The Traffic Act, 1919-1935. Mundaring Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Sandalwood Act, 1929. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29,

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 2 of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council, limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of January, 1937, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1937, to 800 tons: Now, therefore. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period fom the First day of January, 1937, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1937, to 800 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

The Forests Act, 1918.

DAIRY PRODUCTS MARKETING REGULATION ACT, 1934-1936.

File 135/35.

Department of Agriculture, Perth, 3rd March, 1937.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister for Agriculture, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has, pursuant to Section 59 of "The Dairy Products Marketing Regulation Act, 1934-1936," amended the Regulations made under and for the purposes of the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1.7th day of May, 1935, the 13th day of December, 1935, and the 20th day of December, 1935, respectively, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. Regulation 14 of the above-mentioned Regulations is repealed and in lieu thereof a new Regulation is inserted, as follows:----

14. The following conditions shall apply in relation to the persons to be selected and nominated for appointment as members of the Board, namely:—

- (a) Only adult persons who are natural born or naturalised British subjects and are not undischarged bankrupts shall be eligible for selection.
- (b) The persons to be selected for nomination as the Government representative and as the representative of the consumers respectively, may, subject to paragraph (a) hereof, be such persons as the Minister may be pleased to select.
- (c) The person to be selected for nomination as the representative of the cooperative companies licensed under the Act as manufacturers shall be either a director, trustee, member, or officer of a licensed co-operative company.
- (d) Subject to paragraph (e) hereof, the person to be selected for nomination as the representative of the manufacturers other than co-operative companies referred to in paragraph (c) hereof shall be either—
 - (i) a licensed manufacturer, in the case of an individual person; or
 - (ii) a partner in any firm which is licensed as a manufacturer; or
- (iii) a director, trustee, member, or officer of any incorporated body or noncorporate body (not being a co-operative company) which is licensed as a manufacturer.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in paragraph (d) hereof, a person shall not be eligible for selection for nomination under paragraph (d) hereof unless such person, if he be an individual person licensed as a manufacturer, is himself producing fifty-two tons of dairy products per annum, or, if he be a partner in a firm licensed as manufacturers, or a director, trustee, member, or officer of an incorporated body or non-corporate body which is licensed as a manufacturer, unless such firm or such incorporated body or non-corporate body, as the case may be, produces fifty-two tons of dairy products per annum.
- (f) Save and except as hereinafter provided, any person mentioned in paragraphs (e) and (d) hereof shall not be eligible for selection for nomination as a representative of the producers or of the dealers:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a person who is a member or a director, trustee, or officer of a co-operative company or of any other incorporated body, or a non-corporate body which is licensed as a manufacturer, and such person shall be eligible to represent the dealers; but such person shall not be eligible to represent the dealers and at the same time to represent the co-operative companies as licensed manufacturers or the other licensed manufacturers.

- (g) Persons to be selected for nomination as representatives of the producers shall be *bona fide* producers within the meaning of the Act; but such persons shall not be eligible to represent either the co-operative companies or the other manufacturers or the dealers at the same time.
- (h) The person to be selected for nomination as representative of the dealers shall be a licensed dealer, and shall not be eligible for selection for nomination as the representative either of the co-operative companies or of the other manufacturers or of the producers at the same time.
- (i) Subject to the preceding paragraphs of this Regulation, where a producer or a dealer is a partnership, any one (but not more than one) of the partners may be selected for nomination, and where a producer or a dealer is a company or any other corporate or non-corporate body, a director, trustee, member, or officer thereof may be selected for nomination.

2. Regulation 17 of the above-mentioned Regulations is repealed and in lieu thereof a new Regulation is inserted, as follows:---

17. Subject as hereinafter provided, on the thirty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, and on the thirty-first day of January, or as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, in each and every second year after the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, the Returning Officer shall prepare separate electoral rolls for each of the following classes of persons, namely—(a) co-operative companies, (b) manufacturers, other than co-operative companies, (c) producers, and (d) dealers.

Provided that-

- (i) the electoral rolls already prepared under Regulation 17 heretofore in force and still subsisting at the commencement of this Regulation in respect of producers and dealers shall continue in full force and operation under and for the purposes of these Regulations, subject to any amendments thereof as may be necessary by reason of amendment made in the definition of "Producer" in the Act as amended by Section 2 of the Act No. 40 of 1936, until such time as new electoral rolls are prepared in respect of "producers" and "dealers" in pursuance of this regulation; and
- (ii) as and when the members of the Board who represent the producers commence to retire in rotation, and it becomes necessary to hold an election annually for the selection for nomination of a person as representative of the producers on the Board, the biennial electoral roll of producers then prepared and in force under the regulations shall, subject to any amendments thereof as the Returning Officer may deem necessary, be the electoral roll for such election; and
- (iii) for the purpose of the election of persons to be nominated and appointed for the first time as members of the Board as the representatives of the co-operative companies and the manufacturers other than the co-operative companies respectively, the Returning Officer shall, on a date as soon as reasonably may be after the commencement of this Regulation, to be fixed by the Minister and to be notified by advertisement published in the Government Gazette and in the West Australian newspaper, prepare special electoral rolls for such co-operative companies and such manufacturers other than co-operative companies respectively, and such electoral rolls shall be used for the purposes of such first election aforesaid and thereafter shall continue in force and effect, subject to such amendments thereof from time to time as the Returning Officer may deem necessary for the purposes of these Regulations until biennial rolls for the said classes of persons are prepared in the year, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, pursuant to this Regulation.

3. Regulation 20 of the above mentioned Regulations is amended by adding thereto a proviso as follows: —

Provided that, in relation to the preparation of the special electoral rolls for the co-operative companies and the manufacturers other than the co-operative companies respectively for the election of the first persons to be nominated and appointed as members of the Board as representatives of the classes of person aforesaid respectively, as provided for in paragraph (iii) of the proviso to Regulation 17 hereof, any person desiring to have his name enrolled on either of the said special electoral rolls shall make application in the manner hereinbefore-mentioned to the Returning Officer not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon on a day being not less than seven elear days prior to the date fixed for the preparation of such special roll, as provided for in paragraph (iii) of the proviso to Regulation 17 hereof.

4. Regulation 21 of the above-mentioned Regulations is repealed and in lieu thereof a new Regulation is inserted as follows:—

- 21. (1) Subject as hereinafter provided—
 - (a) Any co-operative company and any person other than a co-operative company who holds a license as a manufacturer issued under the Act and still in force shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of co-operative companies or of manufacturers, as the case may be; and
 - (b) any person who holds a license as a dealer issued under the Act and still in force shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of dealers; and
 - (e) any person who satisfies the Returning Officer that he is a *bona fide* producer within the meaning of the Act shall be entitled to apply for enrolment and to be enrolled on the electoral roll of producers.

Provided that—

- (i) no person shall be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on more than one electoral roll at the same time; and
- (ii) a co-operative company, or any other person which or who is licensed as a manufacturer shall not be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on an electoral roll of dealers or of producers merely because such co-operative company or other person aforesaid is a licensed dealer or a *bona fide* producer within the meaning of the Act; and
- (iii) a person who is licensed as a dealer shall not be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled in an electoral roll of co-operative companies or of manufacturers other than co-operative companies or of producers, merely because such person is a co-operative company or a manufacturer other than a co-operative company or a *bona fide* producer within the meaning of the Act; and
- (iv) a person who is licensed as a manufacturer other than a co-operative company shall not be entitled to be enrolled or be enrolled on the electoral roll of manufacturers other than co-operative companies, if such person produces less than fifty-two tons of dairy products per annum.

(2) Where a co-operative company or a manufacturer other than a co-operative company or a dealer is a producer and desires to be enrolled on an electoral roll, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) In the case of a co-operative company, the board of directors or other board of management may authorise any director, trustee, or other member of the board of management or its manager, secretary, or other officer of the co-operative company (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on any other electoral roll under these Regulations) to represent the co-operative company as an elector, and upon receipt of an application for eurolment from such representative, together with a certificate in writing of such authority aforesaid under the hand of the managing director or the chairman of the board of management of the co-operative company, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these Regulations being satisfied, enrol such representative person on the electoral roll of co-operative companies in accordance with his application.

- (b) In the case of a company other than a co-operative company the board of directors of the company may authorise any director, manager, secretary, or other officer of the company (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled on any electoral roll under these Regulations) to represent the company as an elector, and upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative person, together with a certificate in writing of such authority aforesaid under the hand of the managing director of the company, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these Regulations being satisfied, enrol such representative person on the electoral roll upon which the company aforesaid is entitled to be enrolled in accordance with the application of such representative person.
- (c) No person shall be entitled under either paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) hereof to act as the representative of a co-operative company and of another company, or of more than one company (not being a cooperative company) at the same time.
- (d) In the case of an association or of any other corporate or non-corporate body (other than a co-operative company or a company other than a co-operative company), the management committee thereof may authorise any trustee, member, or officer of such association or body aforesaid (being a person not already enrolled or entitled to be enrolled in any electoral roll under these regulations) to represent the association or other body aforesaid as an elector, and upon receipt of an application for enrolment from such representative person, together with a certificate in writing of such authority under the hand of the president or chairman of such management committee, the Returning Officer may, subject to all other requirements of these Regulations being satisfied, enrol such representative person on the electoral roll upon which such association or other body aforesaid is entitled to be enrolled, in accordance with the application of such representative person.
- (e) No person shall be entitled under paragraph (d) hereof to act as the representative of more than one association or other body aforesaid at the same time.
- (f) In the case of a partnership either one of the partners, but not more than one at any one time, may apply for enrolment and be enrolled on the electoral roll upon which the partnership is entitled to be enrolled.
- (g) Every authority given under paragraphs (a), (b), or (d) hereof shall have effect only in relation to the electoral roll upon which the person authorised thereby is enrolled; and, whenever application for enrolment is made by any representative person as aforesaid, a fresh authority as aforesaid shall be obtained for the purpose of such application.
- (h) Any co-operative company, other company, association or other body aforesaid may cancel or revoke any authority given by it under this Regulation by notice in writing under the hand of the managing director, chairman of the board of management, or the president or chairman of the committee of management, as the case may be, sent or delivered to the Returning Officer: Provided that any such cancellation or revocation shall not invalidate any vote given by the representative person enrolled and voting by virtue of such authority at an election held previously to such cancellation or revocation.
- (i) Upon receipt of notice of cancellation or revocation of authority as aforesaid, the Returning Officer shall forthwith remove from the electoral roll the name of the representative person whose authority has been so cancelled or revoked.

5. Regulation 22 of the above-mentioned Regulations is amended by adding to paragraph (1) thereof a proviso as follows:---

Provided that-

- (i) in relation to the special elections to be held after the commencement of this Regulation for the selection for nomination and appointment of the first representatives of the co-operative companies and of the manufacturers other than the co-operative companies, as provided for in paragraph (iii) of the proviso to Regulation 17 (as now amended) of these Regulations, the Minister shall, as soon as reasonably may be after the commencement of this Regulation, fix a day, being not less than seven days after the date fixed in the said Regulation 17, for the preparation of the special electoral rolls for such special elections as the last day for the submission of candidates for such special elections, and notice of such date shall be published in the Government Gazette and in the West Australian newspaper; and
- (ii) every submission of a candidate for either of the said special elections shall be sent or delivered to the Returning Officer at his address, published as aroresaid, so that it shall be received by him not later than 4 o'clock in the afternoon of the last day for submission of candidates which has been fixed by the Minister as aforesaid,

6. Regulation 24 of the above-mentioned Regulations is amended by adding thereto a proviso, as follows:---

Provided that, in relation to the special elections to be held after the commencement of this Regulation for the selection for nomination and appointment of the first representatives of the co-operative companies and of the manufacturers other than the co-operative companies, as provided for in paragraph (iii) of the proviso to Regulation 17 (as now amended) of these Regulations, the nomination day for the successful candidates at such special elections shall be such day, being not less than ten days after the date fixed by the Returning Officer in accordance with Regulation 23 hereof, as the date of the closing of the poll at such special elections as shall be fixed by the Minister.

7. Regulation 41 of the above-mentioned Regulations is amended by substituting the figures (40) for the figures (30) in the last line of the proviso to paragraph (2) of such Regulation.

8. Regulation 42 of the above-mentioned Regulations is amended by substituting the figures (40) for the figures (39) in line three of paragraph (1) of such Regulation.

9. Form No. 12 in the First Schedule to the abovementioned Regulations is repealed and in lieu thereof a new form is inserted, as follows:—
