The Fisheries Act, 1905-21. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia lieutenant-Governor. [L.s.]

C.S.D. 691/33.
WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three years as from the 2nd day of March, 1937.

Harvey Weir:—The whole of the waters of the Harvey Weir.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

WHEREAS Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-35," and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927; the 20th day of October, 1933; the 5th day of October, 1934, and the 1st day of February, 1935: And whereas the Municipal Council of the City of Fremantle, being a Local Health Authority under the provisions of the said Act, did by resolution published in the Government Gazette on the 2nd day of August, 1935, adopt either wholly or part such Model By-laws to be its By-laws: And whereas by the provisions of the Act aforesaid a Local Health the provisions of the Act aforesaid a Local Health Authority may amend, repeal, or alter By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Municipal Council of the City of Fremantle, being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Fremantle, doth hereby amend such By-laws in the following manner:

Part VII., Clause 29:—Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) to be deleted and the following paragraphs to be inserted in lieu thereof:

(a) Every vehicle used in transport of meat (excepting butchers' delivery vehicles used for delivery of cut joints to householders, and vehicles used by the producer for the conveyance of carcase meat to the Fremantle Meat Market, Newman street) shall conform with the following. with the following:

The vehicle shall be completely enclosed so as to rotect the meat from the weather, and from the flies and dust.

The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or approved metal, and all internal surfaces shall be

The vehicle shall be properly ventilated.

The vehicle shall be provided with rails and hooks secured to the upper portion thereof, and shall be of ample proportions so that meat hung on such hooks shall be clear of the floor.

No meat (except edible offal) shall be placed on the floor of the vehicle.

Edible offal, when carried on the floor, shall be

contained in impervious containers.

The vehicle, edible offal containers, hooks and rails shall at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean condition.

- (b) No vehicle used for the transport of meat shall be used at any time for the transport of any offensive matter.
- (c) No meat shall be carried on any railway, except in trucks provided for that purpose, or unless such meat is hung on hooks and is clear of the floor,

(d) Any person engaged or employed in the transport or delivery of carcase meat shall at all times when so engaged wear a cap with a detachable covering made of durable washable material and an overall coat of durable washable material which shall completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such cap covering and overall to be kept at all times in a thoroughly clean condition.

(e) Butchers' delivery vehicles shall be completely en-

closed to protect the meat from weather, flies and dust.

The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or approved metal, and all internal portions finished to a smooth surface.

They shall be properly ventilated. The floor of such vehicles shall be constructed of or completely covered

with a smooth impervious metal.

(f) Butchers' cutting carts shall be constructed in a similar manner as specified for butchers' delivery carts, but shall be of ample dimensions to permit all carcase meat to be hung on hooks affixed to the roof of such vehicle. All carease meat shall be hung on such hooks in such manner that the meat is clear of the floor. Carcase meat in this clause shall mean any covertor or more protein this clause shall mean any covertor or more metal. case meat in this clause shall mean any quarter or more of any carcase.

(g) All carcase meat conveyed by producers to the Fremantle Meat Market, Newman street, shall be completely covered with clean canvas or other wrappings approved by the Chief Health Inspector of the Council, in such manner as thoroughly to protect such meat from

flies and dust.

(h) In this By-law the word "producer" shall mean a person or persons who delivers to the Fremantle Meat Market, Newman street, carcases of animals reared or

produced on his own farm or property.

This amendment shall, in relation to vehicles now used in transport of meat, come into operation on the Thirty-first day of December, 1938, provided that any new vehicle, whether in addition to or in replacement of any vehicle at present in use for this purpose, shall conform with these By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 16 of "The Health Act, 1911-1935," I, Everitt Atkinson, Commissioner of Public Health, do hereby make the following amendment to the Model By-laws as made by the Governor on the 8th day of April, 1927, under Section 295 of the said Act, and adopted by me with modifications on the 9th day of May, 1927, and published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of Tune 1927 to the intent that the contract of the said and the said and the said that the said of June, 1927, to the intent that such amendment shall be read as one with the By-laws so adopted by me. and shall take effect on publication in the Government

By-law No. 14, Clause (a) of Part IV. is rescinded and the following new clause inserted in lien thereof:-

It shall be at least ten (10) feet from any milking shed and have a clear open space of ten (10) feet on all sides, except at dairies where milking machines are in use.

At dairies where milking machines are in use the milk room may be permitted under the same roof as the milking shed providing the walls of the milk room are constructed of brick, stone, or The internal surfaces of the walls and ceiling, or, if there is no ceiling, then the underside of the roof shall be covered with hard, smooth, and impervious material in such manner as to completely isolate the milk room from any dust or odours from the milking shed.

The entrance to the milk room shall not be from the milking shed but shall be in the outer wall.

An educt vent shaft shall be carried up vertically from the ceiling, or, if there is no ceiling, from the covering of the underside of the roof to a point two (2) feet above the highest level of the roof of the milking shed. Such educt vent shall be constructed of not less than 24-gauge galvanised iron and be not less than nine (9) inches in diameter, hooded at the bottom, and fitted with a cowl at the top.

No. 412 of 1936.

In the matter of Award, dated the 28th day of September, 1928, No. 26 of 1926, as amended, between the West Australian Coach, Car, and Rolling Stock Builders' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, and the West Australian Master Coachbuilders' and Farriers' Industrial Union of Employers and others, and in the matter of an Application by General Motors-Holdens, Limited, for an interpretation and amendment of Clause 10 of the said Award.

UPON hearing Mr. L. L. Carter, on behalf of General Motors-Holdens, Limited, and Mr. T. G. Davies, on behalf of the West Australian Coach, Car, and Rolling Stock Builders' Industrial Union of Workers, the Court,

in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 88 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," hereby further amends the abovementioned Award as follows:—Clause 10:

(b) Add the following words at the end of the subclause:—

"When by agreement, or otherwise, the weekly hours of work are being worked in five (5) days instead of six (6), the worker shall be entitled to receive one sixth of a week's pay for each month of service."

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 2 of 1937.

(Registered 23/1/1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this Eighteenth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between Milne & Company, Burns Philp & Company, Limited, Penfolds Wines, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the one part, and The Metropolitan Wine & Spirit Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part, witnesseth that for the considerations hereinafter appearing the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office in the city of Perth.

2.—**T**erm.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof: Provided that, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months during the currency of the Agreement, the rates of wages herein prescribed may be varied by agreement between the parties: Provided also, that any party hereto may, after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months during the currency of the Agreement, make application to the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia to vary the Agreement by increasing or decreasing the rates of wages herein set forth.

3:-Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. Provided that in any Wine and Spirit Establishment where another class of business is also carried on, the hours usually and customarily worked by that establishment at the date of this Agreement may continue to be worked.

4.—Overtime.

All time worked before 7.30 a.m. and after 5.30 p.m. on the first five working days of the week, and all time worked before 7.30 a.m. and after 1 p.m. on Saturdays shall be deemed overtime, and paid for as such.

Overtime rates shall be as follows:—Time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter, on the first five working days of the week, and double time for all work required to be done on Saturday afternoons and on holidays. In the computation of overtime each day's work shall stand by itself. No employee shall be required to work on a Sunday.

5.—Holidays.

(a) The following holidays shall be observed and paid for at ordinary rates, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Union Pienic Day: Provided that Pienic Day shall be held on the same day as the day upon which Lumpers' Pienic Day is observed.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his service: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

- (d) The second adult in the store shall be classed as a storeman.
- (e) A "Casual worker" shall mean a worker employed for less than six (6) days.
- (f) Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent (10%) in addition to the prescribed rate.
- (g) Any worker required to handle packages weighing one hundredweight (1 cwt.) and upwards for a continuous period of one hour or more in any one day shall be entitled to such extra payment (if any) as will bring his wages during all time so engaged up to 2s. 6d. per hour.

7.—Higher Duties.

A worker required for a period of two days in any one week to perform the work of a higher grade under this Agreement shall be entitled to the minimum wage hereinbefore prescribed for such higher grade for the time being during which he is so engaged.

8.-Under-rate Workers.

An employee who is unable to earn the minimum rate hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate, which may be agreed upon in writing between such employee and the secretary of the Union. If within seven days after being notified in writing of such employee's desire to work at a lower rate of wage than that prescribed the said secretary and such employee are unable to agree upon a lower rate, then the employee may apply in writing to the nearest Resident or Police Magistrate to fix such lower rate of wage. The employee shall give such secretary two days' notice in writing of his intention to apply to the Magistrate, and the said secretary or his agent may attend and oppose the application. The Magistrate may fix the rate of wage, and his decision shall be final. Any employee whose wage shall have been so fixed may work for and be employed by any employer for such less wage for the An employee who is unable to earn the minimum rate be employed by any employer for such less wage for the period of six calendar months thereafter, and after the expiration of the said period until fourteen days' notice in writing shall have been given him by the secretary of the Union requiring his wage to be again fixed in the manner prescribed by this clause: Provided always, that an employer shall not be entitled under the provisions of this Agreement to employ an employee on any class of work hereinbefore referred to at a lower rate of wage than the minimum rate prescribed by this Agreement for that particular class of work, unless and until he has in his service at least one permanently employed employee in receipt of a wage not less than the prescribed minimum, nor shall he employ more than one such employee for every four or fraction of four permanently employed competent employees in receipt of not less than the minimum wage hereinbefore prescribed.

The term "permanently employed" when used in this clause means employed continuously for not less than three calendar months immediately preceding.

9.-Night Work.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 4 of this Agreement, an employee required to perform night shift duty shall be paid at the rate prescribed by Clause 6 hereof for the particular class of work performed, plus two shillings per shift.

10.—Record Book.

Every employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages book, wherein shall be entered the name of each employee, the time he commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, the overtime worked each day, and the wage due therefor.

Such book shall be entered up from day to day, and shall be initialed weekly (if correct) by each employee.

The employer and employee shall be severally responsible for the proper daily posting up of the book, which shall be open for inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union in a place convenient to the employer during all working hours.

11.-Young and Female Workers.

No male person under the age of seventeen years nor any female person shall be employed in any cellar or room in which wines or spirits are drawn, broken down, or bottled.

12.—Proportion of Male Junior Workers.

Junior workers seventeen years of age and under twenty-one years of age shall be allowed in the propor-tion of one (1) junior worker to every four (4) or fraction of four (4) adult workers employed. Provided that this clause shall not operate or be so construed as to require the discharge of any person employed in the industry on the 7th day of December, 1936.

13.—Absence through Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half-day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

14.-Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.
- (3) Name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer.
- (4) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be indorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer, upon request of the

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.

Male adult clerical officers employed in the Metropolitan Area shall be paid the following margins over the basic salary:-

Progression from year to year shall be subject to the receipt of a report from the Permanent Head in accord-

receipt of a report from the Permanent Head in accordance with the Public Service Regulations regarding the good conduct, diligence, and efficiency of the officer.

After attaining the age of nineteen (19) and before reaching twenty-three (23), all junior clerks will be required to pass a promotional examination as prescribed in the Public Service Regulations 94 and 96, and, subject to passing such required examination and reaching the age of twenty-one (21) years, and on appointment to a position carrying a classification higher than the junior range, officers will, subject to Regulation 43, be paid a salary according to age at date of appointment to such senior position; subject, however, to the provision that on attaining the age of twenty-one (21) years an officer shall be entitled to be paid an amount equivalent to the basic salary. equivalent to the basic salary.

An officer retained on the maximum salary of two hundred and seventy pounds (£270) for five (5) years shall be paid an allowance of ten pounds (£10) per annum: Provided the Permanent Head certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion, on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to cease on promotion to a higher position, or an officer refusing to accept promotion.

3.

Officers appointed under Regulation 90 shall be at a minimum salary, subject to Regulation 43, based on years of service, and not on age.

The rates of pay for all officers shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with the basic wage declaration made by the Court: Provided that the basic salary payable for the purposes of this Award shall be the nearest multiple of five pounds (£5) to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth (52%).

No. 41 of 1936.

Between the West Australian Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and H. V. McKay Massey Harris, Pty., Ltd., and others as per Schedule attached, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties: And whereas the President of the Court of Arbitration, pursuant to Section 63 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," made certain suggestions and recommendations to the said parties, and acting thereon the said parties have arrived at an

agreement as to all matters in dispute between them a memorandum whereof, certified by me and filed in the Court as provided in the said Section 63, is hereby appended:

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder and to the industries conducted by the respondents in the second column hereunder and similar industries conducted by other persons, firms, or companies in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935."

2.—Area.

This Award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the city of Perth.

3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

4.—Definitions.

(a) "Shop assistant" shall mean a worker substantially performing one or more of the following duties in retail establishments:-

Selling goods, weighing, assembling and/or preparing goods for sale, attending to stock, receiving eash, and dressing out for display of goods. The term shall include carpet planners, line layers, workers engaged in erecting window treatments, wire screens or duck blinds, and soda fountain and/or milk bar assistants and assistants in country order

departments.
(b) "Storeman" shall mean a worker substantially performing one or more of the following duties:

Receiving, storing, assembling, weighing, branding, stacking or unpacking or distributing goods in a shop, store, or warehouse, or delivering goods from a shop, store or warehouse for transit.

(c) The term "Head storeman" means a person per-

forming the duties of a storeman and who is in charge

of one or more men.
(d) The term "Storeman working singly" shall

mean a storeman working where no other storeman is employed in the establishment.

(e) "Despatch hand" shall mean a worker who is substantially engaged in handling or receiving goods from departments for despatch, or who passes them over to the packing received. over to the packing room or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery and who, if required, shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages and for the proper branding and marking thereof and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes

and cart notes.

(f) "Head despatch hand" shall mean a worker who is placed by his employer in charge of one or more despatch hands.

(g) "Packer" shall mean a worker who packs goods for transport by rail or ship. A worker who packs goods for delivery by road transport where the destination of such goods is beyond the area covered by this

Award shall be classed as a packer.

(h) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided that the minimum engagement of all shop assistants engaged as casual hands shall not be less than one day. minimum engagement of all other workers shall be four (4) hours, to be worked in one continuous period.

A worker engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two (2) hours' pay at the prescribed

rate of pay.

(i) "Adult"—For the purpose of this Award the word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21)

word "adult" shall mean a worker twenty-one (21) years of age and over, or a worker who is in receipt of the prescribed adult rate of pay.

(j) The term "Weekly hand" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of four (4) consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the

minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand had been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in Clause 18 hereof.

(k) "Wholesale establishment" shall mean any ware-

house or place where goods are exclusively or principally sold for resale and/or where goods are sold for consumption and/or use in another business.

(1) "Department" shall mean a section of an establishment in or from which classified goods are sold or

offered for sale by retail.

5.—Chemist Shops.

Any worker employed in a chemist shop shall be subject to the terms of this Award up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

6.-Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follows:-(a) Retail Establishments other than Fourth Schedule

- (i) Shop assistants:—Forty-eight (48) hours for males sixteen (16) years of age and over, and forty-four (44) hours for all females and for males under sixteen (16) years of age shall constitute a week's work. The hours of work shall be:—Monday to Friday inclusive, between 8.20 a.m. and 6 p.m.; on Saturday, between 8.20 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- tween 8.20 a.m. and 6 p.m.; on Saturday, between 8.20 a.m. and 1 p.m.

 (ii) Storemen, packers, and despatch hands:—The hours usually and customarily worked prior to the 1st day of December, 1936, shall continue to be worked: Provided that such hours shall not exceed forty-eight (48) per week in respect of males sixteen (16) years of age and over, and forty-four (44) per week in the case of juniors under sixteen (16) years of age. Such hours shall be worked between 7.20 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and between 7.20 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday: Provided that no day's work shall exceed a spread of nine (9) hours forty (40) minutes, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four (4) hours forty (40) minutes on Saturdays, to be worked in one continuous shift.

(b) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.

- (c) Fourth Schedule Shops:—Workers employed in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1932" (whose hours of work shall not exceed forty-eight (48) per week for males sixteen (16) years of age and over and forty-four (44) per week for females and males under sixteen (16) teams of the sixteen (16) per week for females and makes ander sakteen (10) years of age) shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer's business: Provided that, from week to week, the worker shall be notified by the employer of the half day, which shall be granted in the afternoon, upon which his or her services will not be required in each week.
- (d) Wholesale Establishments:—The number of hours per week usually and customarily worked prior to the 1st day of December, 1936, shall be observed during the currency of this Award, but shall not exceed fortyeight (48) hours per week for males sixteen (16) years of age and over and forty-four (44) hours per week for males under sixteen years of age: Provided that the starting time shall not be earlier than 7.30 a.m. and the finishing time not later than 6 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7.30 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday: Provided that no day's work shall exceed a spread of nine (9) hours forty (40) minutes on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and for (4) hours forty (40) minutes on Saturday, to be worked in one continuous
- (e) The spread of hours for females bound by this Award shall not exceed nine (9) hours.

7.—Meal Times.

(a) Retail Shops other than Fourth Schedule Shops:-Oue hour for any meal shall be given and taken. Lunch hour shall be between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within fifteen (15) minutes after the prescribed finishing time.

(b) Fourth Schedule Shops:-Meal hours in Fourth Schedule Shops shall be taken at the times most convenient to the employer's business: Provided that one hour shall be given and taken for each meal and that not more than five (5) or less than three (3) hour interval shall be worked without an interval for a meal being taken.

(c) All other workers:—One hour shall be given and taken for a meal. Lunch hour shall be taken between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m. Tea hour shall start within fifteen (15) minutes after the usual finishing time.

fifteen (15) minutes after the usual finishing time.

(d) Where work is performed outside the ordinary working hours one hour's break for a meal shall be allowed between 12 o'clock midnight and 1 o'clock a.m. and between 7 a.m. and 8 a.m.

The meal hours referred to in this clause shall be taken

in one continuous period.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the lunch hour for workers in retail establishments, other than Fourth Schedule Shops, shall, during the first two (2) days of each of the three sales per annum, and during Christmas week, be given and taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

8.-Meal Money.

With the exception of all workers whose duties are usually performed after 6 p.m. from Monday to Friday and after 1 p.m. on Saturday, all other workers shall, if required to work after the usual finishing time from Monday to Friday, or after the usual finishing time on Saturday, be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for meal money: Provided that meal money shall not be payable where a worker continues to work on after the prescribed finishing time for one half-hour or less.

9.—Overtime.

(a) Excepting as provided hereunder, all overtime worked shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. In the computation of overtime each day shall stand by itself.

(i.) Where overtime is worked in Fourth Schedule Shops the worker shall be paid overtime as provided in (a) after the prescribed weekly hours of work have been exceeded. Work performed on Sundays and/or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(ii.) Where workers are required to work continuously after the first four (4) hours of overtime have been worked (except on Saturday) they shall be paid at the rate of double time up to the time they finish work: Provided that hour shall not be later than the prescribed starting time the next day.

(b) All time worked in establishments other than those prescribed in (i) hereof, before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time, shall be paid for at overtime rates. Work performed on Saturday afternoons, Sundays, and/or prescribed holidays shall be paid for at double time.

10.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service.

Provided that, when a worker is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays: Provided further, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

11.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wage payable to any male worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one (21) years or upwards, or to any female worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one (21) years or upwards shall be as follows:—

Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector shall be paid the full adult minimum wage.

13

Where an employer usually has more than six (6) workers engaged under the terms of this Award, he shall provide his workers with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and to use as a room for taking their meals. Such room to be situated within a reasonable distance of his place of business and to be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

14.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

15.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs, shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate while so employed.

16.—Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is called upon to perform more than two (2) classes of work on any one day he shall, for the purpose of ascertaining the wages to be paid, be deemed to have worked the day at the class for which the higher rate is prescribed: Provided that, where the starting and finishing time of work done in the higher grade is entered in the time and wages book and such work done in the higher grade is under two (2) hours in any one week no extra payment shall be made. In the event of no record being made in the time and wages book, the provisions of the first paragraph of this clause shall apply.

17.—Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors, with the exception of junior packers, shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five (5) male adults, and thereafter one junior to every two (2) male adults or fraction thereof.

Provided that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every four (4) adult packers.

- (b) Where no adult shop assistant is employed, one junior shop assistant may be employed.
- (c) Where one adult female assistant is employed two (2) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two (2) adult female assistants are employed three (3) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three (3) adult female assistants are employed four (4) junior female assistants may be employed.

Where four (4) adult female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five (5) junior female assistants to four (4) adult female assistants.

18.—Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer at any time may dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such worker does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

19.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive.

20.—Uniforms and Overalls.

Should any dispute arise between the parties as to the compulsory wearing of uniforms or overalls, the dispute, howsoever originating, and any matter arising thereout, including the matter of the laundering of uniforms and overalls, shall be determined by the Board of Reference.

21.—Under-Rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Award may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant Union. If within twenty-four (24) hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the Magistrate, and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the Magistrate and, pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period not exceeding six (6) calendar months, as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned for such period as may be therein stated, until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said secretary.

22.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (iv) Au appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

23.—Country Work and Travelling Time.

- (a) When a worker is engaged on outside work, the employer shall pay all fares, and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.
- (b) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.
- (e) Travelling time outside ordinary working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates up to a maximum of twelve (12) hours in any twenty-four (24) hour period, from the time of starting on the journey: Provided that, when the travelling is by boat, not more than eight (8) hours shall be paid for in such period.

24.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.
- (a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.
- (b) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that

this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

25.

Provided always, and it is hereby expressly agreed and declared, that nothing in this Award shall apply to workers in any wholesale business (excepting wholesale hardware) other than the following:-Head storemen, storemen, storemen working singly, packers, junior packers, junior storemen, junior despatch hands, casual packers, despatch hands, casual storemen, casual despatch hands (junior and adult), junior and adult messengers.

I certify, pursuant to Section 63 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," that the foregoing is a copy of the Agreement arrived at between the parties mentioned above.

UPON hearing Mr. J. C. Plater, on behalf of the Uniou, and Mr. J. G. B. Anderson, on behalf of Mr. J. A. Coleman and others, and by consent, the Court, in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 90 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," hereby amends the abovementioned Award in the terms of the annexed Schedule.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

1.—Definitions.

(a) In this Award, and unless the context otherwise indicates, and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term, "Barmaid" or "Barman" means any person over the age of twenty-one (21) years who serves be-

hind the bar counter liquor for sale by retail in any hind the bar counter liquor for sale by retail in any establishment permitted to retail liquor under a publican's general, hotel, or wine and beer license, and whose duties shall also include the putting on of beer, stacking bars, and keeping clean and orderly the bar counter and behind the bar, excepting the floor and/or windows or any other portion of the licensed premises: Provided always, that the terms "Barmaid" or "Barman" shall not include any person who assists or relieves behind the bar for not more than two (2) hours in any day, which hours shall be worked as following:—one hour unbroken between the hours of 12 noon and one hour unbroken between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m., and/or one hour unbroken between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., or two hours unbroken between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 p.m.: Subject to the further proviso, that the number of persons permitted to assist or relieve behind the bar at any one time shall not exceed one where three (3) or less barmaids and/or barmen are employed, and two (2) where over three (3) barmaids and/or barmen are employed.

2.—Wages.

Provided that, in respect to any basic wage variation which may occur from time to time, the total wage prescribed for a barmaid shall be increased or decreased by the same amount that the basic wage for barmen is increased or decreased as a result of such variation, in order that the rates for a barmaid and a barman shall remain equal. Wages shall be paid weekly.

- (iii) Where the Board of Reference or the Union grants a permit for the worker to lodge and/or board on the premises of the employer, the sum one pound one shilling and ninepence (£1 1s. 9d.) within a 15-mile radius from the General Post Office, Perth, and one pound one shilling and elevenpence (£1 1s. 11d.) outside a 15 mile radius from the miles of the pound one shilling and elevenpence (£1 1s. 11d.) outside a 15 mile radius from the pound one pound one shilling from the pound one pound one shilling and elevenpence (£1 1s. 11d.) outside a 15 mile radius from the pound of the po side a 15-mile radius but within a 20-mile radius from the General Post Office, Perth, may be deducted from the hereinbefore stipulated wages for board and lodging charges.
- (iv) The Board of Reference shall consist of the Secretary of the Licensed Victuallers' Association, the Secretary of the Western Australian Barmaids and Barmen's Union, with the Clerk of the Arbitration Court as Chairman.

3.—Residence.

(i) Except as hereinafter provided, no barmaid or barman shall board and/or reside upon the licensed premises of her or his employer. No employer shall give or sell, and no worker shall take or buy a meal or meals on the licensed premises where she or he is employed, without first obtaining the assent in writing of the secretary of the Union.

(ii) The above shall not apply to-

- (a) Any barmaid or barman who is the son or daughter of the licensee of the hotel in which she or he is working.
- (b) Any hotel to which, in the opinion of the Board of Reference, or the Union, it is inexpedient that this condition should apply.

4.—Hours.

(i) All work done in excess of forty-eight (48) hours in any one week, or of eight (8) hours in any one day, excepting as provided in (ii) hereof, or outside a daily spread of thirteen (13) hours, to be worked in not more than three (3) periods, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a third, such overtime rates to stand alone and be paid for separately and apart from the ordinary week's wages.

(ii) On Fridays and Saturdays nine (9) hours may be worked without incurring the payment of overtime.

5.—Xmas Day, Good Friday, Sunday, Labour Day and Anzac Day.

All work done on Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of three shillings (3s.) per hour or portion of an hour, in addition to the weekly wage. All work done on Anzac Day and Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of one and a half time: Provided that Anzac Day remains as at present virtually a Sunday in the trade. Should the present conditions under which it is honoured be altered, then the provision for payment of one and a half time for that day be discharged automatically from this Award.

6.-Casual, Race, Show, and Sports Hands.

(i) A casual barmaid or barman may be employed between the hours of 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. at the rate of five shillings (5s.) per hour; or for not less than eight (8) hours per day at one pound (£1). For the purpose of this subclause a casual barmaid or barman shall mean a barmaid or barman whose services are terminated by the employer before the completion of five (5) days continuous employment.

(ii) A barmaid or barman employed in booths at cricket matches or as an extra hand at hotels for football matches for not more than two (2) hours continuously shall be paid ten shillings (10/-), but if employed for more than two (2) hours the provisions of the first paragraph of the clause shall apply.

(iii) A barmaid or barman employed at the Trotting Grounds or other night sports shall be paid ten shillings (10/-) for work up to 9 p.m. If work proceeds after 9 p.m. two shillings and sixpence (2/6d.) per hour shall be paid. The time for starting work shall be the time she or he is told to be at the grounds.

(iv) All work done in excess of eight (8) hours in

any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and

one third.

7.—Uniform.

Where the employer insists upon a barmaid or barman wearing a uniform whilst at work, the employer shall provide it and maintain it in a reasonable state of cleanliness.

8.—Meal Time.

A barmaid or barman shall be allowed one hour between the hours of 12 noon and 3 o'clock in the afternoon for dinner, and one hour between the hours of five and eight o'clock in the evening for tea: Provided that, with the consent of the Union secretary, some other arrangement more suitable to the employer's business may be adopted.

9.-Weekly Half Holiday.

The weekly half-holiday shall commence not later than The weekin half-nonday shall commence not later than 1.30 p.m. on some one week day in each week irrespective of whether there are full day's holiday provided for under Clause 5, excepting Christmas week: Provided that, should it be agreed that barmaid or barman shall work during their usual half-holiday, then they shall receive resource of one day's wage ever and above shall receive payment of one day's wage over and above the usual weekly wage.

10.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

A barmaid or barman shall be entitled to two (2) weeks' leave on full pay after the expiration of each twelve (12) months' service. Such leave shall be granted within two (2) months of its becoming due, failing which the employer shall pay double time for all work done after that date, and in no case shall the money be paid instead of the holiday. A barmaid or barman whose services have been terminated before twelve (12) months have expired shall be entitled to payment for one day for each calendar month worked.

For the purpose of calculating holiday pay the second or any subsequent year's service shall be deemed to commence on the day and the month corresponding to the original commencement of the barmaid's and barman's service, irrespective of the time of grant of annual

leave.

11.—Notice.

Except in the case of casual barmaids or barmen, twenty-four (24) hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either side.

12.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its date.

13.-Record Book.

- (i) Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his business premises Record Books in which shall be entered the name of each worker, the time each worker commences and ceases work each day, the total number of hours, and the amount of overtime worked, the time worked on Christmas Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, and on any Sunday, and the amount of wages and overtime paid, and the worker's signature for the same.
- (ii) The worker and the employer shall be jointly responsible for the proper posting of the Record Books daily.
- (iii) Such Record Books shall be so kept as to be open to and available for inspection by an accredited representative of the Union during business hours.
- (iv) A roster of the working hours of all barmaids and barmen shall be kept in the principal bar.
- (v) For the purpose of calculating payment and rostering, the time of ceasing work shall be and mean the time when the barmaid or barman has completed all work behind the bar, whether such cessation is later than the statutory closing time or not.

14.—Schedule of Wages and Working Conditions.

Each employer shall keep on some portion of his business premises a copy of this Award, where it shall be open to the inspection of the worker at all reasonable times.

15.—Payment for Sickness, etc.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half-day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being cutitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his or her employment for any cause whatsoever.

16.—Area.

This Award shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of twenty (20) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and any portion of the Fremantle Licensing District situated beyond that radius.
