### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 3501/54 Part A, Ex. Co. No. 601.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 11 of the Public Works Act, 1902-1954, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Railways to undertake, construct or provide Southern Cross-Coolgardie Railway—Additions and Improvements—Railway Housing at Bulla Bulling on the land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 34558 which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1951.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Mt. Yokine—West Coast Feeder Main.

West Scarborough Section.

The laying of a 12-inch diameter water main (length approximately 4,500 ft.).

The above main to be complete with valves and all necessary apparatus.

The above works are shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 7926.

Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1953.

Municipality of Bunbury.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 842/52.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection 1 (b) (iii) of section 480 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1953, that a Council may with the approval of the Governor expend out of the ordinary revenue of the municipality any sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate ten per cent. of such ordinary revenue for providing all forms of tourist propaganda both within the district and elsewhere in connection with or in relation to any tourist resort within the district of the council; and whereas the Municipality of Bunbury is desirous of expending the sum of £265 from its ordinary revenue for tourist propaganda purposes: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power vested in him in the said section of the said Act, doth hereby authorise the Municipality of Bunbury to expend from its ordinary revenue the sum of £265 for tourist propaganda purposes.

Traffic Act, 1919-1954. Bridgetown Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 254/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919–1954, namely, that the Bridgetown Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

- (1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads.
- (2) Clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof.
- (3) Clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the Government Gazette, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.
