WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 13.05-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from—(a) Taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever by any means of capture whatsoever, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of do hereby, in exercise of the power aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1938, until the 31st day of December, 1938, inclusive, provided that, subject to certain provisions (vide separate Proclamation), it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary north of a line drawn from the south-eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the north-western corner of Leschenault Location 31 between the hours of twelve o'clock noon on Monday to twelve o'clock noon on Tuesday and from twelve o'clock noon on Thursday to twelve o'clock noon on Friday in each week.

POOR PERSONS LEGAL ASSISTANCE ACT, 1928-31.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council, pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 14 of "The Poor Persons Legal Assistance Act, 1928-31," has approved of the repeal of the Second Appendix to the Regulations made thereunder as published in the Government Gazette of the 25th October, 1929, and of the substitution in lieu thereof of the Appendix as set forth hereunder:—

· SECOND APPENDIX,

Scale of Fees and Costs to be Paid to Legal Practitioners representing a Poor Person.

Part 1-Criminal Matters.

- 1. (a) For preparing statement of case—10s. 6d., or such additional fee as the Minister shall think fit.
- (b) For defending a prisoner on a capital charge, according to the following scale:-

For the defence of each prisoner pleading not guilty where the circumstances preclude defence by one counsel of all prisoners charged

For the defence of aboriginal natives charged with murder arising out of tribal custom or dispute—

(c) For defending a prisoner on a charge of any other indictable offence, two-thirds of the appropriate fee prescribed in paragraph (b) hereof.

Any departure from the above scale for criminal cases is only to be approved in exceptional circumstances and on the recommendation of the presiding Judge.

Part 2-In matters other than Criminal Matters.

- 2. (a) Where a public solicitor or person holding an appointment from the Crown is assigned as counsel or solicitor to a poor person, all costs recovered in the action or proceeding shall be paid to Consolidated Revenue.
- (b) In any instance where the poor person recovers in value and not in money, such poor person may be called upon to pay such out-of-pocket expenses and costs incurred as may be approved by the Minister, but in any event the amount shall not be greater than one-fourth of the costs (exclusive of out-of-pocket expenses) as fixed by any scale applicable to the proceedings.
- (c) Where, in proceedings conducted by a practitioner on behalf of a poor person costs have been awarded to such poor person, or have been agreed between the parties and are recovered from the other party to such proceedings, or costs are recovered by the Crown from a poor person under Section 11 of the Act, then the costs so re-

covered shall be paid to Consolidated Revenue, and the amount to be paid to the practitioner acting on behalf of the poor person shall be the amount thereof or such part thereof as the Minister shall direct.

- (d) Where a practitioner is assigned by the Minister to act on behalf of a poor person and no costs are recoverable or recovered in the proceedings, the amounts to be paid to the said practitioner shall be, in all matters, exclusive of those in Criminal actions, on the following bases:-
 - (i) In Local Court Actions: Out of pocket expenses plus 25% of the scale allowance for costs as prescribed by the Local Court Rules.
 - (ii) In Supreme Court Actions or Appeals: Out-of-pocket expenses plus 10% of the scale allowance for costs as prescribed by the Supreme Court Rules.
- (e) In all other proceedings where legal assistance is afforded, the payment to a practitioner shall be: Out-of-pocket expenses plus such amount as may be approved by the Minister.

For the purposes of this Part:-

- (a) Counsel fees shall be deemed profit costs and not disbursements.
- (b) The term "profit costs" shall mean the profit costs, including counsel fees. which would be charged by the practitioner under the ordinary scale if he were rendering for taxation a party and party bill for payment by the opposite party

Provided that nothing herein shall operate so as to prohibit the payment to a practitioner of solicitor and client costs in excess of party and party costs recovered in cases coming within Section 11 of the Act, if the Minister shall so direct.

Provided also, that in any case where the poor person fails to recover judgment for anything on his claim or recovers judgment for less than the amount or value claimed, the practitioner shall be paid his costs under above Clause 2 (d) and the same shall be according to the scale applicable to the amount or value claimed, unless the Minister is of the opinion that, having regard to the circumstances of the case, the amount of costs to be paid to the practitioner should be less than the amount of such costs when ascertained in accordance with this proviso, in which case the costs to be paid to the practitioner shall be determined and fixed by the Minister.

BY-LAWS No. 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, and 92, made by the Wiluna Road Board on the 19th day of February, 1931, and published in the Government Gazette on the 14th day of August, 1931, are hereby repealed and the following By-law substituted therefor:—

By-law for the Management of Reserves under the Control of the Board and the Playing of Games thereon.

- 86. 1. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - (a) The word "Reserve" shall mean the ground owned by, vested in, or otherwise under the control of the Board.
 - (b) The word "Caretaker" shall mean any person appointed by the Board to take care of any reserve or reserves.
 - (c) "Servant" shall mean and include any person employed by the Wiluna Road Board.
- 2. No person shall damage or interfere with any tree, shrub, fence, building, seat, waterpipe, hose or fitting, treeguard, soil, or other property in any park or public reserve.

- 3. No person shall climb or be upon any tree, shrub, treeguard, wall, or fence in any park or public reserve.
- 4. No person shall tether any animal to any tree, shrub, treeguard, wall, or fence in any park or public reserve.
- 5. No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any park or public reserve, or leave therein any bottle, orange peel, banana skins, paper, cast-off clothing, or any refuse or litter.
- 6. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or using indecent, profane, or insulting language, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or making harangues whereby a crowd is collected, or committing any act of indecency in any park or public reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by any officer or servant of the Board or by any constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 7. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse or cattle to be or to depasture upon any park or public reserve without first having obtained a license from the Board to do so.
- 8. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall lead, ride, or drive any horse, cattle, bicycle, tricycle, or vehicle upon or over any portion of any park or public reserve, except upon a carriage way.
- 9. No person, unless authorised in that behalf by the Board, shall leave any vehicle, whether in charge of any person or not, stationary upon any park or public reserve except upon a carriage way.
- 10. No person shall, unless authorised by the Board in that behalf, interfere with or remove any plant or flower, or enter or walk upon any bed or border or plot of ground set apart for garden or plantation purposes in any park or public reserve.
- 11. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in any park or public reserve any goods or articles of any description, without having previously obtained written permission from the secretary.
- 12. No person shall light any fire within any park or public reserve without permission from the secretary.
- 13. No person shall deface or write upon, or post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, writing, or picture whatsoever upon any tree, building, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging or path in or around any park or public reserve without the written consent of the Board first obtained.
- 14. No person shall carry firearms through any park or public reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any bird or animal therein.
- 15. No person shall use any spring gun or catapult in any park or public reserve.
- 16. No person shall in any park or public reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use thereof, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult, or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any caretaker or other servant of the board.
- 17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within any park or public reserve.
- 18. No person shall gamble or play pitch and toss or any other game of chance in any park or public reserve.
- 19. No person shall bring, carry or take into any park or public reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink same therein, nor shall be found therein, having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control, without the written consent of the Board first obtained.
- 20. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry over night in any park or public reserve, or frequent the same for the purpose of eamping, lodging, or tarrying over night therein.
- 21. No person or organised club shall practise or play at any game on any park or public reserve without having first obtained a written permit from the Board so to do.

- 22. No person or organised club having obtained any such permit as aforesaid shall practise or play at any such game, except at such times and upon such portions of the parks or public reserves as shall be specified in such permit.
- 23. The sums to be charged by the Board to the various persons, clubs, sporting bodies, or associations for the use of any reserve or any portion thereof shall be such as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.
- 24. The Board may grant the exclusive use of any reserve or any portion thereof to any particular person, club, sporting body, or association for any particular day or days, and the fees to be charged to the public for admission shall be such as shall be fixed with the consent of the Board, by the person, club, sporting body or association to whom such exclusive use shall be granted.
- 25. Application for the use of any recreation reserve shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Board not less than one week before reserve is required.
- 26. The Board reserve the right to refuse to rent any reserve or portion thereof to any applicant without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- 27. No person shall train or exercise any horse or dog within any park or public reserve.
- 28. No person shall suffer or allow any dog to enter or remain in any part of any park or public reserve laid out as gardens.
- 29. No person shall erect or place within any park or public reserve any tent, stall, platform, or table for public amusement or for any performance, whether for gain or otherwise, without the consent of the secretary being first had and obtained.
- 30. No person shall commit a nuisance on or in any part of any pavilion, dressing room, or other building erected on any part of any park or public reserve.
- 31. No person shall fly any kite or balloon on any park or public reserve.
- 32. All those parts of the parks and public reserves detailed by erection of notices thereon giving notice that such parts are set apart for the purpose of children's playgrounds shall be reserved for the use of children under the age of fifteen years.
- 33. No adult and no child over the age of fifteen years shall enter or remain on any such playground: provided that parents or female attendants in charge of children under the age of fifteen years shall be allowed to accompany such children into any such playground and to remain thereon with them.
- 34. It shall be lawful for any officer or servant of the Board or any constable to remove from such playground any person or child who is not entitled under this By-law to the use thereof,
- 35. No male person, except children under the age of seven years accompanied by females, shall enter any place set aside for the use of females.
- 36. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

TRADE DESCRIPTIONS AND FALSE ADVERTISEMENTS ACT, 1936.

Regulations.

These Regulations may be cited as the Trade Descriptions Regulations, 1937, 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade Descriptions Regulations, 1937, and shall take effect from the 1st day of January, 1938, provided that they shall not apply to goods held in stock by a retailer prior to such last-mentioned date, but this proviso shall not operate beyond the 31st day of December, 1938.

2. These Regulations shall apply to the several descriptions of goods specified in the Schedule to the Act and to the extent hereinafter mentioned.

3. In affixing the prescribed trade descriptions under these Regulations it shall not be necessary to specify the name and address of the manufacturer in regard to the following classes of goods:—

following classes of goods:-

Clothing and materials for clothing made wholly or mainly of wool.

Bedding.

Blankets

Flannel. Rugs

Clothing and Materials for Clothing made wholly or mainly of Wool.

- (1) In addition to the particular requirements of Regulations Nos. 12 to 16 inclusive the following Regulations shall apply specifically to clothing and materials for clothing made wholly or mainly of wool which are by the Act required to have a trade description applied:-
 - (a) Clothing and materials which are made entirely of wool or which have not more than a 2 per cent. tolerance for foreign matter shall be marked "100%

wool" or "all wool," and the description "100% wool" or "all wool" or any other description which is likely to mislead any person into the belief that any clothing or materials for clothing which are not wholly made of wool and in which the foreign content is in excess of the two per cent. limit of tolerance are wholly or substantially made of wool shall not be used.

(b) Where clothing or materials for clothing contain less than 95 per cent. of wool by weight the use of the term "wool" with reference thereto or any other description likely to mislead in the manner mentioned in paragraph (a) is prohibited, unless a guaranteed percentage of wool by weight is correctly stated in the trade description.

(c) Goods sold as blankets or under any other name which indicates that they may be used as blankets or under any name which is reasonably calculated to lead a purchaser to believe that they may be used as blankets, shall have "100% wool" or "all wool" trade description applied, and shall conform to the specifications of paragraph (a) of this Regulation: provided that if such goods contain less than the amount of wool prescribed in paragraph (a) but more than 25 per cent. of wool content by weight, the same may be sold as "blankets," provided the trade description clearly and accurately specifies the percentage by weight of wool content in the blankets.

Provided that nothing contained in this paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit the trade description known as "cotton blanket" or "cotton blankets" where goods are sold under that name.

- (2) It shall not be obligatory to apply the foregoing descriptions to the several classes of goods mentioned in the preceding paragraph (a), except in the case of under-clothing, but if any trade description is used which indicates the character, constituents, or quality of any clothing or materials for clothing made wholly or mainly of wool, then such trade description shall conform to the requirements of paragraph (a) of this Regulation.
- (3) The term "wool" as applied to goods which must bear the prescribed trade description under this Regulation (number 4) is used in reference only to those goods of the classes mentioned which are made wholly or mainly of the wool of sheep or lambs, and the term "wool" or any other trade description of a similar character or reasonably calculated to give the impression of that term shall not be used in connection with clothing or materials for clothing unless the same consist wholly or mainly of the wool of sheep or lambs.

Bedding.

- Every mattress which is filled with kapok, with flock, with hair, or with fibre shall have a statement thereon to that effect, that is to say-
 - "Kapok mattress"
 - "Flock mattress"
 - "Hair mattress"
 - "Fibre mattress,"

and the foregoing several descriptions shall not be used, except in relation to mattresses which are so filled.

- Where a mattress is filled with a mixture of kapok and flock the respective percentages of kapok and of flock shall be stated and the following description and no other shall be used:—
 ''Kapok and flock mattress.''
- Where a mattress is filled with hair and fibre the percentage of hair and the percentage of fibre shall be stated and the following description and no other shall be used:-
 - "Hair and fibre mattress."
- Where a mattress is filled with fibre or a percentage of fibre the class of fibre used shall be stated.
- 9. Where wool is added to flock in the filling of a mattress the percentage of wool added shall be stated and the mattress shall be described as a ''kapok and wool mattress,' and no other description shall be used.

 10. Where a mattress is filled with a combination of flock and kapok the respective
- percentages of each shall be stated and the mattress shall be described as a "kapok and flock mattress," and no other description shall be used to describe the mattress.

Furniture (upholstered).

11. The foregoing Regulations relating to bedding shall apply with all necessary modifications to the contents used for stuffing in upholstered furniture.

Character of Trade Description.

- 12. Where the full name and the complete address of the manufacturer of goods are required to be shown as part of the trade description of goods pursuant to Section 5 of the Act, the same shall be shown in accordance with the following specifications:—
 - (a) The name and address of the manufacturer shall be a conspicuous, legible nscription (in Roman character), with letters of just proportion, properly placed and of a magnitude reasonably suitable, having regard to the size, shape and nature of the goods or label or covering to be marked.

 (b) The name of the country where the goods were manufactured or produced (when of moment or required), and the name before it of the place therein of manufacture or production shall be specified.

 (c) The inscription of the place and country shall in all cases be prefaced by the words immediately before such inscription "made in" or "made at."

 (d) Such inscription shall be attached as the state of the place and country shall in all cases be prefaced by the words immediately before such inscription "made in" or "made at."

 - (d) Such inscription shall be attached to or placed on the goods in the manner hereinafter prescribed.
- 13. (1) The following shall be the methods of applying the prescribed trade description to goods which under the Act or by Regulation from time to time thereunder are required to have a trade description applied thereto:-
 - (i) by embossing, moulding, impressing, or blowing the trade description with
 - the substance of the goods; (ii) by engraving, cutting, stamping, or tooling the trade description on the surface of the goods;

(iii) by painting, stencilling, or printing the trade description on the surface of the goods;

the goods;
(iv) by securely attaching a label of durable material to or letting the same securely into the goods so that the same shall be permanently affixed to the goods in question;
(v) by embossing, moulding, impressing, blowing, engraving, cutting, stamping, burning and printing, stencilling, or painting on the outside of any covering used to contain the goods: provided that in making the choice of the state of making and printing and the previous of this paragraph (v) the choice ing used to contain the goods: provided that in making the choice of the method of marking under the provisions of this paragraph (v) the choice is to be governed, as the case may require, as if the package itself were the article to which the trade description was to be applied, and the method followed shall be appropriate to the circumstances of the case on that assumption, regard, however, being had to the material of which the covering is made, the available space thereon, and its shape and size.

The foregoing enumerated methods of applying a trade description shall be resorted to in succession, that is to say, if method No. (i) cannot be applied by reason of the goods being of such kind that the trade description cannot reasonably be applied to the goods in the manner specified, then method No. (ii) shall be resorted to, and if method No. (ii) cannot be reasonably applied by reason of the nature of the goods, then method No. (iii) shall be resorted to and so on.

14. Where the goods are contained in a covering not merely supplied for the con-

venience of the customer on the particular occasion, in addition to the trade description being applied to the goods themselves in the prescribed manner, the trade description

being applied to the goods themselves in the prescribed manner, the trade description shall be embossed, impressed, moulded, stamped, engraved, imprinted, stencilled or painted on the outside of the covering.

15. Where the goods are of a kind requiring under the Act and these Regulations to have the trade description indicated on the goods themselves but by reason of the material, colour, or other characteristic of the goods the prescribed trade description cannot be clearly and easily observed unless a permanent colouring medium is imposed, then some suitable colouring material shall, if reasonably possible, be imposed on the goods or used so as to effect the desired result. goods or used so as to effect the desired result.

16. The following conditions shall be observed in regard to the durability and permanency of the trade description:—

(a) The trade description shall be applied in a workmanlike manner so that it will not lend itself to being easily rubbed off, obliterated, detached or defaced.

(b) In all cases where a label is used it shall be of substantial kind and in each particular case shall be of a material most reasonably fitted to withstand wear and destruction, having regard to the requirements of the case and to the goods and to the manner in which it is to be applied.

(c) If at any time a trade description applied to goods becomes detached, defaced, illegible, or obliterated, another trade description in accordance

with these Regulations shall be applied to the goods.

with these Regulations shall be applied to the goods.

17. Where under the law of the Commonwealth any specified goods imported or introduced into the Commonwealth are required to have applied to the goods a trade description indicating the country or place in or at which the goods were manufactured or produced, then, if the requirements of the law of the Commonwealth have been and are at all material times duly observed, those goods shall be accepted as satisfying the requirements of these Regulations with respect to the character of the trade description. tion applied to the goods and the manner of its application, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained.
