ROYAL COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO THE MARKETING OF POTATOES, ONIONS AND EGGS.

Terms of Reference.

To investigate and report upon:-

- (a) The methods and present facilities of marketing, and whether, in the public interest, the Board system of marketing should be continued.
- (b) The distribution from the producer to the consumer, with particular reference to handling, storage, and losses due to deterioration during marketing.
- (c) The analysis of the wholesale and retail prices setting out the remuneration of all persons, agents, firms, or marketing authorities in the marketing and distribution from the producer to the consumer, and whether all these handling costs are justified.
- (d) The influence of seasonal production upon quality and the retail price.
- (e) The basis used in granting and refusing licenses to grow potatoes or onions.
- (f) To recommend any proposals for:-
 - (i) More efficient methods of marketing.
 - (ii) Ensuring an adequate supply of products of good quality to consumers.
 - (iii) Ensuring reasonable margins for distribution and sale between producers and retailers, and a fair price to the consumer.

Notice is hereby given that the Royal Commissioner will commence inquiries on the above matter at Parliament House, Perth, on Wednesday, the 25th May, 1955, and thereafter continue such inquiry at such times and places as he deems fit.

Persons intending to tender evidence on any of the matters referred to in, or relative to the terms of reference, are required to signify such intention in writing, attaching a summary of the matters on which it is intended to testify, and addressing letters to "The Secretary, Royal Commission, Marketing of Potatoes, Onions and Eggs, Parliament House, Perth."

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 47 of 1951.

Between Westralian Brickyard, Pottery, Porcelain and Roof Tile Fixers Employees' Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and H. L. Brisbane and Wunderlich, and Darbyshire and Davis Co., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agree-

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Pottery Workers' (Porcelain) Award and shall replace Award No. 21A of 1945 as amended.

3.—Scope and Area.

This Award shall apply to all workers of the classes specified, and working in the porcelain ware manufacturing industry, and shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

4.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of three (3) years from its date subject to the right of the parties to amend same in pursuance of the provisions of the Act.

5.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute the ordinarv week's work.
- (b) The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed eight (8) hours thirty (30) minutes daily from Monday to Friday, inclusive.
- (c) The hours of work except where shifts are worked, shall be performed as follows:—Monday to Friday inclusive between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

6.—Shift Work.

Where two (2) or more shifts in any one day are worked the hours of shift workers shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement the hours of shift workers shall be fixed by the Board of Reference.

7.—Overtime.

- (a) Work performed beyond eight (8) hours thirty (30) minutes on Monday to Friday inclusive, or beyond forty (40) hours in any one week, or except in the case of shift work, before the prescribed starting or after the prescribed finishing time, shall be deemed as overtime.
- (b) Overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. This subclause shall not apply to burners.
- (c) Work performed on Sunday and on the holidays prescribed by clause 9 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
 - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
 - (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the

8.—Mixed Functions.

- (a) A worker called upon to perform work carrying a higher rate than his usual rate of pay shall be entitled to payment at such higher rate for the period that he is actually engaged upon such work.
- (b) A worker called upon to do work carrying a lower rate than his usual rate of pay for less than one half of a day shall be paid for such work at his usual rate of pay.

9.—Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to clause 7, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Union Picnic Day (on a date to be agreed upon between the employers and the Union). Christmas Day and Boying Day Union), Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

- (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

11.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service; provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where a worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

12.—Payment of Wages.

All wages shall be paid on the job within twenty (20) minutes of the close of the day's work at least once a fortnight.

13.—Engagement.

One (1) day's notice on either side shall (with the exception of junior workers in whose case one (1) week's notice shall be required) be necessary to terminate the engagement; provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to receiving such notice.

14.-Notices.

Notices relating to meetings in connection with the Union shall be allowed to be exhibited in the factory. A printed copy of this Agreement shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous position in the factory.

15.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept and entered up a record containing the following particulars:—

- (i) The name of each worker.
- (ii) The class of work performed by him.
- (iii) The hours worked each day by him.
- (iv) The wages (and overtime if any) paid to him.
- (v) The ages of junior workers.

Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union not more than once weekly between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

16.—First-aid Outfit.

Every factory shall be equipped with a first-aid outfit and such outfit shall be kept in a suitable and accessible place. Burners shall not be left alone at night without access to the first-aid outfit.

17.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board of Reference consisting of a chairman and two (2) representatives, one (1) to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to the Board in the event of no Agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve the interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to it from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Agreement.

18.—Minimum Engagement.

Subject as provided in clause 19 hereof any worker engaged under the terms of this Agreement shall be paid a minimum of three (3) hours pay.

19.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other Union or Association, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

20.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be employed at such lesser wage as may be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Union.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

21.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

- (a) Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—
 - (i) Name in full.
 - (ii) Age and date of birth.
 - (iii) Length of experience with any previous employer.
 - (b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

- (c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages in the event of his age being wrongly stated on the certificate.
- (d) If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Agreement.
