The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1703/36.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage, Victoria Park District, Reticulation Area No. 5—Victoria Park.—Six-inch and four-inch diameter pipe sewers, with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, between the South-Western Railway and Gerard street and Albany road, and Gresham and Miller streets and Dane street, as shown in blue on Plan M.W.S.S. and D.D., W.A. No. 5833.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 35 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And whereas certain Regulations were made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"): And whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of April, 1933, the Governor amended the principal Regulations by adding thereto after Regulation 48A a new regulation, which was numbered 48B: And whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of May, 1936, the Governor again amended the principal Regulations, but adding thereto after Regulation 48B aforesaid a new regulation, which by inadvertence was also numbered 48B: And whereas it is necessary to amend the said last-mentioned Regulations by renumbering the same: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the Regulation made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of May, 1936, and therein appearing as Regulation 48B by substituting for the said number "48B" the number "48C" so that the said Regulation as included in the principal Regulations shall appear as Regulation 48C after Regulation 48B as made and added to the principal Regulations by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of April, 1933, as aforesaid.

Clause 6.—Hours:

Omit this Clause and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

“6. Hours:

- (a) Forty-four (44) hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work for surface workers. If more than one shift is worked on the surface, the forty-four (44) hours shall then be inclusive of crib time for such shift workers.
- (b) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work underground, including crib time.
- (c) For workers employed on a forty-four (44) hour week, a week's work shall consist of eight (8) hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and on Saturdays four (4) hours exclusive of crib time: Provided, however, that in the case of continuous and/or shift workers on any mine the provision of this clause will be considered to have been complied with if, generally or in any particular department of the plant, the ordinary hours

of work do not exceed eighty-eight (88) hours per fortnight, to be worked in alternate weeks of forty-eight (48) and forty (40) hours respectively and in shifts of eight (8) hours each inclusive of crib time: Provided, further, that if the eighty-eight (88) hour fortnight is adopted, the provisions relating to wages and number of shifts requisite to qualify for holidays shall be modified to correspond therewith: Provided, further, that by agreement between an employer and the Union, the hours of work may be worked under a roster which shall provide for an average of forty-four (44) hours per week, spread over a period of three (3) weeks.

- (d) In the case of underground workers, the hours of each such shift shall comprise seven (7) hours twelve (12) minutes on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and four (4) hours on Saturdays, and the shifts shall be so arranged that an interval of forty-eight (48) minutes will separate the finishing hour of one shift from the commencing hour of the next following shift, except in the case of Saturday shifts, when there shall be no break between shifts.
- (e) Six (6) hours shall constitute a shift's work in all rises, or in sinking specially wet shafts and winzes, and for men engaged inside the gas or water spaces of any boiler or flue in cleaning or scraping work and for men engaged in cleaning dustbins or dust flues. In case of boiler cleaners working broken shifts, one hour on the above description of work shall count as one hour and twenty minutes. In the case of Lancashire and Cornish boilers, all time necessary for a boiler cleaner to come out for a spell shall count as time worked in the boiler.

Clause 24.—Annual Holidays:

Add the following subclause:—

“Any worker who has taken part in a strike (including a slow strike) or a general or sectional stoppage of work unauthorised by the employer, during the period of service in respect of which the abovementioned annual holidays are granted, shall forfeit one day of such annual holidays for every day or part of a day during which he takes part in a strike or in such unauthorised stoppage of work, including a stoppage because of a fatal accident in the mine, except in the case of those workers working in the same shift and the same level as the deceased who desire to attend the funeral and so notify the employer.”

Clause 30.—Definitions:

Add to the definition of “Timberman” the following words:—

“This term is not meant to apply to any worker who may be called upon to assist in lifting or carrying timber or handing up tools or similar work.”

With regard to the Big Bell Gold Mine, the Triton Gold Mine, and Cox's Find Gold Mine, the sum of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per week may be deducted from the District Allowance which would otherwise be paid.

This Order shall take effect from the 1st day of May, 1937.

E. Arnold, Westralian Cast Stone Co., Mt. Hawthorn Modelling Works, E. Condon, H. B. Brady & Co., Ltd., Respondents.

THE Industrial Board for the calling or industry of Sheet Fibrous Plaster Manufacturing, Plaster Modelling, and Cement Goods Manufacturing, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to:—

- (a) architectural modelling;
- (b) the manufacture of architectural ornaments of fibrous plaster, plaster, or cement;
- (c) the manufacture of fibrous plaster goods or portable articles of reinforced cement or concrete, cement pressed work, baths, wash-tubs, troughs, sinks, pillars, ornaments, and other miscellaneous cement goods (but excluding cement roofing tiles);
- (d) the fixing of fibrous plaster on walls or ceilings of buildings, and, when necessary, the fixing of any other article manufactured under the provisions of this Award.

Provided that this Award shall be deemed not to include any work already governed by any other industrial Award or industrial Agreement.

2.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work. These hours shall be worked on six (6) days, but by agreement between the employer and the workers concerned may be worked on five (5) days; and, in the absence of any such agreement, shall be as settled by the Board of Reference constituted under this Award.

(b) The ordinary day's work shall be performed between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive and shall finish not later than 11.45 a.m. on Saturday.

3.—Meal Time.

Lunch interval shall not exceed one hour and shall be taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m.

4.—Overtime and Sunday Work.

(a) All time worked in excess of forty-four (44) hours in any one week, or beyond eight (8) hours in any one day (except Saturday) in which the week's work is being performed in six (6) days, or beyond nine (9) hours in any one day (except Saturday) when the week's work is being performed in five (5) days, or beyond four (4) hours on Saturday, shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the following rates:—

For the first two (2) hours—Time and a half.
Thereafter—Double time.

Provided that, where an employer is working the ordinary weekly hours in five (5) days, he shall be permitted to employ his workers on Saturday on equal terms in competitive work with any other employer whose workers perform the ordinary week's work in five and a half (5½) days.

(b) All work performed on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

5.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) In lieu of annual leave and public holidays each worker shall be entitled to receive a weekly allowance, as shown in Clause 6.

(b) Any work performed on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) On all other holidays the employer's place of business may be closed and payment may be deducted, but if work is performed ordinary rates shall apply.

Thereafter, or, on attaining the age of twenty-one (21) years, whichever first happens, the minimum adult rate in the section in which he is employed shall be paid.

When employed outside the Metropolitan Area, but within the area of the Award, wages shall be increased (or decreased) in accordance with the basic wage adjustment.

7.—Contract of Service.

Twenty-four (24) hours' notice shall be given on either side to terminate the contract of service, except in the case of a fixer, whose contract of service may be terminated by one hour's notice: Provided, however, that an employer may summarily dismiss a worker at any time for wilful misconduct or disobedience of a lawful order.

8.—Time and Wages Record.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at each of his factories a time and wages record, wherein shall be entered:—

- (a) the name of each worker to whom this Award applies;
- (b) the class of work performed by him;
- (c) the time worked each day;
- (d) the wages (including fares and overtime, if any) paid to each worker;
- (e) the ages of junior workers.

The employer and worker shall be jointly responsible for the correct daily entering of such record.

Such record shall be open for inspection by the secretary or a duly accredited representative of the Union, between the working hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., and such person may take extracts therefrom.

9.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Payment of wages shall be made on Friday of each week, on the job, and within at least ten (10) minutes of the time for ceasing work.

(b) An employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

(c) Where a worker is discharged or ceases work on any job before the regular pay day, he shall be paid on the job all wages due to him.

10.—Posting of Award.

A copy of this Award shall be kept in each factory where it is easily accessible to the worker.

11.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

12.—Term.

This Award shall operate from the date thereof and continue in force for a period of three (3) years. Any party affected by its provisions may, after the first twelve (12) months of its operation, or at any time during the currency of the Award, apply to the Court of Arbitration to vary any term or terms thereof.

13.—General Conditions.

(a) Piecework: Piecework shall not be worked in any factory or on any fixing job unless and until the piecework rates have been fixed by this Board or by the Board of Reference appointed by this Award.

(b) Dust Allowance: Workers shall be paid three-pence (3d.) an hour extra as dust allowance while demolishing old work.

(c) Leading Hands: A worker placed in charge of three (3) or more adult workers shall be classed as a leading hand and shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day in addition to the prescribed wage.

(d) Each employer shall be required to have at each factory first-aid equipment in case of accidents.

(e) Each employer shall provide a place in the factory for the safe keeping of the workers' tools.

(f) Adequate accommodation shall be provided by the employer at each factory to enable the workers to change their clothes and boots.

(g) Boiling water shall be supplied by the employer for the use of workers at meal time.

(h) Each employer shall provide at the factory and on each job proper sanitary conveniences for the use of workers.

(i) At the factory five (5) minutes shall be allowed to workers who desire to change their clothes, but no worker shall leave the factory before the proper time for ceasing work.

(j) Cement concrete workers shall be supplied by the employer with rubber gloves.

14.—Country Work.

When any worker is sent by his employer or is engaged by his employer to go to a job at such a distance that he cannot conveniently return to his home each night, unless the employer and worker agree upon the board and lodging provided, the worker shall be paid, in addition to his regular wages, five shillings (5/-) per day for the first seven (7) days and thirty shillings (30s.) per week thereafter. The employer shall pay all fares and travelling time: Provided that such travelling time shall be limited to eight (8) hours in any one day.

The employer shall also provide free transport for the workers' tools.

15.—Fares and Travelling Allowances.

Workers shall be paid any excess between the amount of their fares from their residence to the factory of their employer and their residence to any job on which they may be employed, whether they use their own form of conveyance or not.

Workers transferred from one job to another during the working day shall be paid the amount of their fare (if any) and shall also be paid for the time occupied in travelling from the one job to the other.

16.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any other stoppage of work which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Certificate of Experience.

Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (a) Name in full;
- (b) Age and date of birth;
- (c) Name of each previous employer;
- (d) Length of service with each previous employer.

No worker shall have any claim for additional wages, in the event of his age or length of service with another employer being wrongly stated on this certificate.

18.—Junior Workers.

(a) Junior workers may be employed in any branch of the industry.

(b) Junior workers shall be allowed in the following proportions:—except to bench hands—one junior worker to each fully paid worker employed in each particular section of the industry; to bench hands—the proportion of junior workers shall be one to every two (2) fully paid workers or fraction of two (2), not being less than one.

(c) One junior worker only shall be employed on the teasing machine.

(d) In addition to the above there shall be allowed in each factory one junior worker, who may be employed in any part of the factory, and be paid at the rates pertaining to junior workers in the section of the industry in which he may be employed.

19.—Shift Work.

The work of the industry may be carried on in shifts if and when the terms and conditions under which shifts may be worked are determined by this Board.

20.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a Chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates, and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;
- (iv) an appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

21.—Definition.

"Bench hand" shall mean a worker who prepares the ground work for the modeller and who cuts and mounts the moulds necessary for the making of any plasterer's mouldings or ornamental work, and who also makes moulds for gelatine and all cement pressed work.
