WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with

the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of three years as from the 20th day of November, 1937.

Schedule.

Princess Royal Harbour (Albany):—All that area of Western Australian waters on the northern side of Princess Royal Harbour, Albany, north of a line drawn from Residency Point to the southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the southern extremity of the Deep Water Jetty, and thence north-easterly to Point King.

PURSUANT to Sections 19 and 20 of the above-mentioned Act His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and exempts such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description of Proposed Works—Metropolitan Sewerage, Area No. 1, South Perth:—Alteration of route of sewer lines.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage, Maylands-Inglewood System, Proposed Pumping Station, and Rising Main, Pumping Station No. 5:—Concrete tanks, with brick and tile superstructure, electric pumps, and all apparatus connected therewith and rising main, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5971.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-1935," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Perth Road Board, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby amend its By-laws as follows:—

Part I.—General Sanitary Provisions.

By adding the following paragraph to Clause 32:—

(d) The drains provided for in paragraph (c) must be so arranged and constructed as to prevent water therefrom dropping upon or running over any public street, or way, or causing dampness in any part of any wall or foundation of any building, either on the owner's or adjacent premises, or damaging any adjoining property.

If the conditions of any locality make it necessary the owner shall, when so ordered by the Local Authority, cause the drains to discharge into the nearest stormwater channel, or into a soak well or wells having a total capacity equal to four cubic feet for every 100 square feet of roof area. Soak wells are to be lined with bricks laid with open joints and to be provided with an impervious cover of reinforced concrete or jarrah planks covered with sheet iron.

Details of design and construction are to be to the approval of the inspector.

THE INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1935.

No. 37 of 1936.

Between Coastal Aerated Water and Cordial Manufacturers Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Mackay's Aerated Water Company, "Golden West" Aerated Water Company, Arlington's Aerated Water Factory, B.C.D. and Piesse, Limited; Shamrock Aerated Water Company, Thistle Aerated Water Company, Weaver and Loek, W. Letchford, Atkinson's Aerated Water Factory, Metropolitan Aerated Water Company, Rowland's Aerated Water Factory, Dux Aerated Water Factory, Hollywood Brewery, "Silver Rose" Aerated Water Factory, "Silver Cascade" Aerated Water Factory, and Mr. Waltho, Respondents.

THE Industrial Board for the industry of Aerated Water and Cordial Manufacturing, in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed in the industry of Cordial and Aerated Water Manufacturing.

2.—Definition.

In this Award, the term "Casual hand" shall mean a person employed in the trade who has not been continuously employed by the same employer for a period of four (4) calendar months.

3.—Hours.

(i) (a) Forty-four (44) hours (exclusive of the time off for meal time) shall constitute a week's work for all employees.

(b) The time for commencing work for all workers (except carters and stablemen) shall be 8 a.m. and the finishing time shall be 5 p.m., except on Saturday, when the finishing time shall be 12 o'clock noon.

The working hours for carters shall be between 7.30 a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m. on Monday to Friday and between 7.30 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

(c) An allowance of at least one hour off for meal times shall be made on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and shall be between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 2 o'clock p.m.

(d) Except in the case of a stableman, the working hours shall be deemed to include all time between the times the worker commences and finishes work each day: Provided that the time allowed off as meal time be deducted.

(ii) (a) The week's work for stablemen shall consist of forty-four (44) hours, and such hours shall be worked between 7 a.m. on Mondays and 5 p.m. on Sundays.

(b) Stablemen shall not be entitled to payment at overtime rates for work performed by them as stablemen: Provided that all time worked in excess of the time which is mutually arranged between the employer and a stableman for Sunday work is to be paid for at overtime rate of ordinary overtime in addition to the weekly wage; and provided further that, if a stableman is required to do driver's work, he shall whilst so employed be classed and paid at the rates herein prescribed for a driver.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for three (3) years from the date of its delivery, and any party affected by its provisions may, after the expiration of the first twelve (12) months from the date of the Award, or after the expiration of any subsequent twelve (12) months thereto, apply to the Court of Arbitration to alter, amend, or revise the same.

5.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the weekly or daily hours hereinbefore mentioned shall be considered overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

6.—Holidays.

(a) The weekly half-holiday shall be observed on Saturday.

(b) Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Labour Day shall be allowed and paid for as holidays and in respect of which no deduction shall be made from the weekly wage.

(c) During a week in which any of the foregoing holidays occur the weekly working hours shall be suitably reduced. A worker, other than a stableman, required to work on any of the said holidays, inclusive of looking after horses, shall be entitled to ordinary time for all time he is employed on those days, in addition to the prescribed wages.

(d) A worker other than a stableman required to work on a Sunday, inclusive of looking after horses, shall be entitled to payment at the rate of double time and a half for all time he is employed on a Sunday.

(e) A holiday of six (6) days on full pay shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service.

(f) A worker upon completing four (4) months' service in any one year, but not completing such year in the service of the employer, shall be granted in lieu of holidays pay in proportion to the length of his service during such year.

(g) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his employment for any cause whatsoever.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for gross misconduct, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall lose all rights under the holiday clause.

(i) On any public holidays other than those mentioned in Subclause (b) of this Clause (6), where an employer and the majority of the workers employed by him mutually agree that such day shall be observed as a holiday, the employer's establishment may be closed, and in such case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if the establishment be kept open and work done, then ordinary rates shall apply.

7.—Weekly Engagement.

(a) After being continuously employed for a period of four (4) calendar months, a week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate employment.

(b) In other cases twenty-four (24) hours' notice shall be sufficient to terminate employment, and the employer shall be entitled to retain in hand one day's pay until such notice has expired.

9.—Proportion of Junior Workers.

(a) The number of junior workers employed in any factory shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one junior worker to each four (4) or fraction of four (4) adult workers (excluding drivers) in receipt of the minimum rates herein—before prescribed for workers other than junior workers.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding subclause, it shall be permissible for each driver, if the employer considers it necessary, to have one junior male worker to assist him.

10.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to perform work in any grade other than that for which he was engaged and where such work is prescribed for at a higher rate shall be paid such higher rate of wage for such time as he is employed on such higher grade of work.

11.—Rates of Wages.

No worker who on the date of this Award coming into operation is in receipt of a higher wage than that which is prescribed by the Award shall suffer any reduction in wage, but his employment shall be continued at not less than the rate then paid him.

12.—Weekly Payments.

All wages shall be paid weekly, excepting in the case of casual workers.

13.—Record Book.

Each employer shall keep at his factory, or at each of his factories if he has more than one, a Time and Wages Book, in which shall be entered the name of each worker. Each worker shall sign such book on commencing and finishing work each day. The book shall show the number of hours worked, the amount of overtime worked, and the wage paid.

Each worker shall be required to sign the book on receipt of the amount due to him. The employer and the worker shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book, which shall be open and available for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the employers' or workers' union during working hours.

14.—Posting Award.

The employer shall cause to be posted up at his factory, or at each of his factories if he has more than one, a copy of this Award in some position where it shall be visible and open to the inspection of the workers.

15.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

16.—General Conditions.

(a) No employer shall be permitted to hire his turn-outs to any worker for a lesser rate than ten shillings (10s.) per day, exclusive of petrol or other running expenses.

(b) Any worker employed by an employer to sell on commission shall receive at least the minimum rates of pay provided for under the terms of this Award, and shall at all times whilst so employed be bound by the provisions of this Award.

17.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

18.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

- (i) Name in full.
- (ii) Age and date of birth.
- (iii) Name of each previous employer, and length of service with such employer.
- (iv) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be indorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully misstate his age in the above certificate he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

19.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half-day for each completed month of service: provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from duty, except on account of sickness in accordance with Subclause (a) hereof.

THE WEST AUSTRALIAN CLEANERS, CARE-TAKERS, LIFT ATTENDANTS, WINDOW CLEANERS, ATTENDANTS AND WATCHMEN'S INDUSTRIAL UNION OF WORKERS (PERTH).

Agreement of minimum rates of pay and terms and conditions of employment.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(State Gardens Board and Zoological Gardens.)

No 26 of 1937.

(Registered 20/10/1937.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," this 18th day of October, 1937, between the West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners, Attendants, and Watchmen's Industrial Union of Workers (Perth) (hereinafter called the Union), on the one part, and the State Gardens Board and Zoological Gardens (hereinafter called the Board), of the other part: witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows:—

1.

This Agreement shall apply to workers following the avocations mentioned herein and employed by the aforementioned Boards.

2.—Term.

(a) This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of three years from date thereof: provided that, at any time or times after the expiration of the first year, either party shall have the right to demand a review of the Agreement or any part thereof by giving one month's notice in writing to the other party.

(b) In the event of the parties failing to agree in regard to any items on which a variation is sought, it is agreed that such items shall be referred to the Board of Reference appointed under Section 24.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall operate over that portion of Western Australia coming within the jurisdiction of the Zoological Gardens Board and the State Gardens Board of Western Australia.

4.—Hours of Labour.

The ordinary hours of all workers shall not exceed 44 hours in any week and shall be worked as far as possible between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

5.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the usual hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours after the usual time for ceasing work, and double time thereafter: provided further, that workers called upon to start work more than an hour and a half prior to

the usual starting time shall be paid at the rate of time and a half until the usual starting time. Provided that, wherever employees are required to work on Sundays and holidays, such work shall be portion of the week's work, without payment of overtime rates, unless the hours to be worked as above are exceeded.

6.—Meals.

Each worker shall be allowed one hour for a meal between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

7.—Wages.

The weekly rates of wages payable to workers shall be as follows:—

thereafter according to the work performed.

8.—Annual Leave.

(a) Each employee, except casuals, shall be entitled to one day's holiday for each month of service. Holidays taken on or on account of public holidays shall be deducted from these 12 days and the balance shall be taken in a period.

(b) A worker who leaves his employment or is dismissed, or retired, shall be entitled to receive one day's holiday pay for each month worked since previous holidays, or since the date of engagement, less any days already taken.

(c) Where a worker is dismissed for gross misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of Subclauses "A" and "B."

9.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service of all workers other than casual workers shall be a weekly one, terminable by one week's notice on either side. Provided that the employer may at any time dismiss a worker for insubordination, dishonesty, or drunkenness, and the worker shall be paid all wages due to him up to the time of his dismissal.

(b) Provided further, that such notice shall not be continued from week to week.

(c) The engagement of a casual worker may be terminated at any time without notice: provided that all wages due to him shall be paid immediately upon the termination of his engagement.

10.—Holidays.

The following days or the days observed in lieu shall be observed as holidays, and all workers other than casual workers shall be paid for such days, namely—New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Xmas Day, and Boxing Day. These days, however, shall be worked by employees, if required by the Board, without penalty rates.

11.—Time and Wages Book.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a Time Book and Wages Sheet, in either of which shall be entered:—

- (1) The name of each worker to whom this Agreement applies;
- (2) the nature of the work performed;
- (3) the hours worked each day;

(4) the wages and overtime (if any) paid to each worker;

(5) in the case of junior workers, the age of each junior worker last birthday.

Workers shall record their starting and finishing times daily in the Time Book; and shall sign the Wages Sheet on receipt of their wages.

(b) The Time Book, with all entries therein, shall on demand be produced for inspection by the secretary or duly authorised official of the Union at any reasonable time. The Wages Sheet shall be similarly produced on demand during ordinary office hours.

12.—Posting Award.

A copy of this Award shall be posted in a suitable place on the premises of every employer.

13.—Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of a worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. Evidence satisfactory to the Board shall be produced before payment of any wages is made under this clause.

14.—Higher Duties.

Any worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher minimum than his regular pay for two (2) hours in any day shall be paid such higher minimum for the whole of that day. Provided that acting time less than two (2) hours in any one shift shall not be counted.

15.—Appliances and Materials.

(a) All materials, appliances, and tools, excepting carpenters' tools, required in connection with the performance of the worker's duties shall be supplied to such worker by the employer without charge.

(b) Uniforms.—In every case where the Board requires an employee to wear a uniform for his work the same shall be supplied by the Board.

16.—Travelling Time.

Where a worker is sent to work from an employer's recognised place of business, the employer shall pay all travelling time from such place of business to the job, and, if the worker is required to return the same day to the employer's place of business, the employer shall pay travelling time to the place of business.

Provided that a maintenance man may be required to report for work at any of the Board's premises at the usual time of starting, without payment for travelling time. A worker sent for duty to a place other than his regular place of duty shall be paid his excess travelling expenses.

17.—Change Room.

Suitable dressing accommodation shall be provided by the employer where employees may change their clothes. Tools and appliances shall not be kept in the dressing room.

18.—Boiling Water.

All workers shall be provided with facilities for boiling water.

19.—Place for Partaking of Meals.

Workers shall be permitted to eat their meals in a convenient and clean place, protected from the weather, and each such worker shall remove all litter and foodstuff after use.

20.—Payment of Wages.

All workers (other than casual workers) shall be paid once weekly.

21.—Preference.

Every person who is at present employed, or who may at any time hereafter become employed, on work to which this agreement applies, shall not be continued in employment unless he or she is a member of the West Australian Cleaners, Caretakers, Lift Attendants, Window Cleaners,

Attendants, Watchmen, and Domesticies' Industrial Union of Workers (Perth), or makes application to join the said Union within fourteen (14) days of engagement.

Provided that any person who is a member of another recognised Union shall not be required to join the Cleaners and Caretakers' Union until the expiry of his current ticket with such other Union.

Provided also, that this clause shall not operate in regard to casual workers.

22.—Board of Reference.

A Board of Reference is hereby appointed for the purpose of this Agreement. Such Board shall consist of the Industrial Registrar or his nominee, who shall be Chairman, and four (4) representatives, two (2) to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of disagreement, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between parties;
- (b) classifying and fixing wages rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;
- (c) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.
- (d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

23.—Definitions.

(1) The "State Gardens Board" and "Zoological Gardens Board" shall mean the persons appointed by the Governor to control the Zoological Gardens, South Perth; Stirling Gardens, Perth, and such other areas as are now or may hereafter be placed under their control.

(2) "Superintendent" shall mean the person in charge of a section of the Board's operations and particularly refers to the Government Gardener (Mr. Gates), the Superintendent of the Zoological Gardens (Mr. Davey), and the Superintendent, Yanchep Park (Mr. Walton). This Agreement shall not be deemed to affect the above positions in any manner.

(3) "Head keeper" shall mean a worker performing the work of a keeper and who is placed in charge of the other keepers.

(4) "Keeper" shall mean any worker whose principal duties are the feeding, tending, or in any other way caring for any animal, bird, reptile, or other creature, and is in charge of the round, or preparing by slaughter food for any such animal.

(5) "Assistant keeper" means a worker who assists the keeper in his round and who relieves a keeper for not more than two days in each week. If he relieves a keeper for more than two days in any week he shall be paid as a keeper for such additional time.

(6) "Ground attendant" shall mean a worker who is substantially employed in care of tennis courts, lawns, and paths but shall not include gardeners or garden labourers.

(7) "Maintenance man" shall mean a worker mainly employed on general repairs to buildings, water supply, pumps, and other property of the employer, and in general construction and maintenance work.

(8) "Caretaker" shall mean a worker who is required by his employer to reside on or in the vicinity of the premises of his employer, but shall not include superintendents.

(9) "Guide" shall mean a worker substantially employed conducting persons through the caves controlled by the aforementioned Board.

(10) "Gardener" shall mean a worker who is in charge of a garden or portion thereof and responsible only to the Government Gardener or Superintendent. It shall not include a garden labourer.

(11) "Nurseryman" shall mean a worker in charge of the nursery and responsible for all propagation.

(12) "Parking area attendant" shall mean a man whose principal duty is to control parking in any area and collect dues on vehicles.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 27 of 1937.

(Registered 27/10/1937.)

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935," of Western Australia, this Twenty-third day of October, 1937, between the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust (hereinafter referred to as "the employers"), of the one part, and the Merchant Service Guild of Australasia, Western Australian Section, Union of Workers, Fremantle (hereinafter referred to as "the employees"), of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

Coxswains and Drivers

(other than on M.L. "Victor").

(1).—Hours of Duty.

(a) The hours of duty shall not exceed eight (8) per day, and during the continuance of the present system of shifts shall be worked as under:—

(b) Provided that the full complement for the shift is at all times maintained and the employees are at their posts not materially longer than the eight hours in any shift, and provided also, that the approval of the employers is obtained thereto in each instance, mutual arrangements may be permitted between employees as to the changing, commencing, or finishing of any shift.

(2).—Rate of Pay.

Basic wage—£3 14s. 11d. per week.

(a) The rate of pay shall be £8 6s. per week of 56 hours, and wages shall be payable fortnightly.

(b) If during the currency of this Agreement the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage for the Metropolitan Area differing in amount from that now prescribed, then the marginal difference between the present basic wage and the rate of pay herein agreed upon shall be deemed to be increased or decreased, as the case may be, to the same extent as the present basic wage may be decreased or increased to the intent that the rate herein agreed upon shall remain constant.

(3).—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean and include all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one shift, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and half per hour: provided that, where such excess period does not exceed half an hour, overtime shall not be payable, but thereafter a fraction of an hour shall be counted as an hour, and provided also that overtime shall not be payable where the excess period of duty arises owing to the mutual relief arrangements permitted under Clause 1 (b).

(4)—Contract of Service.

Employees shall be deemed to be engaged on a monthly basis, and one month's notice shall be given on either side to terminate such engagement: provided that an employee may be instantly suspended or dismissed without notice for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

(5).—Annual Leave.

(a) An employee who serves the employers continuously for a period of twelve months shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for an unbroken period of thirty days. Such leave shall at all times be granted at the convenience of the employers, and shall be taken in accordance with a roster prepared each year.

(b) If the employee serves continuously for one month or more but for less than twelve months, he shall be entitled to payment in lieu of leave for the proportion of thirty days as his length of service is to the full year.

(6).—Long Service Leave.

Employees shall be granted three months' long service leave after each seven years' service, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the next grant of such leave.

(7).—Sick Leave.

(a) An employee who is incapacitated through sickness or injury other than that arising out of or in the course of his employment may be granted sick leave with pay for a period of or periods not exceeding in the aggregate one month in any year, upon production within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence of a medical certificate as to his incapacity.

(b) Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or where a medical certificate is not furnished as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for a period of or periods aggregating one month during the preceding twelve months, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.

(c) Upon the period of absence in any instance exceeding one month, or in the case of paragraph (b) hereof, immediately an employee absents himself, the contract of service shall be deemed to have been terminated without requiring further notice by the employers, who shall thereby be relieved of any further obligation to the employee: provided that any such period of incapacity may at the discretion of the employers be regarded as leave without pay.

Driver M.L. "Victor."

(8).—Hours of Duty.

The hours of duty shall be 44 per week, between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on all days Mondays to Fridays inclusive, and 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.

(9).—Rate of Pay.

Basic wage—£3 14s. 11d. per week.

The rate of pay shall be £6 per week, payable weekly, and shall be subject to the same condition as expressed in Clause 2 (b) hereof.

(10).—Overtime.

Overtime shall mean and include all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours on any week day or four (4) hours on Saturday, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half per hour.

(11).—Contract of Service.

Engagement shall be on a weekly basis and one week's notice shall be given on either side to terminate the engagement: provided that an employee may be instantly suspended or dismissed without notice for insobriety, misconduct, or neglect of duty.

(12).—Leave.

(a) An employee who serves the employers continuously for twelve months shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for a period of two weeks. Where the period of service is less than twelve months but exceeds one month, the leave shall be *pro rata* as the length of service is to the full year.

(b) Employees shall be entitled to long service leave in accordance with the conditions authorised by the Government of Western Australia for wages employees.

(c) Annual and long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the employers.

(d) Sick leave may be granted subject to the same conditions as are prescribed in Clause 7 of this Agreement, excepting that for the term "one month," wherever appearing therein, the term "one week" is to be substituted.

General.

(13).—Sickness or Accident when on Duty.

(a) An employee who in the course of his employment and while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employers receives an injury or contracts any sickness which incapacitates him from duty shall be entitled to receive in addition to the benefits prescribed under "The Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1924," the difference between the compensation provided for under that Act and the wages prescribed in this Agreement, for a period not exceeding three months.

(b) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the manner provided for the payment of wages.

(14).—Uniforms.

The employers shall provide all employees with uniforms free of cost after each eight months' continuous service, an oilskin coat and sou'-wester each year, and to coxswains only a great coat every four years. Uniforms shall belong to the employers and shall be worn by employees when on duty. Should the service of any employee terminate within one month from the date of issue of uniforms or any portion of them, all the issue last made to that employee shall be returned to the employers before the employee shall be entitled to be paid any moneys which may be due to him.

(15).—Board of Reference.

Should any dispute arise between an employee and the employers, the service concerned shall be continued without any cessation and the matter referred to a Board of Reference consisting of two representatives each of the employee and employers and a Chairman, to be mutually agreed upon by those representatives; failing their agreement the Registrar of the Court of Arbitration shall act as Chairman.

(16).—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all employees directly engaged or acting as coxswain or driver on any of the employers' launches, and the area covered shall be all the sea and coastline within a radius of twenty miles from North Mole Lighthouse, and in addition, the Swan River to and including Perth waters, and the Canning River to Lower Canning Bridge.

(17).—Period of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of three years from date of signing, and thereafter subject to one month's notice from either party.
