WHEREAS by "The Native Administration Act, 1905-1936," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be Re-serves for Natives: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives should be declared at Collie: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of approximately seventy-one acres at Collie, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Natives.

Wellington (near Allanson) No. 7136, bounded by lines starting from the south corner of Mining Lease 30 and extending westerly to the south-eastern side of Road No. 1128; thence north-easterly and north-westerly along No. 1128; thence north-casterly and north-westerly along said side of said road and its north-eastern side to the eastern boundary of Wellington Location 1202; thence northerly along same to the south bank of the Collie River; thence easterly along the latter to the south-western boundary of said Mining Lease 30, and then could easterly along some to the starting point; excludsouth-easterly along same to the starting point; exclud-ing Road 3869. (About 71 acres.)

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may bv Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas it is desirable to vary Proclamations under the said section of the said Act dated the 14th day of Nov-ember, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 16th November, 1934, and dated the 17th day of De-

cember, 1934, and published in the Government Gazette on 21st December, 1934, respectively, in regard to cer-tain Western Australian waters described therein being closed against the use of fishing nets: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and con-sent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Proclamations by declaring that it shall be lawful to use fishing nets of legal length and size of mesh in the waters described in the Schedule hereto from the 1st day of July, 1937, until the 31st day of October, 1937, inclusive.

(a) Princess Royal Harbour (Albany):—All that area of Western Australian waters on the northern side of Princess Royal Harbour, Albany, north of a line drawn from Residency Point to the southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the southern extremity of the Deep Water Jetty; and thence north-easterly to Point King.

(b) (12).—All that area of the southern portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour (Albany) and the waters de waters of oyster Harbour (Analy) and the waters of the Channel Entrance to Oyster Harbour from King George's Sound bounded by the following lines:---Ou the south by a line drawn in an easterly direction from a point on the foreshore ten (10) chains south of Emu Point to the opposite foreshore; on the north by a line drawn in a north-easterly direction from a peg on the foreshore marked 14 (about 440 yards westward of Emu Point) to the southern extremity of Green Island; and thence by a live drawn in an east-south-easterly direc-tion from the southern extremity of the said Green Island to a point on the southern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 115 chains eastward of the eastern point of entrance to Oyster Harbour.

The Schedule.

NATIVE ADMINISTRATION ACT, 1905-1936.

Regulations relating to the Natives' Medical Fund.

1. Save and except as otherwise in these regulations hereinafter expressly proi. Save and except as otherwise in these regulations hereinarter expressly pro-vided, nothing in these regulations shall operate or be deemed to operate so as to excupt persons employing natives in pursuance of a permit or permit and agreement under the Act from their liability under the Act to provide such natives, while so employed and when suffering from illness or injury, with medicines and medical attention as

and when suffering from illness or injury, with medicines and medical attention as required by the said permit or the said permit and agreement. 2. The medical fund provided for by Section 36'of the Act (hereinafter referred to as "the fund") shall be known as "The Natives' Medical Fund" and shall be established as from and including the first day of July, 1937. 3. (1) On and after the said first day of July, 1937, every person applying under the Act for a permit to employ a native or natives, shall in addition to any other fees payable, deposit with his application the amount of the contribution prescribed in Regulation 4 hereof for payment into the fund in respect of each and every native to be employed by him under the permit then applied for. If such permit be granted, the said deposit shall be paid into the fund. If such permit be refused, the amount of the deposit shall forthwith be refunded to the applicant.

the deposit shall forthwith be refunded to the applicant. (2) An application for the grant of a permit may be rejected or refused unless and until the amount of the contribution payable to the fund is deposited with such application as aforesaid.

4. Subject as in this regulation hereinafter provided, the amount of the contri-bution payable to the fund by the holder of a permit shall be one pound in respect of each and every native employed by him under the authority of the permit: Provided that-

- (i) Where the native employed by a holder of a permit is a ward or a trainee of the Department of Native Affairs or of any institution the Com-missioner may, if he think fit, remit to the holder of the permit in respect of such native one-half of the amount of the contribution pre-
- (ii) Where in this regulation, and
 (iii) Where in the application for the grant of a permit, it is stated that the native, in respect of which the grant of a permit is applied for, will be employed for a period not exceeding one month and such native when employed is employed for a period not exceeding one month, the Commissioner may, if he think fit, remit to the holder of the permit in respect of such native any amount not exceeding three-fourths of the amount of the contribution prescribed in this regulation.

5. Where contributions to the fund have been deposited with a Protector of Natives, such/Protector shall forthwith pay or remit the same to the Commissioner to Natives, such Protector shall forthwith pay or remit the same to the commissioner to be dealt with by the Commissioner in accordance with the Act and these regulations. Provided that where an application for the grant of a permit has been received by a Protector of Natives with the necessary deposit of contributions to the fund, and the Protector is of the opinion that such application should be refused and informs the Commissioner accordingly, the Commissioner may direct and authorise the Protector of Natives to return the said deposit to the applicant, instead of paying or remitting the same to the Commissioner, and to refuse the application.

same to the Commissioner, and to refuse the application. 6. It shall be competent for the Commissioner to accept and pay into the fund any voluntary contribution of the amount prescribed by Regulation 4 of these regula-tions paid by or by any other person on behalf of any native whether employed or not, and whether employed under the authority of a permit or not, and also for the Com-missioner, in the case of the illness or injury of the native by or on whose behalf such voluntary contribution has been made as aforesaid, to expend moneys out of the fund for the benefit of such native and his dependants in the same manner as he could do if such native had been employed under the authority of a permit and the contribution had been made by the holder of the permit in compliance with the Act and these had been made by the bolder of the permit in compliance with the Act and these regulations

Provided that the payment of a voluntary contribution under this regulation shall entitle the native by whom or on whose behalf the contribution is paid or his dependants to claim the benefits conferred by this regulation only in case the illness or injury to

the native occurs after such contribution is made and before the 30th day of June then next following. 7. The notification to be given by the holder of a permit when any native in his employ becomes sick or affected by any disease or suffers any injury as required by Subsection (2) of Section 36 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 1 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

8. As and whenever notification is received by a Protector of Natives from the holder of a permit in accordance with Subsection (2) of Section 36 of the Act, such Protector shall forthwith report to the Commissioner the information contained in such notification in the Form No. 2 in the First Appendix to these regulations.

9. Where the Commissioner is satisfied that any native has fallen ill or become diseased or is suffering from any injury or accident, and that such native has received or requires medicines and medical attention and hospital treatment the following pro-

maintenance of the native during the period of his illness, condition of disease, injury, or accident, aforesaid.

(B) Where the native is employed under a permit or a permit and agreement and has fallen ill or is affected with disease in circumstances which would not in any event entitle the native to Workers' Compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934—

(I) if the employer has in accordance with his obligations under the permit or permit and agreement provided medical attention and medicines for the native at the employer's abode or place of business for the reason that the removal of the native to a hospital or another place for medical attention and treatment was not necessary, the cost of such medicines and medical attention shall be borne and paid by the employer and the Commissioner shall not use any moneys in the fund for such purpose;

(II) if the employer has provided medical attention and medicines for the native at the employer's abode or place of business for the reason that the native could not with safety be removed to a hospital, the Commissioner shall with moneys out of the fund pay the cost of the medicines and medical attention provided by the employer as aforesaid or reimburse the employer the amount of such expenses as the case may require;

(III) if the employer has sent the native to the nearest accessible hospital or to the nearest Protector of Natives for medical attention and treatment, and the Commissioner is satisfied that the condition of the native was not serious and medical attention for the native was practicable at the abode or place of business of the employer, then if the Commissioner is required by any medical practitioner or by the hospital to pay the cost of medical attention or hospital treatment given to such native, he may do so out of moneys in the fund, but in such case the amount so paid shall be deemed to have been paid for and on behalf of the employer, and shall be a debt owing by the employer to the Commissioner recoverable at the suit of the Commissioner in any court of competent jurisdiction. Any moneys recovered from an employer under this paragraph shall be paid into the fund by the Commissioner;

(IV) if the employer has sent the inative to the nearest accessible hospital or to the nearest Protector of Natives for medical attention and treatment and the Commissioner is satisfied that the condition of the native was serious and that his removal as aforesaid was necessary or expedient, the Commissioner may out of the moneys in the fund pay the cost of the medical attention and hospital treatment given to the native or reimburse the employer the amount thereof as the case may require.

(C) Where the native is employed under a permit or a permit and agreement and has fallen ill or is affected with disease or has suffered personal injury by accident under such circumstances that under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934 he would, save and except for the exemption provided in Subsection (5) of Section 36 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, be entitled to claim workers' compensation from the employer under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934—

(i) if the employer has in accordance with his obligations under the permit or permit and agreement or otherwise provided medical attention and medicines and maintenance for the native at the employer's abode or place of business for the reason that the removal of the native to a hospital or another place for medical attention and treatment was not necessary, the cost of such medicines, and medical attention and maintenance shall be borne and paid by the employer, but in special cases the Commissioner may, if he think fit, with moneys out of the fund defray any such medical and other expenses necessarily incurred, or reimburse in an amount of the same to an employer as the case may require.

(ii) If the employer has provided medical attention and medicines and maintenance for the native at the employer's abode or place of business for the reason that the native could not with safety be removed to a hospital, the Commissioner shall with moneys out of the fund pay the costs of the medicines and the medical attention and of the maintenance provided for the native during his said incapacity provided by the employer as aforesaid or reimburse the employer the amount of such costs as the case may require.

(iii) If the employer has sent the native to the nearest accessible hospital or to the nearest Protector of Natives for medical attention and treatment and the Commissioner is satisfied that the condition of the native was not serious and medical attention for the native was practicable at the employer's abode or place of business, then if the Commissioner is required by any medical practitioner or by the hospital to pay the cost of medical attention or hospital treatment given to such native, he may do so out of moneys in the fund, but in such case the amount of such expenses shall be deemed to have been paid by the Commissioner for and on behalf of the employer and shall be a debt owing by the employer to the Commissioner recoverable at the suit of the Commissioner in any court of competent jurisdiction. Any moneys recovered from an employer under this paragraph shall be paid into the fund by the Commissioner.

(iv) If the employer has sent the native to the nearest accessible hospital or to the nearest Protector of Natives for medical attention and treatment and the Commissioner is satisfied that the condition of the native was serious and that his removal as aforesaid was necessary or expedient, the Commissioner may out of the moneys in the fund pay the costs of the medical attention and hospital treatment and any maintenance given to the native during his incapacity from injury, or reimburse the employer the amount thereof as the case may require.

- (D) Where in the foregoing paragraphs the expression "medical attention" is used such expression shall include the provision or supply to the native of any necessary artificial limb and any surgical or mechanical device, instrument or other article declared by the medical practitioner attending the native to be required by the native as the result of his illness, disease or injury.
- (E) It shall be the duty of the Commissioner before using any moneys in the fund to defray the medical and hospital expenses and the maintenance of natives to make or cause to be made all proper inquiries and investigations to satisfy himself as to the bona fides of any claimant for payment and the correctness of the amount of the payment claimed; and wherever possible the claim shall be certified as correct by the Protector of Natives where the service, in relation to which the claim is made, was authorised by the said Protector.
 (F) Subject to the foregoing paragraphs of this regulation, the Commissioner may as and whenever he shall think fit use the moneys in the fund to
 - F) Subject to the foregoing paragraphs of this regulation, the Commissioner may as and whenever he shall think fit use the moneys in the fund to defray the medical and hospital expenses and the maintenance of any native who falls ill or becomes diseased or who suffers any injury or accident whether such native is indigent or not.

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1935. Industrial Agreement No. 9 of 1937. (Registered 4/6/1937.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 16th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between the Kalgoorlie Brewery and Ice Company, Limited, whose registered office is situated at Brookman street, Kal-goorlie (hereinafter called the "Employer" of the one part) and The Eastern Goldfields Federated Engine-Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers (hereinafter called the "Union" of the other part).

1. The Parties to this Agreement agree that the minimum rate of wages and conditions of labour shall be as follows:---

2.—Hours—Overtime.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and four (4) hours on Saturdays, and/or shifts of 7 hours 50 minutes each Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and 4 hours 50 minutes on Saturdays. All time worked beyond the hours of duty on any day shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid at time and a half rates. Each day shall stand by itself.

Sundays and Holidays.

(b) All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at double time.

(c) Any employee called in on Sunday or holidays as set out in Clause 4 shall be paid a minimum of eight (8) hours at Sunday or holiday rates, and any work performed on Sundays or holidays in excess of eight (8) hours shall be paid for at double time.

3.—Wages.

The wages shall be weekly and shall be as follows:— Basic Wage . . . £4 7s. 0d. per week Per week of 44 hours.

£ s. d. 6 18 0 All classes of engine-drivers .. Firemen 6 3 <u>n</u>

(a) Where three shifts are worked unless rotation of shifts is carried out the afternoon shift nan shall be allowed and paid 6s. per week, and the night shift 9s. per week in addition to the weekly rates set out in

Clause 3. (b) Where only two shifts are worked unless rota-tion of shifts is carried out the afternoon shift shall be allowed and paid an additional 6s. per week to the rates set out in Clause 3. 4 — Holidays

4.-Holidays.

The following days shall be observed as holidays, but should any employee have to work on any of these days, double time rates shall be paid. Holidays mean:—Christ-mas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Brewery Employees' Picnic Day, Labour Day, New Year's Day, Kalgoorlie Cup Day, Boulder Cup Day and Anzac Day, providing that when Boxing Day falls on a Saturday all men required to work on that day shall do so, and another day given in lieu thereof.

5.—Annual Leave.

Twelve days' annual leave on full pay shall become due after twelve months' service, such leave to be taken at such times as mutually agreed upon, between the 30th April and 30th September each year, in addition to holidays enumerated in Clause 4. Provided that should the employment be terminated before the holiday is due the worker shall, after the completion of one month's service, be entitled to one day's pay in lieu of holidays for every month of service and portion of month, provided that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct he shall not be entitled to the provisions of this clause.

6.-General.

No engine-driver or fireman shall be called upon to do other work which will preclude him from maintaining effective supervision or control of his engines and boilers.

7.

Where the employment of work involves functions of a mixed character, the minimum wage to be paid to the employee shall be calculated as if he performed such only of the said functions as involves the highest rate of wages under this Agreement.

8.

The engagement between the employer and employee shall be weekly, a week's notice from either side to terminate same, except in the case of the employee absent-ing himself without leave, not obeying the lawful com-mands, or being guilty of misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped by fire, tempest or other act of God, when such Agreement may be terminated immediately.

9.

Suitable washing and changing facilities shall be provided adjacent to the engine-room.

10.—Definitions.

(a) "Engine-driver" means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity or any other motive power other than manual or animal power—but this clause shall not apply to motors of 15 B.H.P. or under.
(b) Full Payment for Shifts.—After beginning a shift workers shall not be paid less them a full shift's

shift, workers shall not be paid less than a full shift's wages, unless they leave of their own accord, or are dismissed for wilful misconduct.

11.

This Agreement shall be limited in effect to the works and undertakings of the employer situated on the Eastern Goldfields.

This Agreement to commence as and from the 1st May, 1937, and to remain in force for a period of two years from this date.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of Part IXA. of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," of Western Australia this 25th day of May, 1937, between the Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated) (hereinafter called the Asso-ciation) of the one part and the Public Service Com-nuissioner of Western Australia (hereinafter called the Commissioner) of the other part witnesseth as follows:—

1.-Area and Scope.

The Agreement shall apply to all permanent officers employed within the State of Western Australia under "The Public Service Act, 1904," in the Professional Division, whose salaries are less than £700 per annum.

2.—Interpretations.

In this Agreement the following expressions shall, unless the contrary intention appears, have the mean-ings hereby respectively applied to them, namely:— ''1936 Classification'' means the Classification issued

by the Public Service Commissioner to date from 1st January, 1936.

"Grades in 1936 Classification" refers to those grades contained in Public Service Regulation 95.

(b) As regards engineers shall adhere to the number of classes existing under the 1936 classification.

6.—Ex-Cadets.

Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring a University degree or other academic quali-fication approved by the Commissioner may be employed on a probationary period of one year with a salary of £270.

Any person who has graduated through a cadetship requiring the passing of a Public Service examination only may be employed on a probationary period of two years with a salary for the first year of £245 and for the second year £260.

In the event of their appointment being confirmed at the end of the probationary period they shall then be appointed at the commencing salary of the respective class to which they have qualified, but subject to Clause 9, Subclause (f).

This clause shall not operate until after the 30th June, 1937.

7.-Technical Diploma.

A Draftsman who obtains a diploma of the Perth Technical College for Mechanical or Structural Engineering, or an equal or higher qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall advance one grade ahead while in Class 8, and 12 months after reaching the maximum of £306 will be entitled to draw an allowance of £12 per annum until such time as he obtains promotion to a higher class.

8 .- Progression from Minimum to Maximum of Class.

Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a re-port from the Permanent Head regarding the good con-duct, diligence and efficiency of the officers as provided for by the Public Service Regulations, officers shall pro-ceed from the minimum to the maximum of the class by annual increments in the manner provided for in Clause 9 of this Agreement, except where the Commissioner has fixed a limit within a class under Public Service Regulation 106.

9.—Special Provisions to Cover Interval Between Old and. New Classifications.

To enable a transition from existing classes under the 1936 classification, which overlap, to classes provided under Clause 3 of this Agreement, and which obviate overlapping, it is agreed—

(a) If an officer is placed in a class under Clause 3 of this Agreement the maximum salary of which is less than the maximum salary of his 1936 classification, and such officer is drawing the maximum salary under his 1936 classification, he shall continue to draw such higher salary until the 30th June, 1938, provided that—

- (i) If not promoted by that date he shall be reduced to the maximum of his new class.
- (ii) Should an officer appeal to the Public Service Appeal Board against the placing of his position in a class the maximum salary of which is lower than the maximum salary prescribed for his position under the 1936 classification, and the Board decides that his position is placed in the correct class, then he shall be paid the lower salary rate from the date of the Board's decision, but, in any case, not later than the 30th June, 1938.

In the event of the Board's upholding the appeal he shall be paid salary increases under the following subclauses, whichever is applicable.

(b) If an officer has in the 1936 classification a position the maximum salary of which is identical to the maximum salary of the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement he shall proceed to the maximuun of such new class in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until the minimum of such new class is reached, and then by increments according to the grades in such new class.

(c) If an officer is classified under the 1936 classification with a maximum salary one grade lower than the maximum salary of the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement, his salary increments shall be—

- (i) If in receipt of the maximum salary of his 1936 classification on the 28th January, 1937, he shall advance to the maximum salary of his new class on the 1st January, 1938.
- (ii) If the salary of an officer, on the 28th January, 1937, is below the maximum of his 1936 classification, he shall proceed to the maximum of his new class in accordance with the provisions of Subclause (d) of this clause.

(d) If an officer is classified under the 1936 classification with a maximum salary two or more grades lower than the maximum salary in the class in which he is placed under Clause 3 of this Agreement, he shall proceed to the maximum of such new class in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until the minimum of such new class is reached, and then by the grades set out in such new class.

(e) Every officer shall be paid at least the minimum of his new class on or before the 1st July, 1939, and shall thereafter receive annual increments in accordance with the grades in his new class.

(f) All appointments or promotions made after 27th January, 1937, and before the 1st July, 1939, shall be in accordance with the classification scale prescribed in

the 1936 classification, and in such cases officers shall proceed to the maximum of their classes in accordance with the annual incremental scale provided in the 1936 classification until they reach the minimum of their new class, when they will proceed by increments corresponding to the grades in such classes. The provision under Subclause (e) of this clause shall also apply.

10.—Basic Wage.

The salary rates contained herein shall be subject to adjustment in accordance with the basic wage declarations made by the Court of Arbitration in the following manner:—

- (a) Adult Male Officers—The nearest multiple of five pounds (£5) to the result obtained by multiplying the State weekly basic wage by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6).
 Basic wage in the Metropolitan Area as at
 - Basic wage in the Metropolitan Area as at the 1st day of January, 1936, £3 10s. 6d. (deemed to be equivalent to £185 per annum for the purposes of this Agreement).
- (b) Adult Female Officers—Seventy-five per centum of the adult male rate calculated to the nearest £1.
- (c) Officers under 21 years of age—Pro rata with the adult male minimum of £185 per annum.
- (d) Officers located in an area for which an independent basic wage has been declared higher than the metropolitan basic wage shall be paid the difference between such basic wage rates as an allowance.

11.-Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied the rights of officers in respect of all appeals under "The Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920," shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

12 .- Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of five (5) years commencing from 28th January, 1937.

Provided that either party to this Agreement may, after the 28th January, 1938, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement, and if both parties agree such Agreement may be amended by a supplementary Agreement which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.
