KNOW you that I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Commission under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, and by virtue of the provisions of The Agent General Act, 1895-1947, re-appoint you, the said The Honourable James Albert Dimmitt to be Agent General for the State of Western Australia in the United Kingdom, and I do authorise and empower you to undertake, exercise, and perform, on behalf of the State of Western Australia and the Government thereof, in the United Kingdom and elsewhere, in relation to Western Australia, all and every such duties as are prescribed by the said Act, and all the powers incident thereto, as the same are usually exercised and performed in England by the Agents General of the States of the Australian Commonwealth, and generally to act in the premises on behalf of the said State for a further period of three years from the termination of your present appointment or for any renewal thereof that may be arranged.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January, 1956, until 31st December, 1960, inclusive.

Schedule.

1. The whole of the waters of the Capel River, with its tributaries.

All that portion of Western Australian waters known as the "Dead" water, situated in Sussex Location No. 11.

3. All that portion of the Western Australian waters contained in the Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries.

4. The waters of Geographe Bay, near Wonnerup Inlet, extending one quarter of a mile North and South of the entrance to Wonnerup Inlet and extending seawards one quarter of a mile measured rectangularly from the foreshore.

5. All that portion of Western Australian waters known as Yallingup Bay, starting from the point of high-water mark at the Rocky Point half a chain South of the mouth of the Yallingup Brook; thence into the water a quarter of a mile; thence

North-Easterly to a point a quarter of a mile from the North-West corner of Government Reserve No. 8427A; thence Easterly to the point of high-water mark on the foreshore and back to the point of commencement.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January, 1956, until 31st December, 1960, inclusive.

First Schedule.

All that area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards North of Robbs Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards South of the said jetty, and extending in to the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter-of-a-mile from high-water mark.

Second Schedule.

That area of Western Australian waters in Cockburn Sound commencing at a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards North of the jetty fronting Douro Road, South Fremantle, to a point on the foreshore one hundred and fifty (150) yards South of the said jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter-of-a-mile from high-water mark.

Third Schedule.

All that portion of the waters of Cockburn Sound (near Rockingham Beach) lying South of a line drawn from the North-Western extremity of Point John, intersecting the North-Western extremity of the Northernmost pier or jetty at Rockingham Beach, and extending to a point on the foreshore at the said Rockingham Beach.

Bush Fires Act, 1954.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles
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Corres. 32/55.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 26 of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, that where, in the opinion of the Minister, it is desirable that any plant, or the refuse thereof, should be burnt during the prohibited burning times in order to prevent or eradicate disease arising or likely to arise from the plant, or the refuse thereof, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, by proclamation authorise the burning of the plant and the refuse thereof during the prohibited burning times or during any period of the prohibited burning times and declare that such proclamation shall take effect either generally or in the particular road districts specified in the proclamation; and whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable that the plants specified hereunder and the refuse thereof should be burnt, in order to prevent or eradicate disease arising or likely to arise from the plants or the refuse thereof during the period of the prohibited burning times and in the particular road districts specified hereunder: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby authorise the burning, subject to the regulations, of the undermentioned plants and the refuse thereof during the periods and in the particular road districts set out in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

Name of Plant, Period in which Burning may take place, Road District.

Tomato (*Lycopersicum esculentum*) and Potato (*Solanum tuberosum*); the whole of the prohibited burning times; Armadale-Kelmscott, Balingup, Beverley, Capel, Collie Coalfields, Dardanup, Busselton, Darling Range, Drakesbrook, Geraldton-Greenough, Greenbushes, Harvey, Marradong, Mandurah, Mundaring, Murray, Northampton, Preston, Serpentine-Jarrahdale, Swan, Upper Chapman, Wandaring, Wanneroo, York.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 3997/55.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is, *inter alia* made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 24343 (Mount Magnet Lot 23) should be granted in fee simple to the Returned Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen's Imperial League of Australia, W.A. Branch, to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hallsite (R.S.L.): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the Returned Sailors, Soldiers and Airmen's Imperial League of Australia, W.A. Branch, to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hallsite (R.S.L.) subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Corr. No. 6042/49—That reserve No. 24336 (Swan Location 5657) should vest in and be held by the Bayswater Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act and to the condition that reserve 24336 (Swan Location 5657) shall be available for use by school children on sports days.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage
and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1320/55.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.

Guildford Municipal District and Bassendean
and Bayswater Road Districts.

(a) A 21-inch diameter steel and reinforced concrete (hydraulic) pipe rising main and all other apparatus connected therewith, from the Guildford Pumping Station No. 1 to the Bayswater Main Sewer.

(b) A 21-inch diameter reinforced concrete (hydraulic) pipe diversion rising main, and all other apparatus connected therewith, from the proposed rising main to the Bassendean Main Sewer.

The above works are shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 7962.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 2nd day of December, 1955.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage

shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Stormwater Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Reticulation.

Perth Road District and Bayswater Road District.
Proposed Feeder Main to Morley Park.

The construction of an 18-inch diameter feeder main (length about 6,400 ft.), together with all valves and necessary apparatus, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 7945.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 2nd day of December, 1955.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1953.

Allanson Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 728/55.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1953, and the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the district of a local authority or two or more local authorities or any part or parts of such district or districts a Water Area, under such name as may be directed; and whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor may authorise the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise within a water area all the functions of a water board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Acts, under the name of the Allanson Water Area, and doth hereby appoint the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to exercise all the functions of a water board under the Acts in such area.

All that portion of land within the area bordered red on Department of Lands and Surveys Registered Plan Miscellaneous Roll Plan 163 and Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34839.

Water Boards Act, 1942-1953.

Allanson Town Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.S. 727/55.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the Water Boards Act, 1942-1953, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act a water board shall have power to construct water works for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is provided by section 41 of the said Act (as amended by the Water Boards Act Amendment Act, 1937), that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operation of certain sections of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the reticulation works referred to in the following Schedule shall be exempt from the operations of the said sections of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise

of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby exempt from the operations of sections 41, 42, 43, 44 and 45 of the Water Boards Act, 1942-1953, the reticulation works included in the following schedule.

The laying of water supply reticulation mains and appurtenances within the Allanson Water Area as shown by full red lines on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34844.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1951.

For the Construction of Pipeline from Narrogin Reservoir to Cuballing.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 417/55.

WHEREAS by the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1951, it is provided that before undertaking the construction of water works, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval; and that if they are approved, the Governor may forthwith by Order in Council, empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates marked on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34711 for the construction of pipeline from Narrogin Reservoir to Cuballing which was duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister to undertake the construction of the said works.

Traffic Act, 1919-1954.

West Kimberley Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 2484/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1954, namely, that the West Kimberley Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of—

- (1) clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads;
- (2) clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs and directions, and for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian;
- (3) clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof;
- (4) clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 455/51.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Midland Railway Company of Western Australia Limited of Midland Junction, Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the Act, and having duly made application in accordance with the Act and regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of section 13 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the liability aforesaid and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit a bond for ten thousand pounds charged with all payments to become due under the liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act, doth hereby exempt Midland Railway Company of Western Australia Limited aforesaid from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, for a period expiring on the 7th August, 1957.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer or group of employers to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him or them, but that if an employer or group of employers proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer or group of employers has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer or group of employers from the operation of the section; and whereas Bunning Bros. Pty. Ltd., Perth Jarrah Mills Pty. Ltd., Nyamup Sawmills Pty. Ltd., Donnelly Sawmills Pty. Ltd. and Henry Martin & Co. Pty. Ltd., all of 49-61 Charles Street, Perth, in the State of Western Australia, Timber Merchants, are employers or a group of employers within the meaning of the said Act, and as such are subject to the provisions of section 13 of the Act, and have in accordance with the regulations made application for exemption from the operation of the section; and whereas they have proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that as such employers or group of employers they have established a fund for insurance against the liability mentioned in the section and have deposited with the Treasury a bond for the amount of ten thousand pounds by the English, Scottish and Australian Bank charged with all payments to become due by the companies under their liability aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act, doth hereby exempt Bunning Bros. Pty. Ltd., Perth Jarrah Mills Pty. Ltd., Nyamup Sawmills Pty. Ltd., Donnelly Sawmills Pty. Ltd. and Henry Martin & Co. Pty. Ltd., from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, for a period expiring on the 30th day of June, 1957.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section, and whereas Millars' Timber and Trading Company Limited, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of section 13, has, in accordance with the regulations, duly made application that it be exempted from the operation of the section and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by it and has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit, the sum of ten thousand pounds (£10,000) charged with all payments to become due from the Company under the liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth exempt Millars' Timber and Trading Company Limited, as such employer aforesaid from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, for a period expiring on the 15th day of September, 1957.

(a) In the event of a reduction of hands by a company at any mine company seniority shall apply and the last worker employed in the particular classification shall be the first to be dismissed.

(b) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to any worker dismissed for gross misconduct or refusal to obey lawful orders, or if incapacitated, the proof of which shall be upon the employer.

(c) If a worker has moved from one classification to another he shall have the right to claim his seniority in the original classification from which he came. For the purpose of determining seniority his length of service shall be deemed to date from the last time he signed on with the company concerned during his current period of employment.
