PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edward, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force. And whereas the Narrogin Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used, for a street or way within the Municipality of Narrogin, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall from the date of this Proclamation be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

THE ELECTORAL ACT, 1907-1936.

Schedule.

THE ELECTORAL ACT, 1907-1936.

Regulations.

(Section 210.)

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Electoral Regulations, 1937."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations "the Act" means "The Electoral Act, 1907-1936," as amended, and the sections quoted are the sections of the said Act.

Appointment of Assistant Registrars for Provinces and Districts.

3. (a) The Governor may appoint for any Province or District one or more Assistant Registrars to assist the Registrar in the performance of his duties.
(b) Claims may be lodged with Assistant Registrars, to be sent by them, on behalf of the claimant, to the Registrar, for approval and enrolment.

Claims under Section 17 (3).

4. If a member of the Legislative Assembly or the wife of a member of the Legislative Assembly has claimed under the provisions of Section 17, Subsection (3) of the Act to be enrolled as an Elector for the District represented by such member instead of the District in which he or she resides, the following additions to their occupations shall be made respectively in the Roll, viz.:—

(M.L.A. for the (name of) District);
(Wife of M.L.A. for the (name of) District),

so as to denote the special qualification under which they are enrolled.

The Rolls.

(Section 32.)

5. The latest printed or written copy of the Roll referred to in Section 32 of the Act shall, as occasion arises, be supplied to each Registrar by the Chief Electoral Officer, and shall contain an indorsement by the latter that such copy of the Roll is the Roll for the Province or District, for the purposes of Section 32 of the Act, and any alterations under the Act shall from time to time be made on such copy of the Roll by the Registrar, until a new Roll is issued to him by the Chief Electoral Officer as a substitute for the one then in use.

The method to be followed in effecting such alterations shall be as prescribed in Sections 53 and 54 of the Act. The indorsement shall be in the following words:—

(or District) is the Roll filed in the Office of the Registrar under the provisions
of Section 32 of the Act.

Enforcement of the Law relating to Compulsory Enrolment on the
Legislative Assembly Rolls.

(Section 44A.)

7. The Registrar for a District shall, when any failure to comply with the law relating to compulsory enrolment of a person qualified as an elector for the Assembly is disclosed, make inquiries into the circumstances and consider all the facts, and if he is satisfied that the qualified person has failed to comply with the requirements of Section 44A of "The Electoral Act, 1907-1936," he shall, in accordance with Form 7 in the Appendix hereto, forthwith inform him of such failure, and such person may reply by statutory declaration setting out any facts relevant to the matter, within such time as is set out in the said notification. The time within which such declaration may be lodged with the Registrar may be varied by him so as to afford sufficient time for reply in each individual case, but shall not be less than seven clear days from the date of such notification.

8. Where a person to whom notification has been sent fails within the time allowed to reply thereto or fails by his reply to satisfy the Registrar, the Registrar shall cause proceedings to be instituted against such person in a court of summary jurisdiction.

9. If, in any case in which proceedings are instituted in a court of summary jurisdiction, the Registrar has received from the person concerned a statutory declaration in pursuance of Regulation 7 of these Regulations he shall, so far as it is practicable and necessary for him to do so, inquire into the truth of the statements therein set out, and shall, unless he withdraws the prosecution, cause the declaration to be brought to the notice of the court.

Objections to Claims.

(Section 46.)

10. The notice in writing to be given by the Registrar to the objector to a claim for enrolment, and to the person whose name or enrolment is objected to, under the provisions of Sections 46 and 47 respectively of the Act, shall be in the Forms Nos. 29, 30, 31 and 32 in the Appendix hereto, as the case may require.

Lists to be Supplied by the Registrar General and Others.

(Sections 55-58.)

11. The lists to be forwarded to the Chief Electoral Officer by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, under the provisions of Section 55, by the Inspector General of the Insane under Section 56; by the Superintendent of Public Charities under Section 57, and by the Comptroller General of Prisons under Section 58 of the Act, shall be in the Forms Nos. 33, 34, 35, 36, and 37 in the Appendix hereto respectively.

Enforcement of the Law relating to Compulsory Voting at Elections of the Legislative Assembly.

(Section 154A.)

12. The list in duplicate of the names and descriptions of the electors enrolled for a District who did not vote at an election in such District for the Legislative Assembly which is required to be prepared by the Returning Officer under the provisions of Subsection (2) of Section 154A of the Act may be prepared on copies of the Electoral Roll used at such election; and such list may be certified in accordance with Form 39 in the Appendix to these Regulations.

13. (1) The notice to be sent under the provisions of Subsection (4) of Section 154A of the Act to each elector whose name appears on the List as prepared by the Returning Officer in accordance with Subsection (2) of Section 154A aforesaid shall be sent by post to each such elector within three months after the close of the election.

(2) Such notice shall be in accordance with Form 40 in the Appendix to these Regulations.

14. (1) The form of reply which under Subsections (6) and (7) of Section 154A of the Act is required to be filled up and signed by or on behalf of an elector who has received notice from the Returning Officer as provided for by Subsection (4) of Section 154A aforesaid may be in accordance with Form 41 in the Appendix to these Regulations.

(2) The witness to the signing of such form shall be an elector or a person qualified to be an elector.

15. An extract from a copy of a list of electors who failed to vote at an election prepared and indorsed by the Returning Officer in accordance with the provisions of Section 154A of the Act, and referred to in Subsection (11) of such section required for use as evidence in any proceedings may be in accordance with Forms 42 and 43 in the Appendix to these Regulations.

Honorary Government Electoral Agents.

16. (1) With a view to providing facilities for persons qualified but not enrolled as electors—

- (a) to inspect the Rolls;
- (b) to obtain information as regards qualifications and disqualifications; and
- (c) to procure the requisite claim forms,

the following public servants shall be *ex officio* Honorary Government Electoral Agents:— Clerks of Court, Mining Registrars, Government Land Agents, Managers of State Batteries, Officers in the Police Force in charge of Stations, District Registrars of Births, Deaths and Marriages (except those paid by fees only), Post and Telegraph Masters.

(2) The duties of such Honorary Government Electoral Agents shall be as follows:

- (a) To exhibit in a conspicuous place outside their office a copy of an Electoral poster and sign, supplied by the Chief Electoral Officer;
- (b) To have charge of on behalf of the Chief Electoral Officer, for free inspection by the public, copies of the Rolls; and
- (c) To hold sufficient quantity of claim forms at the disposal of the general public.

(3) The Honorary Government Electoral Agents shall not be required to render any returns or to collect any forms.

(4) The Minister may appoint from time to time such additional Honorary Government Electoral Agents as he may think fit, and he may also cancel the appointment of any Honorary Government Electoral Agent.

(5) Notice of every appointment to or removal from an office under this Regulation shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

17. The forms set out in the Appendix hereto shall (subject to Section 209 of the Act) be used for the purpose for which they are prescribed, as indicated by the section of the Act mentioned.

Fees to Officers at Elections, etc.

18. (a) Every officer under "The Public Service Act, 1904-1935" may be required by the Governor to act in the capacity of Returning Officer, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officer, Presiding Officer, Assistant Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk, or Door Keeper, under the provisions of "The Electoral Act, 1907-1936."

(b) Such officers, when so acting, and all officers appointed under the Electoral Act, shall be entitled to receive and retain the fees or allowances as in this Regulation hereinafter prescribed for them respectively in paragraph (c).

(c) Subject to this Regulation, all Electoral officers acting and residing in that portion of the State comprised within the Electoral Districts of Kimberley, Pilbara, Roebourne, and Gascoyne, or such Districts as are comprised within the boundaries of the North Province, shall be entitled to receive and retain the fees prescribed for them respectively in paragraph (c) of this Regulation, together with an additional amount equal to twenty per centum of such prescribed fee.

(d) Subject to this Regulation all Electoral officers acting and residing in the Electoral Districts comprised within that portion of the State known as the Mining and Pastoral Area under the provisions of "The Electoral Districts Act, 1922" (No. 10 of 1923), shall be entitled to receive and retain the fees prescribed for them respectively in paragraph (e) of this Regulation, together with an additional amount equal to ten per centum of such prescribed fee.

(e) The fees payable to Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Door Keepers shall be as follows:—

Provided that—

(i) where the Returning Officer, Deputy Returning Officer, or Assistant Returning Officer for a Province has to conduct an election for portion only of an Assembly District, or for portions of Assembly Districts containing several Provinces, the fees payable shall in all cases be subject to approval by the Minister, who may, after consideration of the circumstances, increase or decrease the fees specified in the foregoing table, and may allot the fees amongst the officers concerned in such portions as he sees fit;

(ii) in Districts where more than twelve polling places have been gazetted for a Council or an Assembly Election the Minister may grant the Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer, as the case may be, in addition to the fee prescribed in the foregoing table, a further fee in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) For every polling place in excess of twelve up to and including twenty polling places .. Ten shillings.
- (b) For every polling place in excess of twenty and up to and including thirty polling places .. Seven shillings and sixpence.

and

- (c) For every polling place in excess of thirty polling places .. Five shillings.

(iii) if an officer holds simultaneously more than one position under the Act for each of which service fees are prescribed, he shall be entitled only to the fee for that position for which the highest fee is prescribed, where the duties of all such positions can be performed simultaneously. In all other cases such officer shall be entitled to the fee prescribed for each position the duties of which he performs;

(iv) the fees prescribed in the foregoing table for Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Door Keepers shall cover all services performed between the hours of 7 o'clock a.m. and 8 o'clock p.m. on the day of the election;

(v) subject to paragraphs (c), (d), and (f) of this regulation, the fees prescribed in the foregoing table for Returning Officers and Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers shall cover all services required by the Act or by the Regulations and instructions made or given under the Act to be performed by such officer on the day of election, and includes subsistence for that day.

(f) Returning Officers, Deputy Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers, while engaged on the scrutiny and count of votes, shall be paid for such services at the rate of five shillings per hour; and Presiding Officers and Assistant Presiding Officers required to assist at the scrutiny and count of votes shall be paid for such services at the rate of three shillings and sixpence per hour; and Poll Clerks and Door Keepers required to assist at the scrutiny and count of votes shall be paid for such services at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per hour.

(g) Where officers are required prior or subsequent to the day of an election to perform in relation to such election, any authorised service as in this paragraph hereinafter defined, such officers shall be entitled for such authorised service to a special fee in accordance with the following scale:—

For the purposes of this paragraph "authorised service" means service for which an application has been made through the Chief Electoral Officer to the Minister and by him approved, and after authority has been duly communicated by the Chief Electoral Officer in writing or by telegraph to the officer making application.

(h) Officers under "The Public Service Act, 1904-1935," when acting as Returning Officers, Deputy or Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers, Assistant

Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Door Keepers on the day of an election shall be deemed to be absent from their public service offices on leave of absence with payment of salary in respect of such offices.

19. When on the day of an election officers employed on the staff of the department under the Chief Electoral Officer, instead of being specially appointed as Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Door Keepers for such election are instructed by the Chief Electoral Officer to be and remain at the office of the Chief Electoral Officer and expressly to render to Returning Officers and other officers aforesaid such urgent assistance and help as they may require urgently in connection with the election, such first-mentioned officers may, on the recommendation and with the approval of the Chief Electoral Officer be allowed, in addition to their ordinary salary, the same fees, under Regulation 18 (e) hereof, as they would have been entitled to if they had in fact been specially appointed as Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, or Door Keepers for such election.

20. (1) Whenever in accordance with the provisions of Section 154a of the Act Returning Officers are required after an election for the Legislative Assembly to prepare a list of the electors who failed to vote at such election contrary to the requirements of the said section, such Returning Officers shall, in respect of such service, be entitled to receive and retain a special fee calculated at the rate of 7s. 6d. for every 500 or portion of 500 votes polled.

Provided that, where in respect of any election the number of Electoral Rolls to be examined by the Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer for the purpose of the preparation of the list aforesaid exceeds sixteen, a fee additional to the relevant fee prescribed above shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence in respect of every such Electoral Roll in excess of sixteen aforesaid.

(2) Whenever in accordance with the provisions of the Act, Returning Officers or Deputy Returning Officers are required after an election for the Legislative Council to prepare a unified Roll of Electors in connection with such election, such Returning Officers or Deputy Returning Officers shall, in respect of such service, be entitled to receive and retain a special fee calculated at the rate of 10s. for every 500 or portion of 500 votes polled.

Provided that the Hon. Minister may on the recommendation of the Chief Electoral Officer, approve of additional remuneration where it appears that the fee payable in accordance with the above scale is inadequate for the service rendered.

Provided also, that the prescribed fee payable to a Deputy Returning Officer for a Legislative Council Election shall be deemed to include the work involved for the whole of the District for which he is the Returning Officer.

21. Subject as in this Regulation hereinafter provided, Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers, Electoral Registrars, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Door Keepers who are required to travel outside the Metropolitan Area for the purpose of performing their duties as electoral officers, shall be entitled to travelling allowance in accordance with the following scale:—

- (a) Any of the officers aforesaid who are public service officers under "The Public Service Act, 1904-1935," shall be entitled to such travelling allowance prescribed under the Regulations for the time being or from time to time in force, made under the said "Public Service Act, 1904-1935," as they would be entitled to under the said Regulation if the travelling which they are required to do as such electoral officers were done in their capacity as Public Service officers.
- (b) Any such officers aforesaid who are not public service officers under "The Public Service Act, 1904-1935," shall be entitled to travelling allowance in accordance with the rates of travelling allowance prescribed under the Regulations for the time being and from time to time in force made under the said "Public Service Act, 1904-1935," but so that the rate of travelling allowance to be paid to Returning Officers, Deputy and Assistant Returning Officers shall be the higher of the rates of travelling allowance prescribed by the said Regulations and the rate of travelling allowance to be paid to Electoral Registrars, Presiding Officers, Assistant Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks, and Door Keepers shall be the lower of the rates of travelling allowance prescribed by the said Regulations.

No transport or meal allowance shall be paid to any officer aforesaid in respect of the day of an election, but, if approved by the Chief Electoral Officer, any expense necessarily incurred by an officer for transport on the day of the election may be recouped to such officer.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, under the provisions of the above Act and amendments, has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the Control and Management of the Balingup Public Cemetery.

BALINGUP PUBLIC CEMETERY—BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Balingup Cemetery Board as Trustees of the Balingup Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 13187, the said Trustees make the following By-laws and all By-laws previously gazetted are hereby repealed:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial as set forth in Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for application within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary in the form of Schedule C.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April, inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 12 noon to 5 p.m., and no other burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of 14 years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise or by any other system of advertisement whatever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

19. Subject to these By-laws the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form E in the Schedule.

21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form E in the Schedule.

22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assigns, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assigns shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure on any part of the Cemetery, or construct a brick grave or vault, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of Twenty shillings (20s.), which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work, shall as far as possible be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. Where any person desires to exhume any corpse from any grave in the Cemetery, pursuant to an order obtained from the Governor under Section 41 of "The

Cemeteries Act, 1897," the following provisions shall apply and be observed, that is to say:—

- (a) A written application, setting forth the reason for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased.
- (b) If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to the removal.
- (c) Grave to be filled in and all rubbish removed.

33. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give, and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.

34. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c) The dressing of any graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

35. Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall apply to the Trustees for an annual permit, and shall at the time of making application give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem it fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

36. Any person committing any breach of these By-laws and regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

37. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of "Right of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

38. Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-laws may be expelled from the Cemetery.

WHEREAS by Section 107 of "The Income Tax Assessment Act, 1937," it is enacted that Sections 105 and 106 of that Act shall commence on the publication in the *Gazette* of a Proclamation by the Governor that in his opinion the Parliaments of at least three States other than the State of Western Australia have passed similar provisions to those sections: And it is further enacted in Subsection 2 of Section 107 of the said Act that the Governor shall in such Proclamation declare the year of income as from the commencement of which the said Sections 105 and 106 shall be deemed to have come into force: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby proclaim and declare that I am of the opinion that the Parliaments of at least three States other than the State of Western Australia have passed similar provisions to the provisions of the said Sections 105 and 106: And I further proclaim and declare that the said Sections 105 and 106 shall be deemed to have come into force as from the commencement of the year of income ending the 30th day of June, 1937, or the accounting period (if any) adopted under the said Act in lieu of the said year of income.
