The Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1931.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency John Alfred North-TO WIT. State of Western Australia and its Administrator. Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of "The Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1931," it is provided that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation, but when proclaimed shall have effect from and including the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one: And whereas I, the said Administrator did, in pursuance of Section 1 of "The Australian States Constitution Act, 1907 (Imperial)," reserve the said Act for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure: And whereas His Majesty having by Order in Council made the 26th day of October, 1931, declared his assent to the said Act, it is expedient that the said Act should be proclaimed: Now, therefore I, the said Administrator, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, proclaim that "The Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1931," shall come into operation on the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows :-

General Order.

THE LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893. (Consolidation 1927.)

We, The Honourable John Alfred Northmore, Chief Justice of Western Australia, The Honourable Thomas Percy Draper and The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, and we the undersigned, being a majority of members of the Barristers' Board constituted and appointed under and in pursuance of "The Legal Practitioners Act, 1893" (Consolidated 1927), hereby amend the General Order made the 21st day of September, 1920, and gazetted on the 24th day of September, 1920 (whereby the totals of certain bills of costs for the remuneration of practitioners of the Supreme Court of muneration of practitioners of the Supreme Court of Western Australia in relation to the several matters therein mentioned were increased by twenty-five per centum) by adding the following proviso at the end thereof:

Provided that the total of such bills of costs as increased by this General Order shall be reduced by fifteen per centum. SUPREME COURT RULES, 1920.

Amendment of Rule 8a, Order LXV. 1916

The Honourable John Alfred Northmore, Chief Justice of Western Australia, The Honourable Thomas Percy Draper and The Honourable John Patrick Dwyer, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Ausrulia, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers contained in "The Supreme Court Act, 1880," and every other power enabling them in this behalf, amend Rule 8a of Order LXV. of the Supreme Court Rules, 1920, by adding the following proviso at the end thereof:-

RECLASSIFICATION, 1931.

THE Public Service Appeal Board referred the Reclassification back for revision, with a direction to omit from consideration the inability of the State to pay such remunerations as are found otherwise proper. This factor was assessed at 4 per cent. The basis of computation is therefore an increase on the classification at the rate of 4/90ths, worked out to the nearest multiple of 5. The addendum hereunder is now gazetted.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

Municipal Council of Collie-By-law No. 56.

P.W. 568/29.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of every municipality is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes of the said Act mentioned. It is therefore ordered by the Municipal Council of Collie that from and after the publication thereof in the Government Gazette, the following By-law shall be enforced within the Municipality of Collie, and that the existing By-law No. 56 shall and is hereby repealed:-

(1) The Public Pound for the Municipality of Collie shall be in the South-Eastern corner of Reserve No. 18379, on portion of the old Wallsend Mining Lease (Government Gazette, p. 2123, November 2nd, 1923).

- (2) If any cattle are found unattended within the Municipal District of Collie upon a street or public thoroughfare, or upon any land, public or pervate, not having a sufficient fence dividing such land from any street, or in any public park, recreation ground, or cemetery, any officer of the Council, police officer, or any person with the authority of the said Council, may seize the same and impound them, or place them at some neighbouring place of safe custody.
- (3) The owner of such cattle shall upon conviction before two justices be liable to a fine for each head of

cattle so seized for the amounts set forth in Section 5 hereof, and any two justices, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place or seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons, stating his name, had been effected, or, if such owner appear, then as in other cases; and the Justices may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses to be estimated and assessed by the Justices, or seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and, if not so demanded, then to the municipal rund; and, if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same talls short, or if no such sate be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner, if and when known, in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by Justices are to be recovered.

- (4) If such cattle, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the Council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any) or after the sale of the cattle, may be after the sale of the cattle. amount (if any) as, after the sale of the cattle, may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs which have been adjudged, after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs, adjudged by Justices, are by law to be recovered; and if, in the case of any information under this section, the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating Justices jurisdiction, shall apply.
