PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the said State, do by this my

Proclamation appoint special days to be observed as Bank Holidays as follows:—

Date and Town.

Thursday, 11th March, 1937—Bunbury.
Tuesday, 30th March, 1937—Throughout the State.
