Parliament Summoned to Meet for Business.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, | By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, | K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time by Proclamation or otherwise, and also for the said Governor to fix the time and place for the holding of the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: And whereas the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly now stand prorogued until the 29th day of July, 1937: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby further prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 5th day of August, 1937, and also do by this my Proclamation announce and proclaim that the Second Session of the Sixteenth Parliament of Western Australia shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 5th day of August, 1937, at the hour of 12 o'clock noon, in the House of Parliament, in the City of Perth; and Members of the Legislative Council and Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.
