This Order in Council shall take effect from the 28th day of January, 1955.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1953. Cranbrook Water Area. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 532/54.

(b) When the aggregate overtime exceeds two (2) hours in any week the whole of such overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and thereafter double time. Sunday time included in time for which overtime is paid shall be paid for at double time. In the calculation of overtime each day shall stand alone.

(c) Overtime shall not be construed as meaning the additional time usually and necessarily worked by Foremen as part of their ordinary duties prior to and after the usual starting and finishing hours. (d) No payment for overtime shall be made unless

authorised by the Engineer in Charge.

8.—Sick Leave.

An employee on production of an adequate medical certificate shall be granted sick leave on the following basis:-

- (a) One-sixth of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (b) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed two (2) weeks' wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but any portion unused up to the period of one (1) week in any calendar year shall be allowed to accumulate and may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- The privileges accrued by way of accumu-lation of sick leave prior to this amend-ment, or 15 working days whichever is the greater shall be credited to the worker concerned.
- (d) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (e) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause except under special circumstances as may be approved by the employer.

- (f) Sick leave shall not be granted in respect of any absence due to an employee's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944

(ii) An employee recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving the premises) shall be paid for a minimum of three hours' work at the appropriate rate for each day upon which he is so recalled; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, the employee shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job he was recalled to perform is completed

within a shorter period. This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for an employee to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours, or where the overtime is continuous (subject to reasonable meal break) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

(iv) Where a colliery is hauling and tipping coal on day and afternoon shift, $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. shall be added to ordinary rates for all time worked on afternoon shift, provided that such percentage shall be in lieu of and shall not be additional upon the percentage prescribed in subclause (iii) hereof.

2. This amendment shall take effect from the commencement of the first pay period following the date hereof.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 13th day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fiftyfour, between the Boilermakers' Society of Australia Union of Workers, Coastal Districts, W.A. of the one part, and the Western Australian Government Railways Commission on the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. Except as hereinafter agreed, the provisions of Award No. 10 of 1947 made by the Court of Arbitration on the 15th day of September, 1947, as amended, are hereby embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

2. Clause 3—Interpretations.

"Suburban Area" means Robbs Jetty to Bellevue (including Belmont Branch) and East Perth to Armadale.

vided that the reduction from sevenpence (7d.) to sixpence (6d.) shall only be made in cases where the worker shall be stationed for more than seven (7) days in one place.

(iii) After the first twenty-four (24) hours a charge of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per night, with a maximum of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d) per week, shall be made where attended barracks are provided, and a charge of ninepence (9d.) per night, with a maximum of three shillings and ninepence (3s. 9d.) per week shall be made where unattended barracks are provided.

In lieu of sub-clause (e) the following shall apply:----

(e) No away from home allowance shall be granted to any worker stationed in the suburban area in respect of any absence from his home station within the suburban area unless he is unable to return by passenger train or other public transport to his home station for the night, or unless approved by the head of the branch.

In sub-clause (f) an amount of "three shillings (3s.)" shall apply in lieu of "two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)".

In sub-clause (h) an amount of "fifty-five shillings (55s.)" shall apply in lieu of "forty shillings (40s.)".

In sub-clause (ha) an amount of "fifty shillings (50s.)" shall apply in lieu of "forty shillings (40s.)".

In sub-clause (i) an amount of "six shillings (6s.)" shall apply in lieu of "five shillings (5s.)".

7. Clause 19-Travelling time.

In lieu of sub-clause (e) the following shall apply:----

(e) A worker residing within the suburban area, who is required to start work at some place other than his home station within the suburban area shall—

(i) if notified the previous evening, travel one way from or to work in his own time, provided there is a train or other public transport by which he can conveniently travel.

(ii) if not so notified, the worker shall travel both ways in the employer's time. The department shall provide free travelling from the home station. Provided, however, that no worker sent on relief duty within the suburban area shall claim or be allowed extra travelling time if the station at which he is to work is nearer his residence than his home station.

8. Clause 24—Free Passes, Privilege Tickets and Season Tickets.

In sub-clause (a) an amount of "forty shillings (40s)" shall apply in lieu of "twenty-five shillings (25s.)".

In sub-clause (m) amounts of "one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.)" and "nine pence (9d.)" shall apply in-lieu of "one shilling (1s.)" and "sixpence (6d.)" respectively.

9. Clause 29-Boards of Reference.

In lieu of paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of subclause (a) the following shall apply:—

(i) Settling any matters of difference under the Award except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award.(ii) deciding any other matter that the Court

may refer to the Board from time to time.

10. Clause 30—Allowances, Special Provisions, etc.

In lieu of paragraphs (2) (3) and (4) the following shall apply:—

(2) Leading hand in charge of not less than three (3) and not more than ten (10) employees shall be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week extra.

(3) Leading hand in charge of more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) employees shall be paid at the rate of thirty shillings (30s.) per week extra. (4) Leading hand in charge of more than twenty (20) employees shall be paid at the rate of forty-five shillings (45s.) per week extra.

11. Clause 33—War Loadings.

This clause shall not apply.

12. Clause 34—Wages.

(e) In order to give effect to the provisions of this clause employers bound by the Award shall retrench, engage, or transfer the employees affected as required by the circumstances.

(f) Employees in any of the mines grouped hereunder shall enjoy common seniority within the group:—

Group 1.—Griffin Coal Mining Co. Ltd.: Griffin, Wyvern and Phoenix mines.

- Group 2.—Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd.: Cardiff and Neath mines.
- Group 3.—Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd.: Stockton and Stockton open cut mines.
- Group 4.—Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd.: Black Diamond and Westralia mines.

(g) In the application of the foregoing subclauses adult and junior workers shall be kept distinct and separate.

(h) Nothing contained in this clause shall apply to a worker dismissed for gross misconduct or refusal to obey lawful orders.

(i) Should the management and the Union be unable to arrive at a mutual agreement with regard to the operation of this clause, the subject of the disagreement may be referred for settlement forthwith to the Western Australian Coal Industry Tribunal.

This amendment shall take effect forthwith.
