FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

IN THE LICENSING COURT FOR THE SUBIACO-LEEDERVILLE DISTRICT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

In the matter of an application for a Publican's General License within the Licensing District of Subiaco-Leederville in Western Australia, and in the matter of "The Licensing Act, 1910-1922," Section 47.

To His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia:

The humble Petition of the undersigned, being a majority of the electors living in the area hereinafter defined, sheweth as follows:—

(1) That your petitioners constitute a majority in number of the electors living in an area comprised within a circle having a radius of forty chains from the centre of all that piece of land situate at the corner of Charles street and Walcott street, North Perth, and being portion of Swan Location 707 and being Lot 231

(the whole of the land in Certificate of Title registered Volume 1031, Folio 633) and Lots 232, 233, and 234 (the whole of the land in Certificate of Title registered Volume 991, Folio 32) on deposited Plan 2672 and which said land is situate within the Licensing District of Subiaco-Leederville.

(2) That since the 31st December, 1922, there has been an increase in population in the said area and such increase is likely to be permanent.

(3) That there are no licensed premises within the said area.

(4) That an hotel with a Publican's General License is required within the said area to meet the public convenience and requirements.

(5) That the proposed situation of the new licensed premises if this Petition be granted, namely, at the corner of Charles street and Walcott street, North Perth, is a suitable place for such an hotel.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that the Licensing Court may have authority to grant a new Publican's General License within the said Licensing District of Subiaco-Leederville for premises to be erected on the said land.
