To Our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, President of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

Greeting:

WHEREAS the Governor of Our State of Western Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Our said State has seen fit to direct that you, the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile, President of the Court of Arbitration and a practitioner as defined by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1950, of not less than eight years standing and practice, shall, in pursuance of section 7 of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1950, and subject to the provisions of that Act, be appointed a Judge of Our Supreme Court of Western Australia as from and including the 14th day of February, 1955: Now, know ye that, reposing full trust and confidence in your loyalty, learning, integrity, and ability, We do by this Our Commission in pursuance and in exercise of all the powers and authorities enabling Us in that behalf, appoint you the said the Honourable Roy Vivian Nevile as from and including the 14th day of February, 1955, to be a Judge of Our Supreme Court of Western Australia: To have, hold, exercise, and enjoy the said office of Judge of Our Supreme Court of Western Australia under and subject to the provisions of the Supreme Court Act, 1935-1950, and of the Judges' Salaries and Pensions Act, 1950-1953, during good behaviour, with all the rights, powers, privileges, advances, and jurisdiction thereunto belonging or appertaining: Provided that these presents are and shall be upon this condition—that you shall actually reside within Our State of Western Australia, and shall exercise the said office in your own person except in case of sickness or other incapacity.

In witness whereof We have caused the Great Seal of Our said State to be affixed to this Commission by Our Trusty and Wellbeloved Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, this 9th day of February in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty-five.
