Additional Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 2nd February, 1937.

156/36.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under the above Act:—

And also, pursuant to Section 20 of the said Act, to amend the Second Schedule (Conditions relating to the receipt, handling, transport, and delivery of wheat) of that Act by inserting a further paragraph (d) at the end of Condition No. 2 in the Schedule:—

(d) Provided that, in respect of wheat coming within the description of Grade Western Australia No. 2 prescribed for the 1936-37 wheat season, the following shall be the scale of dockages. Such dockages shall be made from the ruling price from time to time for the particular wheat:—

59 lbs. and over but less than 60 lbs.—Nil 58 lbs. and over but less than 59 lbs.—1d. 57 lbs. and over but less than 58 lbs.—2d.

56 lbs. and over but less than 57 lbs.—3d. Dockages for barley, oats, drake, foreign grain, and hardball smut shall be on the same basis as in the preceding paragraph.

Pursuant to Section 41 of "The Bulk Haudling Act, 1935," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council hereby makes Regulations dealing with the receipt, handling and delivery of a grade of wheat to be styled "Grade Western Australian No. 2" and prescribes a standard for that grade, as follow:—

- 1. The company may receive wheat of the 1936-1937 wheat season which complies with the standard hereinafter specified.
- 2. All such wheat shall be handled separately from and binned separately from other wheat received by the company.
- 3. The following shall be a description of the standard:—
 - (a) Subject to the conditions stated hereunder, it will include wheat which is below the limits of variation allowed for other prescribed grades.
 - (b) The wheat shall be dry, free from weevils or other insects and free from smutty, musty or other commercially objectionable smell.
 - (c) The bushel weight of the grain as received by the company will be less than 60 lbs., with a limit of variation to 56 lbs.
- 4. The company shall issue a distinctive warrant for every parcel of wheat received of this grade so that the wheat can be clearly distinguished from other grades prescribed.
- 5. The form of warrant may be the same as that issued for Western Australian Standard White, except that it shall have a distinct statement at the head of the warrant that the warrant is issued in respect of Grade Western Australian No. 2 wheat, and shall be on a different coloured form from that used for the 1936-37 wheat season for Western Australian Standard White.
- 6. The dockages shall be as prescribed in the Act.
- 7. The company shall be entitled to make a charge to cover the actual cost of any extra railage reasonably incurred by reason of the special nature of the wheat; for example, by reason of the light weight of the wheat, trucks cannot be loaded to their full capacity in weight.
- 8. For extra services occasioned by special handling and binning of this grade of wheat the company shall be entitled to make an additional charge of ‡d. per bushel,

9. The company shall not be bound to accept wheat of this standard at any particular siding where there is not sufficient quantity of the wheat offering to justify the company economically in receiving the wheat:

Provided that any person aggrieved by reason of the refusal of the company to receive any wheat of this standard at any particular siding for reasons stated in this Regulation may appeal within four-teen days after such refusal to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

Corres. 2021/95. Perth, 2nd February, 1937. HIS Excellency the Licutenant-Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of the above Act, of the following By-laws for the Control and Management of the Mount Magnet Public Cemetery (Reserve 2944).

MOUNT MAGNET PUBLIC CEMETERY-BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Mt. Magnet Road Board as Trustees of the Mt. Magnet Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 2528, the said

Trustees make the following By-laws and all By-laws previously gazetted are hereby repealed:-

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- Any person desiring to inter any dead body in 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial as set forth in Schedule D.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for application within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours as above.
- 4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-
- 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the colfin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 8. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary in the form of Schedule C.
- The hours for burial shall be as follows:-On week days, September to April inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; on Studays, throughout the year, from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.
- The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 12. Children under the age of 14 years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.
- 13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.
- 16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws the superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specificaerection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the

Trustees may, when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the

Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assigns, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assigns shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monu-

ment, tombstone, or enclosure on any part of the Cemetery, or construct a brick grave or vault, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom

of the grave.
27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

- 29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of twenty shillings (20s.), which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
 - 31. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- Where any person desires to exhume any corpse from any grave in the Cemetery, pursuant to an order obtained from the Governor under Section 41 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," the following provisions shall apply and be observed, that is to say:—
 - (a) A written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representa-
 - tive of the deceased.

 (b) If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.
 - (c) Grave to be filled in and all rubbish removed.
- 33. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give, and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-
- 34. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:-
 - (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.

(c) The dressing of any graves, and the wheelin and carting of all material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

(d) Work in all eases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall apply to the Trustees for an annual permit, and shall at the time of making application give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem it fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

36. Any person committing any breach of these Bylaws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be pro-

ceeded against accordingly.

37. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a Register of all Certificates of Right of Burial, shall be kept at the office.

38. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.
