m. The diet of each patient shall be strictly in accordance with the directions of the Medical Officer.

24. No intoxicating liquors of any kind shall be brought into the Hospital, except by direction of the Medical Officer or matron, nor shall patients receive any fruit or food from visitors, nor shall any fruit or food be brought into the wards without the sanction of the Medical Officer or matron.

25. No person suffering from insanity, delirium tremens, venereal diseases, chronic paralysis, infectious diseases, or any incurable disease will be admitted except in cases of emergency or special circumstances where local treatment is essential.

26. Patients shall punctually observe the directions of the Medical Officer, matron, or nurse in charge.

27. No patients shall be absent from the Hospital without the leave of the Medical Officer or matron.

28. Any person gambling, swearing, or using abusive language, or in any way behaving indecently in any part of the Hospital or grounds, or who shall fail to comply with these rules, shall be liable to discharge.

29. Patients are prohibited from giving money or any gratuity whatsoever to any person employed by the Board.

30. The charge for Hospital attendance and maintenance for patients shall be three guineas (£3 3s.) per week, or nine shillings (9s.) per day, with a minimum charge of one guinea (£1 1s.). The charge for maternity cases shall be four guineas (£4 4s.) per week. All drugs and dressings used by patients to be charged extra.

Medical Officer.

31. The Board may appoint a Medical Officer, who shall be a Registered Medical Practitioner. He shall have supreme authority under the Board in the management of the Hospital, as far as regards the admission and treatment of patients.

32. He shall visit the Hospital wards daily, at such times as may be necessary.

33. He shall carefully examine all drugs, chemicals, and surgical appliances brought into the Hospital, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defect in either to the Board.

34. He shall perform such operations as may be necessary and in his power for indigent persons, free of charge, but for surgical operations for paying patients he shall be entitled to make such charge as he may deem advisable, but such charge shall be a matter for settlement between himself and such patient, and shall not in any way be chargeable against the Hospital.

35. He shall be responsible for operations upon his patients, but in serious cases, if recommended by him, the Board shall endeavour to procure the necessary assistance, at the expense of the patient.

Matron.

36. The matron shall, subject to the instructions of the Medical Officer and the Board of Management, have full control of the Hospital and all things appertaining thereto, but this does not apply to the secretary. She shall report to the secretary any misbehaviour, neglect of duty, or disobedience of orders on the part of nurses or servants.

37. She shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution, the clothing of patients, the preparation and service of the meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of the patients. She shall take charge of all money and valuables and other property belonging to the patients, and hand same to the secretary and receive a receipt for same; see that the Report Books are entered up daily; and shall be responsible for the stores, and shall personally supervise their distribution. She shall appoint the nurses and servants to their respective duties, and see that all directions of the Medical Staff relating to patients are strictly carried out. She shall inspect each ward and its offices frequently during the day and occasionally at night; see that they are kept clean and in good order; that the meals are properly served and medicines regularly administered, and that no ward is left without a person in charge.

38. She shall, with the permission of the secretary, purchase anything urgently required.

39. She shall forward a monthly report to the secretary, to be laid before the Board, and shall furnish yearly, on 30th June a return of articles under her charge. She shall be responsible for the efficient and economical working of the Institution.

40. She shall have charge of the following books:—Patients' Property Book, Visitors' Book, Stimulants' Book, and Petty Cash Book. All tradesmen's detailed accounts are to be rendered to the matron by the fifth of each month and certified by her as being correct before forwarding to the secretary.

Nurses.

41. Every nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron, and take such day or night duties as the matron shall direct. Her conduct shall be quiet and orderly, and she shall not receive any visitors without the permission of the matron. All nurses shall reside on the premises if required.

Servants.

42. The cook, laundress, and other servants shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall faithfully execute all orders of the Medical Officer and matron, and be respectful and orderly in conduct.

Holiday Leave.

43. The matron shall be entitled to leave of absence not exceeding half a day per week and each alternate Sunday, but shall not leave the Institution unless performance of her duties has been duly provided for during her absence. She shall be entitled to three weeks' vacation on full pay for each year of service.

44. The matron may grant leave of absence to any nurse or servant not exceeding half a day per week and each alternate Sunday. Two weeks' vacation on full pay for each year of service will be granted to each nurse and servant.

Residential Rule.

45. No person other than the Hospital Staff or patients shall reside on the premises or have any meals there, without permission of the matron; nor shall any visitors to employees, under any circumstances, be permitted to remain after 11 o'clock p.m.

Secretary.

46. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital; attend all meetings of the Board and keep the minutes thereof, and see that, as far as is practicable, all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital; give receipts for all moneys paid to the Hospital, and pay same into the Hospital bank account within seven days of receipt. He shall control as secretary any efforts determined by the Board for the raising of funds. He shall report to the Board any matter which in his opinion requires attention. He shall present a copy of the rules to every employee who may be appointed immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature therefor, which he shall keep in the office.

Bank Account.

47. All payments shall be made by cheques drawn on the bank account and signed by any two of the following:—Chairman, Secretary, and one other member of the Board elected at the first meeting of each new

Ministers of Religion.

48. Ministers of religion shall have access to patients of their respective denominations at any time, but, prior to entering the ward, must obtain the matron's consent, and they shall leave the bedside at the request of the Medical Officer or Matron.

Visitors.

49. Visitors may be admitted daily between the hours of 3 and 5 p.m. Visitors at any other time will only be allowed by special permission of the Medical Officer or matron. All visitors must obey the directions of the Medical Officer, matron or nurse on duty. No visitor shall enter any ward without first obtaining permission from the Medical Officer, matron, or nurse in charge.

Alteration of Rules.

50. These rules and regulations shall not be altered, amended, cancelled, varied or added to except upon notice given in writing to the secretary, stating the proposed alteration, addition, or cancellation fourteen days before next monthly meeting. Such notice shall be submitted at next meeting of the Board.

General.

51. Patients who are able to do so may help in the duties of the Hospital or perform any other light work that the matron may require.

52. Before a patient leaves the Hospital all fees must be handed to the matron or secretary, or a satisfactory guarantee for payment of same left in the hands of the matron or secretary, except in genuinely indigent cases.

53. It shall be the duty of the Medical Officer to see to the general condition of the Hospital, and in case of neglect to report to the Board.

54. No domestic animal shall be permitted to reside at the Hospital or in the Hospital grounds.

55. The lights shall be extinguished in the wards at 9 p.m. and in the Staff quarters at 11 p.m., unless otherwise required by the matron.

- (2) Notice of the employer's intention to stand down a worker shall be given to the worker on the last day preceding the idle period.
- (3) Workers recalled for duty during the stand-down period shall be paid casual rates, as set out in Clause 4 of this Agreement.
- (4) The part-time principle shall, where possible, be applied in rotation to all workers.
- (5) When continuity of employment is broken under these provisions, holidays, as prescribed in Clause 8 of the said agreement, or pay in lieu, shall be reduced pro rata.

- (6) The provisions as to overtime contained in Clause 6 of this Agreement, and the worker's right to one week's notice, as provided in Clause 13 of this Agreement, in the event of his being dismissed from his employment, shall not be affected hereby.
- (7) This order shall not apply during any fortnight where the employer has in his employ a greater number of workers covered by this Agreement than at the date hereof.
- (8) The foregoing provisions may be continued from month to month after the said 16th July, 1931, by agreement between the parties, a memorandum of which, signed by or on behalf of the parties, shall be filed in the Court. In the event of the parties failing to agree, the matter may be referred to the Court.
