AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 15th day of July, 1937, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934," the Governor may make such Regulations as may be necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the provisions of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby revoke all the Regulations heretofore made and in force under and for the purposes of the said Act and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the new Regulations as set out in the Schedule hereto:—

Schedule.

THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT, 1912-1934.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1934," Regulations.

2. Every medical certificate to the effect that a worker is free from pulmonary tuberculosis, pneumoconiosis, and miners' phthisis, as required by Subsection (11) of Section 7 of the Act shall be in Form A in the Appendix to these Regulations.

3. (1) Every notice from an employer under Subsection (1) of Section 8 of the Act that a worker is suffering from a disease mentioned in the Third Schedule to the Act shall be in Form B in the Appendix to these Regulations.

(2) A copy of every such notice shall be sent by the employer to the Registrar, and, in cases where the disease mentioned in the notice is one which is marked in the Third Schedule to the Act with an asterisk, an additional copy of such notice shall be sent by the employer to the Registrar for submission by the latter to the Commissioner of Public Health.

4. Every notice by a medical practitioner to the Commissioner of Public Health, as required by Subsection (2) of Section 8 of the Act, that a worker is suffering from a disease mentioned in the Third Schedule to the Act which the medical practitioner has reason to believe was contracted by reason of the nature of the worker's employment, shall be in Form C in the Appendix to these Regulations.

5. Every notice of an accident to a worker to be submitted by the employer to the Registrar, as required by Subsection (3) of Section 8 of the Act, shall be in Form D in the Appendix to these Regulations.

6. (1) Every employer desirous of effecting insurance with an incorporated insurance office in compliance with Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act, must first obtain from the Minister in writing his approval of the incorporated insurance office as an incorporated insurance office with which such insurance may be effected.

(2) An employer desirous of obtaining the Minister's approval as aforesaid shall make application for the same in writing to the Minister, stating the name and address of the incorporated insurance office with which the insurance is proposed to be effected, and stating the extent of the insurance proposed to be effected.

(3) The Minister shall not consider any application under paragraph (2) hereof, unless and until he is satisfied that the insurance proposed to be effected covers all liability of the employer under the Act, including liability to pay compensation under the Third Schedule to the Act.

(4) Every renewal of a policy of insurance shall be deemed to be a new policy of insurance for the purposes of this Regulation.

7. (1) Every employer desirous of obtaining exemption from the operation of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act, in accordance with the proviso to the said Subsection (1), shall make application to the Registrar in Form E in the Appendix to these Regulations, and furnish all the particulars therein required.

(2) Where an employer proposes to deposit cash with the Treasury, the amount to be deposited shall be such sum, being not less than £5,000, as the Registrar shall determine and the Minister approve.

(3) Where an employer proposes to deposit securities with the Treasury, such securities and the value thereof shall be subject to the approval of the Minister and the recommendation of the Registrar. Such securities may consist of a bond or guarantee of an insurance company, or of a bank given and executed in Form F in the Appendix to these Regulations, of such amount, being not less than the sum of £5,000, as the Registrar shall determine and the Minister approve, and having a currency of at least one year and renewable at the option of the employer.

(4) Where an employer deposits cash, the Treasurer may invest the same in any investment in which trustees are by law permitted to invest trust moneys, and in such case the security obtained and the income derived from the investment shall be the property of the employer:

Provided that the Treasurer shall hold and keep in safe custody the said security during such time as the employer continues to be exempt as aforesaid, but the Treasurer shall pay to the employer the income derived from the said investment from time to time as it is received by the Treasurer.

(5) Where an employer deposits cash and the Treasurer does not invest the same, such deposit shall bear interest at such rate, not exceeding four pounds per centum per annum, as the Treasurer shall from time to time determine. Such interest shall be payable by the Treasurer to the employer half-yearly until the deposit is returned to the employer.

(6) Every application for exemption shall—

(a) be submitted for the approval of the Minister before being submitted for the consideration of the Governor in Council. The Minister shall decide whether the applicant shall be permitted to deposit cash instead of securities, subject to the recommendation of the Registrar as to the amount of the cash to be deposited, or as to the nature and value of the securities to be deposited;

- (b) when the Minister has made the decisions referred to in subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, and is otherwise satisfied that the applicant is an employer who can properly be exempted from the operation of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act, the decisions aforesaid of the Minister shall be communicated by the Registrar to the applicant, who may then deposit with the Treasury cash or securities, in accordance with the decisions of the Minister aforesaid.

(7) When the applicant has made the deposit with the Treasury, as required by the Minister, the Minister shall, as soon as reasonably may be thereafter, submit the application, with such recommendations as may be necessary, to the Governor in Council for the issue of the Order in Council exempting the applicant from the operation of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act, in accordance with his application. Every such Order in Council shall specify the period for which the exemption is granted and shall not have any force or effect beyond that period.

(8) Insofar as any employer who is now exempted as aforesaid shall have deposited cash with the Treasury in accordance with any regulations heretofore existing and relating thereto, then, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in such previous regulations, the interest payable in respect of such cash deposit as from and including the date of the commencement of this Regulation shall be at such rate, not exceeding four pounds per centum per annum, as the Treasurer shall from time to time determine.

8. Every employer who has obtained exemption from the operation of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act shall, not later than the 1st day of September in each year, submit such particulars of the accidents sustained by workers and the compensation paid during the twelve months ending on the next preceding 30th day of June, as the Registrar may require.

Examination of Worker by Medical Practitioner.

9. (1) Where a worker has given notice of an accident or is in receipt of weekly payments under the Act, he shall not be required to submit himself against his will for examination by a medical practitioner provided by the employer, except at reasonable hours.

(2) A worker in receipt of weekly payments under the Act shall not be required, after a period of one month has elapsed from the date on which the first weekly payment of compensation was made, to submit himself against his will for examination by a medical practitioner provided by the employer more frequently than once a week whilst he continues to receive such weekly payments.

Reference to a Board of Medical Practitioners under Subsection (9) of Section 7.

10. (1) A worker who has procured such a certificate as is mentioned in Subsection (8) of Section 7 of the Act shall forthwith furnish the employer with a copy thereof, together with the name and address of the medical practitioner whom the worker nominates, under Subsection (9) of Section 7 aforesaid, to be a member of the Board referred to in the said Subsection (9), in the event of the employer disputing the said certificate and desiring to refer such dispute to such Board.

(2) If the employer disputes such certificate aforesaid, he may, within seven days after receiving from the worker a copy thereof, give notice to the worker and to the clerk of the Local Court in which proceedings to recover workers' compensation can properly be taken, that he disputes the said certificate and desires the matter to be referred to a Board under and in accordance with Subsection (9) of Section 7 of the Act.

Provided that the Clerk of the Court may, on good cause being shown, extend in any case by not more than ten days the period within which the said notice by the employer may be given; and such extension may be granted, although the said period of seven days shall have already expired.

(3) A notice by an employer under paragraph (2) of this Regulation shall be in writing in Form G in the Appendix to these Regulations; and the copy of such notice sent by the employer to the Clerk of the Local Court shall be accompanied by the following documents:—

- (a) A copy of the certificate aforesaid received by the employer from the worker;
- (b) A copy of the statement received by the employer from the worker, containing the name and address of the medical practitioner nominated by the worker as a member of the Board to which the employer desires the dispute to be referred; and
- (c) A statement of the name and address of the medical practitioner whom the employer nominates as a member of the said Board.

11. (1) Upon receipt of a notice, with the accompanying documents from an employer under Regulation 10 hereof, the clerk of the court shall forthwith send notice to the Registrar that such reference to a Board of Medical Practitioners under Subsection (9) of Section 7 of the Act is desired, together with copies of the notice and accompanying documents received by him from the employer.

(2) The Registrar shall, upon receiving notice from the clerk as aforesaid, obtain the appointment by the Governor in Council of the third medical practitioner to be a member and the Chairman of the Board, and inform such medical practitioner and the medical practitioners nominated respectively by the worker and the employer of their appointment and nomination respectively as members of the Board, and thereafter shall arrange the place and time of meeting of the Board and advise the parties thereof.

(3) The parties shall attend before the Board at the time and place appointed, and shall adduce such evidence as they may respectively desire the Board to hear, and the Board may of its own motion call any evidence and require any examination to be made and information to be procured which it may consider necessary.

(4) The Board shall embody its decision in a report, which shall be signed by the members of the Board in accordance with Form J in the Appendix to these Regulations, as the case may require, and which shall be forwarded to the Registrar, who shall communicate the contents thereof to the parties.

12. A copy of the report received from a Board under Regulation 11 hereof certified by the Registrar shall be admissible as evidence in any proceedings between the

parties brought under the Act to which such report is relevant, and the decision of the Board as contained in such report shall, according to the nature and the tenor thereof, be final and conclusive, and be binding upon the court.

References to Medical Referees.

13. References by employers and workers to medical referees as provided for in Clause 14 of the First Schedule to the Act shall be made under and dealt with in accordance with Rules of Court made under the Act for such purpose.

Medical Fees to be Paid to Medical Practitioners acting as Medical Referees or as Members of Medical Board.

14. Medical practitioners acting as members of a Board constituted under and for the purpose of Subsection (9) of Section 7 of the Act, or as medical referees, or as members of a medical board, to hear an appeal from the decision of a medical referee as provided for in Clause 14 of the First Schedule to the Act, or as members of a medical board constituted by mutual consent of the parties under Clause 14A of the First Schedule to the Act, shall be entitled to receive in consideration of their services fees in accordance with the following scale out of moneys appropriated by Parliament for the administration of the Act, that is to say:—

Appeals.

15. (1) An appeal to a medical board under Clause 14, paragraph (b) of the First Schedule to the Act, shall be brought by the party appellant giving notice to the other party and to the clerk of the court within ten days after the report of the medical referee has been lodged with the clerk, stating that he is dissatisfied with such report and desires to appeal therefrom to a medical board.

(2) The clerk shall forthwith send notice to the Registrar that such appeal has been instituted, together with copies of the medical certificates submitted by the parties and of the medical referee's report.

(3) The persons to constitute such board shall be such as are approved by the Minister. The Registrar shall, on receiving notice from the clerk of court, arrange for the appointment and place and time of meeting of the board and shall advise the parties thereof.

(4) The parties shall attend before the board at the time and place appointed, and shall adduce such evidence as they may respectively desire the board to hear, and the board may of its own motion call any evidence and require any examination to be made and information to be procured which it may consider necessary.

(5) The board shall embody its decision in a report, which shall be signed by the members of the board and be forwarded to the Registrar, who shall communicate the contents thereof to the parties.

Enforcing Charge on Property.

16. (1) The charge created by Section 20 of the Act may be enforced by sale of the property, subject to the charge at such times in such manner and subject to such conditions as the court awarding compensation or damage orders.

(2) For the purpose of this Regulation, the court may make orders from time to time, either of its own motion or on the application of the party entitled to compensation.

Fees.

17. All fees which may be received by the Registrar under or by virtue of these Regulations shall be paid into the Treasury to the credit of the general revenue.

Modification of Forms.

18. When anything is required to be in any of the forms in the Appendix to these Regulations, it shall be sufficient if it be to the like effect and any of such forms may be modified to suit particular cases.

Submission of Statutory Declaration as to Amount of Salaries and Wages Paid.

19. (1) Every employer who has not obtained exemption from the operation of Subsection (1) of Section 10 of the Act, shall furnish to the approved insurance office with which he is or was insured or desires to effect insurance, a statutory declaration showing the amount of salaries and wages paid to and the value of keep provided for the employees engaged in the business described in the policy and coming within the provisions of the Act. Such declaration shall be in Form K in the Appendix to these Regulations and, in the case of a company, shall be made by the secretary, and, in the case of a firm, shall be made by one of the partners.

(2) Such declaration shall be made by—

(a) the employer, who is insured, within one month after the expiration of each period for which the policy was effected or renewed;

(b) the employer, who desires to effect insurance, at the time of effecting such insurance.

20. Any person committing a breach of any of these Regulations may be proceeded against summarily before Justices, and upon conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Road Board of any District may make, alter, and repeal By-laws for all or any purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Bassendean Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in this behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-law:—

1. No person shall damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, bird, fish, fence, building, seat, waterpipe, hose or fitting, treeguard, soil, or other property in any park or public reserve.

2. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, treeguard, wall, or fence, or upon the roof of any building in any park or public reserve.

3. No person shall tether any animal to any tree, shrub, treeguard, wall, or fence in any park or public reserve.

4. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any park or public reserve, or leave therein any bottle, orange peel, banana skins, paper, cast-off clothing, or any refuse or litter.

5. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner or using indecent, profane or insulting language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in any park or public reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any officer or servant of the Board, or by any constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse or cattle to be or to depasture upon any park or public reserve without first having obtained a license from the Board so to do.

7. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall lead, ride, or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle upon or over any portion of any park or public reserve except upon a carriage-way.

8. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any park or public reserve except upon a carriage-way.

9. No person shall, unless authorised by the Board in that behalf, interfere with or remove any plant or flower, or enter or walk upon any bed or border or plot of ground set apart for garden or plantation purposes in any park or public reserve.

10. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park or public reserve any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained written permission from the secretary.

11. No person shall light any fire within any park or public reserve without permission from the secretary.

12. No person shall deface or write upon, or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park or public reserve without the written consent of the Board first obtained.

13. No person shall carry firearms through any park or public reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any bird or animal therein.

14. No person shall use any spring gun or catapult in any park or public reserve.

15. No person shall bathe in any park or public reserve.

16. No person shall in any park or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any caretaker, ranger, or other servant of the Board.

17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any park or public reserve.

18. No person shall gamble, or play pitch and toss or any other game of chance in any park or public reserve.

19. No person shall bring, carry or take into any park or public reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink same therein, nor shall be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control.

20. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry over night in any park or public reserve, or frequent the same for the purpose of camping, lodging or tarrying over night therein.

21. No person or organised club shall practise or play at any game on any park or public reserve without having first obtained a written permit from the Board so to do.

22. No person or organised club having obtained any such permit as aforesaid shall practise or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the parks or public reserves as shall be specified in such permit.

23. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Board or any constable to remove from any park or public reserve any child under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person.

24. No person shall train or exercise any horse or dog within any park or public reserve.

25. No person shall suffer or allow any dog to enter or remain in any part of any park or public reserve laid out as gardens.

26. No person shall erect or place within any park or public reserve any tent, stall, platform, or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the consent of the secretary being first had and obtained.

27. No person shall commit a nuisance on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room, or other building erected on any part of any park or public reserve.

28. No person shall fly any kite or balloon on any park or public reserve.

29. All those parts of the parks and public reserves detailed in the Schedule hereto are set apart for the purpose of children's playgrounds. All such playgrounds shall be reserved for the use of children under the age of fifteen years.

30. No adult and no child over the age of fifteen years shall enter or remain on any such playground, provided that parents or female attendants in charge of

children under the age of fifteen years shall be allowed to accompany such children into any such playground, and to remain thereon with them.

31. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Board, or any constable, to remove from such playground any person or child who is not entitled under this By-law to the use thereof.

32. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

The City of Perth.

By-law No. 31—Hawkers and Stall-keepers.

P.W. 82/37.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Lord Mayor and Councillors of The City of Perth do hereby order that By-law No. 31 be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

By-law No. 31—Hawkers and Stall-keepers.

1. In the construction of this By-law:—

The word "Fish" includes fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked or dried, oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps.

The word "Hawker" has the same meaning as in Section 1 of "The Hawkiers and Pedlars Act, 1892": Provided that it shall not include a baker delivering bread to regular customers.

The word "Council" means the Council of The City of Perth.

The words "Town Clerk" mean the Town Clerk of The City of Perth.

The word "Stall" means a movable or temporarily fixed stall for the sale of any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or other articles of merchandise.

The word "coffee-stall" means a stall kept for the sale of non-intoxicating drink and/or cooked eatables.

The word "Stall-keeper" means any person who keeps and conducts a stall.

2. No person shall hawk any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, or vegetables or other articles of merchandise within Zone 1 or Zone 3 of The City of Perth.

3. No person shall hawk any meat, fish, poultry, game, fruit, or vegetables or other articles of merchandise within Zone 2 of The City of Perth unless and until he shall have obtained from the Council a license so to do, subject, however, to the provisions of Section 181 (h) of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906."

4. No person shall keep or conduct any stall in or near any street or way within any Zone of The City of Perth unless and until he shall have obtained from the Council a license so to do.

5. Every person who wishes to obtain a hawker's or stall-keeper's license shall apply to the Town Clerk therefor stating the term, zone, and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed. The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Council and, when granted, shall be not transferable. Licenses shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule A hereto as shall be applicable, and shall be issued on payment of such fees as are set forth in Schedule B hereto.

No stall-keeper's license now or hereafter issued or granted under the provisions of this By-law shall be deemed to authorise any person to use any stall exceeding six feet in height, measured from the ground vertically to the topmost portion of such stall, eight feet six inches in length over all, and three feet six inches in width over all; and no person shall under such license use any stall exceeding such measurements.

6. For the purpose of regulating the issue of licenses to hawkers and stall-keepers under this By-law, the Municipality shall be divided into three Zones, known as Zone 1, Zone 2, and Zone 3.

Zone 1 shall comprise all that portion of the City of Perth bounded on the north by the north side of Francis street and a line in prolongation thereof to the east side of the Pier street; on the south by the north bank of the Swan river; on the east by the east side of Pier street and a line in prolongation thereof to the north bank of the Swan river; on the west by the west side of Lake street, by a line in prolongation thereof to the west side of King street, by the west side of King street and a line in prolongation thereof to the north bank of the Swan river.

Zone 2 shall comprise the whole of the Municipality which is not included in Zone 1 or Zone 3.

Zone 3 shall comprise the Endowment Lands, the Limekilns Estate, and Reserve 16921, referred to in the preamble to "The City of Perth Endowment Lands Act, 1920."

7. (1) No stall-keeper shall take up a position with his stall in any street or public place within Zone 1, except on one of the undermentioned stands:—

(a) A stand on the western side of William street beginning at a point 39 feet south of the southern side of Hay street, for one stall.

(b) A stand on the northern side of Bridge street beginning at a point 106 feet from the eastern side of Beaufort street, for one stall.

(2) No person shall sell or offer for sale fish, or keep or conduct a coffee-stall on any of the stands in this clause mentioned.

8. (1) Subject to Subclause (3) of this clause, no stall-keeper shall take up a position with his stall for the sale of fish in any street or public place within Zone 1, except on the following stand:—

A stand for one stall on the west side of the Horse-shoe Bridge beginning at a point 38 feet north of the northern side of Wellington street.

(2) No person shall sell or offer for sale any article of merchandise, except fish, on the stand in this clause mentioned.

(3) From and after the 31st day of January, 1938, no stall-keeper shall take up a position with his stall for the sale of fish in any street or public place within Zone 1.

9. No stall-keeper shall take up a position with his stall in any street or public place within Zones 2 and 3.

10. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand shall take up such position thereon as shall be allotted to him by any officer of the Council.

11. No stall-keeper shall take up a position or allow his stall to be or remain upon any stand, except between the hours of 7 a.m. and 11.30 p.m.

12. No stall-keeper whilst upon any stand shall deposit or store any box or basket under his stall or on the roadway or footpath.

13. No stall-keeper whilst upon any stand shall shout his wares or make any violent outcry, noise, or disturbance to the annoyance of the inhabitants of the city or of persons passing by.

14. Every stall-keeper taking up a position on a stand shall place and keep his stall parallel to the kerb and in such a position that the distance between the kerb and his stall shall not exceed one foot.

15. No stall-keeper whilst upon any stand shall place or allow to remain on his stall any flag or streamer.

16. No hawkker shall take up a position in any street or public place or loiter within 200 yards of any public building, theatre, place of amusement, public park, school, swimming baths or hotel, nor shall he loiter within 200 yards of any shop which has for sale any like wares to those being offered for sale by the hawkker, nor shall he remain stationary at any one spot in any street or public place for a longer period than shall be necessary for the purpose of serving a customer then offering to buy.

17. Every hawkker whilst plying his trade, and every stall-keeper whilst on his appointed stand, shall carry with him his license, and shall at all times produce the same on demand to any officer of the Council.

18. Every hawkker whilst plying his trade, and every stall-keeper whilst on his appointed stand, shall have his name, the number of his license, and the words "Licensed Hawkker" or "Licensed Stall-keeper," as the case may be, legibly painted on some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, bundle, bag, package, tray or stall.

19. Should any officer of the Council at any time be of opinion that it is necessary to move any stall-keeper from any appointed stand or place, it shall be lawful for him to direct the said stall-keeper to move to any place he shall deem fit, and any stall-keeper who shall refuse to obey such direction shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

20. Every stall-keeper standing on any appointed stand shall at all times act under the direction of any officer of the Council, and any stall-keeper who refuses to obey such instructions shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

21. Where anything by this By-law is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to

forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law; and every person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence, besides any cost which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty of not less than five shillings and not exceeding twenty pounds (£20); provided that a person convicted of hawkking without a license with a horse and cart or other vehicle, not being a basket or tray carried by him personally, shall be liable to a minimum penalty of ten shillings.

Return Journey.—The return journey may be broken at any station en route, but must be completed within two (2) calendar months from the date stamped on the ticket.

(d) Should there be no train from the break of journey point on the last day on which a journey should be continued, the journey shall be made by a train which is scheduled to reach the destination shown on the ticket within its period of availability.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between the Commissioner of Railways for the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioner"); of the one part, and The Tramways, Electricity Supply, Ferry and Trolley Bus Officers' Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1.—Term of Agreement.

The currency of this Agreement shall be three years from the 18th July, 1936, with the right of review in accordance with the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Amendment Act, 1925."

2.—Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers engaged in The Western Australian Government Tramways, Electricity Supply, and Ferries, except Head of Branch, Sub-heads of Branch, Shift Engineers, and Control Room Operators.

3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) The hours of duty of officers shall be 38 hours per week, exclusive of Sunday time, with the exception of—(i) District Engineer, Cottesloe; (ii) Electric Mains Foreman and Assistant Foreman; (iii) Rolling Stock Foreman and Sub-foreman; (iv) Traffic Running Staff—whose hours of duty shall be 44 hours per week, exclusive of Sunday time: Provided that, where the present custom is to work a lesser number of hours, such custom shall continue.

(b) The hours of duty per week, with the exception of the above-mentioned positions and Receiving and Ferries Clerks on shift work, shall be Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., with one hour for meals, and on Saturday 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

(c) Traffic Running Staff shall not be booked up for duty until they have 12 hours off duty, except to facilitate rotation of shift from Saturday to Sunday.

(d) All shifts shall be completed within 10 hours; half-day shifts to be completed within five hours as from time of first signing on duty to final time of signing off duty.

(e) Signing on and off depots for officers shall be—Head Office, 514 Hay street; Power Station, East Perth; Car Barn, East Perth; Cottesloe District Office; Cook Street Substation; Ferry Office; or any similar depot, as may be established during the currency of this Agreement.

(f) Inspectors shall not be required to work more than five hours fifteen minutes without a meal relief. The minimum time of booking off for a meal shall be forty-five minutes.

4.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours in any one week, and can only be claimed under the following conditions:—

Less than 30 minutes—not to be paid for.

30 minutes and up to 37 minutes—half an hour

38 minutes and up to 52 minutes—three-quarters of an hour

53 minutes and up to 67 minutes—one hour

68 minutes and up to 82 minutes—one hour and a quarter

83 minutes and up to 97 minutes—one hour and a half

and thereafter on a similar basis.

(b) Overtime shall be paid for at the ordinary rate of pay for all time worked in excess of the recognised working hours up to two hours per day; over that period, time and a quarter. All time worked in excess of a spread of twelve hours shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(c) All officers engaged on work which may be defined by the Commissioner as special, in excess of the recognised working hours, shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a quarter for the whole of such overtime.

(d) The recognised hours of duty shall be as laid down in Clause 3 (a) and (b).

(e) In computing the number of hours worked per week, time absent on sick leave and holidays, when paid for, shall be treated as time worked.

(f) Any periods up to five minutes on any days are not to count in the week's total. The first two hours' overtime or any portion thereof in any one day may be adjusted in the week's total. Such adjustment shall take place by being brought on later or booked off earlier, but any overtime beyond the two hours will stand alone and be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(g) Any officer in receipt of a margin over £225 per annum shall not be entitled to overtime pay.

(h) Overtime worked on late specials shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

5.—Sunday Time.

(a) Sunday time will stand alone and be paid for at time and a half rates.

(b) Where less than a full shift is worked on a Sunday, the time worked will be calculated as follows:—

(i) Any officer called upon for Sunday duty shall be paid a minimum of four hours' ordinary pay, except when such time is worked in continuance of a shift beginning on a Saturday or in commencement of a shift terminating on Monday.

(ii) Over half a day and up to and including three-quarters of a day to be counted as three-quarters of a day.

(iii) Over three-quarters and up to one day to be counted as one day.

(iv) An officer who on a Sunday works more than his ordinary week-day rostered shift shall be paid for the actual time worked. A rostered shift shall mean seven hours twenty minutes for those working a forty-four hour week and six hours twenty minutes for those working a thirty-eight hour week.

(c) For the purpose of calculating the hourly rates, the year shall be deemed to consist of 313 days and the day in each case of the usual hours of the officer concerned.

(d) Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be treated as Sunday.

(e) Sunday time shall be paid fortnightly within fourteen days of the last Sunday worked.

6.—Leave of Absence—Annual.

(a) After twelve months' continuous service all officers shall be entitled to annual paid leave of twelve days and public holidays, or days in lieu thereof.

(b) Leave of absence shall be calculated to the close of each financial year, and shall be paid for at the salary the officer is in receipt of at the time such annual leave is taken.

(c) The leave shall be applied for and taken out at a time convenient to the Department before the 30th June following the year for which it fell due. At the expiration of that time the leave shall lapse, unless such leave shall have been deferred by the Department or the permission of the Commissioner obtained for its accumulation.

(d) In urgent cases leave in addition to the foregoing may be granted without pay for a period not exceeding six months. Any public holidays falling due during the period in which an officer is on leave without pay shall not be paid for.

(e) Subject to the proviso hereto, any officer with more than six months' service who may resign or be dismissed from the service, shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays *pro rata* up to the time of leaving the service: Provided that, if an officer be dismissed for being under the influence of liquor or for drunkenness, he shall be entitled to be paid for such leave, if any, as was due up to the 30th June previous, and, if dismissed for peculation, tampering with ticket issues, or manipulation of the books of the Department, he shall not be entitled to payment of any holidays.

(f) The next of kin of a deceased officer shall be granted payment of *pro rata* annual leave to the date of the decease of the officer.

7.—Absence Without Pay.

Any term in excess of three months an officer is absent from duty from any cause without pay shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

8.—Long Service Leave.

(a) The Commissioner shall grant to any officer who has continued on the salaried staff for ten years long service leave for three calendar months on full pay or six calendar months on half pay. For the subsequent

period of ten years the same conditions shall apply, and thereafter for every seven years similar leave shall be granted.

(b) Service prior to attaining the age of eighteen years shall not count in computing long service leave.

(c) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

(d) If a deceased officer leaves a widow, dependent children, mother or invalid sister, payment *pro rata* of long service leave up to the date of such officer's death shall be granted to such dependant or dependants.

(e) (i) Officers regressed to the wages staff and re-appointed to the salaried staff, or appointees from wages to salaried staff shall, for the purpose of this clause, be treated as if the whole of their service had been served on the salaried staff; subject to the proviso that officers who had less than ten years' salaried service but more than ten years' wages and salaried service combined as at the 1st January, 1927, shall be entitled to the first period of leave as from that date.

(ii) For the next period of leave the qualifying service shall be ten years from the 1st January, 1927, and for subsequent leave the qualifying service shall be seven years from the 1st January, 1937.

(f) Any officer who resigns or is retired from the service, except as provided for in Subclause (g), shall be paid for long service leave due at the time of resignation or retirement.

(g) Any officer who retires or is retired upon reaching the retiring age, or through ill-health, shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

(h) An officer dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave other than for leave that had accrued due to him prior to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

(i) A female officer resigning from the service for the purpose of getting married, and who has been continuously employed for three years and over, shall be granted payment *pro rata* of her long service leave at the date of retirement, subject to the proviso in Subclause (b).

9.—Sick Leave.

(a) Any officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall, as soon as possible, advise his superior officer in sufficient time to admit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b) Any officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will be able to resume duty, to enable any necessary arrangements to be made.

(c) Should the absence be prolonged beyond one day, the officer shall forward to his superior officer on the second day thereof a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner, showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

(d) Any officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown in the first certificate shall thereupon furnish a further certificate, and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the periods respectively covered by such certificates: Provided, however, that the maximum period between the dates of furnishing any two medical certificates shall be fourteen days.

(e) In cases where incapacity for duty is obvious to the Head of the Branch, he may relieve the officer of the necessity for providing medical certificates.

(f) Any officer shall, if so directed, present himself for examination by a medical officer, at such time and place as may be fixed.

(g) Any officer who has been absent for three days (not continuous) in one financial year shall, if instructed by his superior officer, furnish a medical certificate for absences of one day only.

(h) Officers who have conformed to the foregoing may be granted sick leave (exclusive of annual and long service leave), as follows:—Officers with six or less than six months' service—nil; officers with more than six months', but less than three years' service—two weeks on full pay for each completed six months' service; officers with three years' service and over—three months on full pay and three months on half pay.

(i) Such leave may be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay provided for must not be exceeded.

(j) In no case shall an officer be granted more than three months on full pay and three months on half pay in any one triennial period, unless otherwise determined by the Commissioner. The triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which payment is claimed.

(k) No payment shall be made for any absence due to an officer's own fault, neglect, or misconduct.

(l) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house will not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence will be granted under this section, excepting under special circumstances, to be approved by the Commissioner.

(m) Where an officer is absent as the result of an accident which occurred on duty and is entitled to compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, half the period of absence only shall be debited against sick leave.

10.—Meal Allowance.

When an officer is instructed to work during or over meal hour he shall be paid a maximum allowance of 2s. per meal, providing he could not conveniently have his meal in the usual way. Outside a radius of 12 miles from Perth, 2s. 6d. per meal shall be paid.

11.—Resignations and Retirements.

(a) No officer shall leave the Department until the expiration of one month's written notice of his intention so to do, without the approval of the Commissioner.

(b) One calendar month's notice in writing shall be given by the Commissioner to any such officer whose services are no longer required.

12.—Reductions in Staff.

If at any time the staff may be reduced, the following shall be the course adopted with regard to the re-employment of retrenched officers, viz.:—

(a) As vacancies occur the officers retrenched shall, in order of seniority of service, have the offer of re-employment in any position in the Department for which they are qualified.

(b) Any officer having left the Department on account of retrenchment and being re-employed within twelve months shall be credited with the period of former service.

13.—Promotions.

(a) Promotion and the selection of any officer to act in a higher position shall be governed by relative ability, suitability, record, and experience. If everything else is deemed equal, the senior officer shall be selected for promotion.

(b) As a general rule, officers and employees of the section in which the vacancy occurs will be promoted to the higher position, but the Commissioner may, when he considers it advisable for the good of the service, select an officer from one section for position in another, either in the same or in a higher range.

(c) When considered necessary, a person from outside the service may be appointed to any position in the service; provided there is not an officer in the service capable of filling the position.

(d) No officer shall refuse compliance with any order directing his transfer from one position to another, but if on appeal the Commissioner is satisfied that the objection is sound, then such officer shall not be penalised.

(e) An officer desiring to be passed over in the event of promotion being offered shall, if his request is acceded to, forfeit all claim to promotion for two years, but if good and sufficient reason be given the Commissioner, he may restore such claim.

(f) All officers promoted to a higher position shall be subject to a probationary period of six months and paid the minimum rate of salary assigned to the range to which they are promoted. At the end of such period the Head of the Branch shall report to the Commissioner as to the fitness of the officer for the higher position; if the report is satisfactory the appointment will be confirmed as from the date of taking up the duty; if unsatisfactory, the officer will be provided for at the same salary as he was in receipt of prior to the period of probation in the higher position: Provided that, where an officer has been in receipt of a salary equivalent to such minimum for twelve months or over, he shall be paid the intermediate rate; if receiving such salary for a period of less than twelve months, the advance to the intermediate rate shall be made twelve months from the date he receives the salary equal to the minimum.

(g) When a vacancy occurs in the service, if the senior officer is not selected for promotion, applications shall be called for the vacancy.

(h) Should a vacancy occur while an officer is on leave, he shall be deemed to have made application for such vacancy, and shall be considered for such position.

(i) All vacancies shall be notified to the staff by a notice exhibited on the Salaried Staff Notice Board in the Head Office for at least seven days prior to filling of such vacancy.

(j) The Union shall be notified of all promotions and/or new appointments within fourteen days of such promotion and/or new appointment.

14.—Temporary Clerks.

(a) Temporary clerks shall not be engaged without the approval of the Commissioner in any position classified above a margin of £85 per annum.

(b) The provisions of Clauses 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, and 17 will apply to temporary clerks.

(c) The provisions of Clause 11, provided that the notice to leave received and given shall be one week in lieu of one calendar month, shall apply to temporary clerks.

(d) The daily rate of pay shall be—

First six months—basic wage, plus margin, 21s. per week.

After six months—basic wage, plus margin, 24s. per week.

15.—Acting in Higher Capacities.

(a) When an officer other than a relief officer performs the duties of a position higher than that in which he is classified for a term exceeding one lunar month continuous or broken, within any one financial year, he shall be paid from the end of that month while performing any such duties at the minimum salary attached to such higher position.

(b) An officer called upon to occupy a higher position temporarily shall be entitled to increments as though he had been permanently promoted to such position; provided that, in the case of the first increment, the officer shall have performed the higher duties for twelve months continuously; provided further, that the officer shall be entitled to receive the second increment if he shall have performed the higher duties for two years continuously.

(c) Absence on annual leave, long service leave, or sick leave on pay shall be counted as service, provided the officer resumes in the same or another higher position.

16.—General.

(a) The word "officer," where used in this Agreement, shall, unless inconsistent with the text, mean male or female.

(b) Officers may, on obtaining approval from their superior officer, exchange shifts.

(c) Where it is necessary to work day and night shifts, officer concerned shall work alternate shifts weekly.

(d) Officers shall be allowed to wear glasses on duty and when passing the eyesight test.

17.—Passes.

(a) Pass available over the Tramway System shall be issued to all officers.

(b) When an officer is on leave a pass available for the period of such leave over the Tramway System shall be issued in favour of his wife and members of his family under eighteen years of age unmarried, unmarried daughters over eighteen years of age, and the parents of an officer: provided that they are resident with and dependent upon him for support.

18.—Payment of Salaries.

(a) Salaries shall be paid fortnightly on each alternate Friday, except where the usual pay day falls on a public holiday, when payment shall be made on the previous Thursday.

(b) A day's salary shall be calculated as one three hundred and thirteenth of yearly rate of salary.

(c) The salary for a fortnight shall be computed by dividing the yearly rate by three hundred and thirteen and multiplying the result by twelve,

(d) The provisions of this Agreement shall be suspended during any period in which by reason of any action on the part of all or of any section of the Commissioner's employees, or for any other cause beyond his control, he is unable wholly or partially to carry on the running of trams, buses, ferries, power house, or the workshops, and the Commissioner will not be liable for payment of salary to any officer whom he does not call upon for duty during any such period.

19.—Rates of Pay.

Basic wage.—The basic rate as referred to in this Agreement shall be that as determined from time to time by the State Court of Arbitration.

(a) Juniors:—The salaries of all male officers under the age of 21 years shall be:—

Provided that, if an adult officer is retained on the maximum margin of the above range, viz., £85 per annum, for five years and has not refused promotion to a higher range, and the Head of the Branch certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of good conduct and efficiency, he may be paid, on the approval of the Commissioner an allowance of £10 per annum.

Provided further, that if such officer is subsequently promoted to a higher range the minimum margin for which is equal to the maximum of the above range plus the £10 allowance, he will be entitled to advancement to the next subdivision of the range to which he is promoted twelve months from the date he received the allowance.

(c) Junior female clerks:—The salaries of all junior female clerks under the age of 21 years shall be:—

(e) Officers occupying the positions set forth in the attached Schedule shall be paid a salary not less than the minimum provided for the range in which such position has been classified; provided that, where an officer has been on the minimum, intermediate, or maximum of his range, he shall be advanced to the equivalent subdivision of the range under this Schedule.

(f) Advancement from minimum to maximum of any range shall be by yearly increments; provided that such advancement shall be approved by the Commissioner upon satisfactory report from the Head of the Branch of the officer's conduct, diligence, and efficiency, and provided also that the advancement in salary shall not be granted to an officer if the Commissioner determines that such officer has been guilty of misconduct which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, justifies the postponement or refusal of the advancement.

(g) An officer who is unable from any cause to perform the duties of his position, and is in consequence provided with employment in another position in a lower range, shall, unless the Commissioner directs otherwise, be paid the maximum rate for the range in which he has been provided.

(h) The rates of pay for all officers shall be adjusted in accordance with the basic wage declaration of the State Court of Arbitration, provided that the basic wage payable shall be the nearest multiple of five pounds (£5) to the result obtained by multiplying the State basic wage by fifty-two and one sixth ($52 \frac{1}{6}$ th).

(i) Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit the power of the Commissioner to pay any officer at a higher rate than that prescribed in any case where he may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the officer occupying such position.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 16 of 1937.

(Registered 19/7/1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 13th day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, between The West Australian Shop Assistants & Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Berryman & Langley, Limited; P. W. Lantzke; B. Mereer, Limited; Producers' Markets Co-operative, Limited; Scanlan & Simper, Limited (hereinafter called "the employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree, the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year from the Thirteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

3.—Definitions.

(a) "Weekly worker" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose contract of service shall be terminated by not less than one (1) week's notice on either side, which may be given at any time. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week.

(b) "Head storeman" shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of two or more men.

(c) "Casual worker" means a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice. Provided that, when engaged on Tuesdays, Thursdays, or Saturdays a casual worker shall receive a minimum payment of not less than two (2) hours' pay. If engaged on Mondays, Wednesdays, or Fridays a casual worker shall receive a minimum payment of not less than four (4) hours' pay.

4.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply in respect of all work performed by any employee who in the course of his duties is employed principally as a storeman in businesses such as those conducted by the parties to this Agreement, but shall not apply in respect of any employee who is employed in the terms of the Carters and Drivers' Award.

5.—Hours.

Forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work, which shall be worked by weekly workers as follows:—

(1) In Fruit and Produce Markets (including Poultry and Carcase Meat Markets), other than Fre-mantle:—

(a) On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, between 4 a.m. and 5 p.m., provided that the spread of hours on those days shall not, in respect of any worker, exceed twelve (12) hours inclusive of meal times.

Meal Times:—In respect of weekly workers, not less than forty-five (45) minutes shall be allowed for lunch, such period to be completed not later than 2 p.m. In respect of weekly workers commencing duty before 5.30 a.m., not less than fifteen (15) minutes shall be allowed for breakfast, to be completed not later than 8 a.m.

In respect of casual workers, not less than half an hour shall be allowed for lunch, such period to be completed not later than 2 p.m. In respect of casual workers commencing duty before 5.30 a.m., not less than fifteen (15) minutes shall be allowed for breakfast, to be completed not later than 8 a.m.

- (b) On Tuesdays and Thursdays, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times:—Three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed for lunch, to be completed not later than 2 p.m.

- (c) On Saturdays, between 7 a.m. and 12 noon.

Provided that any weekly worker required to work on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday in any one week shall be entitled to a full Tuesday or Thursday off during that week, but this shall not apply to any weekly worker who is not, on any day except Friday in that week, called upon to start work before 7 a.m. and who on that Friday is not called upon to start work before 6 a.m.

(2) Provided that, in Fremantle Fruit and Produce Markets, the hours and conditions stated in Subclause (1) hereof shall not apply but the following shall apply:—

- (a) On Mondays, between 6.30 a.m. and 6 p.m.; on Thursdays, between 5.30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times:—Not less than one half hour shall be allowed for lunch, to be completed not later than 2 p.m.

- (b) On Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times:—One (1) hour shall be allowed, to be completed not later than 2 p.m.

- (c) On Saturdays between 8 a.m. and 12 noon.

(3) In respect of the employees of Wholesale Fruit and Produce Packers, the hours and conditions stated in Subclause (1) hereof shall not apply, but the following shall apply:—

- (a) On Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

- (b) On Tuesdays and Thursdays, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times:—On any of the days specified in Subclauses (3) (a) and (b) one (1) hour shall be allowed for lunch, between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

- (c) On Saturdays, between 7 a.m. and noon.

6.—Overtime.

For all time worked by weekly or casual workers—

- (a) After 12 noon on Saturdays and on the holidays specified in Clause 7 (a) hereof, and in respect of casual workers on the holidays specified in Clause 7 (b) hereof, double time shall be paid.

- (b) For all time worked prior to the specified starting or after the specified finishing times, or in excess of the specified spread in any one day, or in excess of forty-eight (48) hours in any one week, time and a half shall be paid.

7.—Holidays.

Weekly workers shall be entitled to the following holidays:—

- (a) Specified holidays:—The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Labour Day, Christmas Day.

- (b) Alternative holidays:—If any weekly worker is called upon to work on any of the following days he shall be allowed one day off in lieu of each day so worked, and shall have same added to his annual holidays:—New Year's Day, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Anniversary Day, and Boxing Day.

- (c) Annual holidays:—Weekly workers shall be entitled to one week's leave on full pay in respect of each year's service. Subject to completion of one year's service, such employees on termination of their employment shall be entitled to leave in the proportion that their incomplete year of service bears to one complete year: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of any worker summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

- (d) Annual leave shall be granted within four (4) months of coming due.

Casual junior workers shall receive fifteen per cent. (15 per cent.) in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein for junior workers.

9.—Proportion of Juniors.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every three or fraction of three adults employed.

10.—Higher Duties.

A worker relieving for a period of no less than two days continuously another worker who is engaged on a higher class of work carrying a higher rate of wage under this Agreement shall be paid the higher minimum rate appropriate to the position whilst so employed.

11.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker, and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive.

12.—Meal Money.

Workers who are required to work for more than one half hour after the prescribed finishing times in Clause (5)—Hours—shall be paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) meal money.

13.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement, may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant Union. If within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the secretary and worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the said Magistrate, and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the said Magistrate and, pending the decision thereon, in either case the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant to such worker a period to work at such wage and for such period, not exceeding six calendar months, as he thinks fit, and his decision in the

matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned, and for such period as may be therein stated, until the wage shall be again settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said secretary.

14.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—

- (1) Name in full;
- (2) Age and date of birth.
- (a) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.
- (b) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate; Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.
