To The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Australia: Greeting:

KNOW Ye that I, the said Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you, the Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, a Judge of the Supreme Court of Western Aus-Dwyer, a Judge of the Supreme Court of western Australia, to be a Commissioner generally to investigate and report upon the transactions in Western Australia of Land and Homes (W.A.), Limited, a Company duly incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act, 1893, having its registered office and principal place of business situate at 75 Barrack Street, Perth, in the said State, and carrying on business as vendors of land and as land agents, and in particular without in any manner whatsoever limiting the generality of the power hereby conferred, to do all of the following things, namely:

1. To inquire into and report upon-

(a) The lands acquired by the Company and held by it for sale, and the lands not belonging to the Company but placed by the owners thereof with the Company for sale.

- (b) The manner in which lands belonging to the Company and held for sale were acquired by the Company, the amounts of the purchase price paid by, or the nature and value of any other consideration which passed from the Company upon the acquisition of such lands, the parties from whom the Company acquired such lands, and the terms and conditions contained in the contracts of sale (if any) whereunder the Company acquired such lands.
- (c) The amounts expended by the Company in subdividing and improving such land and in providing conveniences in respect of land and any expenditure by the Company on or in connection with such lands.

(d) The amounts of the purchase price and the nature of other consideration received or demanded by the Company in respect of the sale of lands owned by the Company and sold or offered by the Company for sale.
(e) The reasonableness or otherwise of the profits obtained or sought to be obtained by the Company upon sales of its own lands.
(f) The nature, terms, and conditions of the contracts of sale of land, whether owned by the Company or not, entered into between the Company as owner or as agent for the owner, and the purchasers of such land.
(g) Where contracts of sale of land are expressed to be

(g) Where contracts of sale of land are expressed to be made and entered into by the Company as agent for or on behalf of the owner of such land, whether, where, when, and in what manner such

owner has authorised or ratified such contract.
(h) The employment by the Company of canvasses, (h) The employment by the Company of canvassers, salesmen, and agents for or in connection with sales of land by or through the Company, and the qualifications of such persons, and the evidence thereof which the Company has required or requires before employing such persons.
(i) The nature, extent and particulars of the instructions and authority given by the Company to its officers, employees, and agents who are either directly or indirectly engaged in negotiating, arranging, or effecting sales of land.

(j) The persons by whom and the methods by which endeavours have been made and are being made to secure purchasers of land from or through the Company, and to effect sales of land to such purchasers.

(k) The persons who have been authorised and are now authorised to obtain the execution of contracts of sale of land by the purchasers there-of; and the places where contracts of sale are usually tendered to purchasers for execution by

such purchasers.

(1) The extent (if any) to which employees and agents of the Company are instructed and authorised by the Company to make any representations in relation to land offered by them for sale in an endeavour to secure purchasers of such land.

- (m) The extent (if any) to which the terms and conditions of the contracts of sale which have been entered into by purchasers of land from or through the Company, protect the Company from liability to such purchasers in respect of representations made to such purchasers by the officers, employees, or agents of the Company.
- To advise-
  - (a) Whether legislation is desirable or practicable making it an offence for vendors of subdivisional laud or their agents to make certain classes of statements which do not under existing law amount to misrepresentation and providing for the setting aside of agreements induced by such statements.
  - (b) Whether purchasers of subdivisional land should have special protection as regards their contracting to purchase and the fulfilment of their contracts.
  - (c) Whether the practice of selling land and clattels on time payment and the methods of persons engaged in such practice require any legislative interference or control, and if so what is the most practicable means of achiev ing such control.
  - (d) If you are of opinion that any purchasers from the Company have been treated by the Company

in an unfair and unconscionable manner, without however there being any legal redress available to them, whether any relief can properly be given to such persons.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Commission, constitute and be a Royal Commission within the meaning of the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act. 1902, as reprinted in the Appendix to the Sessional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and shall be approximately the power which under the have and may exercise all the powers which under the said Act are exercisable by a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof.

And I do hereby desire and request you, as soon as reasonably may be, to report to me in writing the result of your inquiries into and your advice upon the matters entrusted to you by this Commission.
