WHEREAS it is provided, *inter alia*, by subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967, that where a local authority in whose district a sewerage area is situate, undertakes any works in that sewerage area and it appears after inquiry that—

- (a) the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on any of the works with respect to which any debt is owing; and
- (b) the local authority should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960-1970.

the Governor may, by proclamation, grant to the local authority such permission and may in the proclamation specify new limits of the maximum general rate that the local authority may impose under the Local Government Act, 1960; and whereas the Carnarvon Sewerage Area constituted under section 4 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967 by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th March, 1969, is within the district of the Municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon and the Shire has undertaken

works within that area; and whereas it appears after inquiry that the maximum general rate that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon may impose will not permit a sufficient amount to be provided for the construction, alteration, repair or maintenance of the works, and for payment of the instalments of capital debt and interest on the works to which any debt is owing and that the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon should be permitted to levy a general rate beyond the limits prescribed by the Local Government Act, 1960: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred under subsection (1a) of section 11 of the Country Towns Sewerage Act, 1948-1967, do hereby grant to the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Carnarvon permission to levy a general rate of thirty cents for each dollar of the annual value of the rateable property in its district that is within the Carnarvon Sewerage Area aforesaid.

AT a meeting of Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 28th day of January, 1971, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1966, that, subject to the provisions of that section, the municipal and road districts and parts thereof constituted as fire districts prior to the coming into operation of the Fire Brigades Act Amendment Act, 1959, as set out in the Second Schedule to the Act, are for the purposes of the Act fire districts under the respective names as set out in that Schedule; and whereas it is further enacted, inter alia, by subsection (2) of that section that for the purposes of the Act the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council adjust the boundaries of a fire district; and whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of February, 1969, the boundaries of the Kwinana Fire District have been adjusted; and whereas it is now expedient to further adjust the boundaries of that fire district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the Kwinana Fire District so that the boundaries of that fire district are as set out in the Schedule to this Order in Council.

Schedule.

Boundaries of the Kwinana Fire District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the northwestern side of Thomas Road (Road Number 6280) situate north of the intersection of the southwestern side of Medina Avenue and a southeastern side of Thomas Road aforesaid and extending generally easterly along the first mentioned side to the eastern side of a Tramway Reserve; thence generally southerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation southeasterly of the southern side of Wellard Road; thence generally northwesterly to and along that side to a point situate in prolongation southwesterly of the northwestern side of Westbrook Street; thence generally northeasterly to and generally northerly along that side to the southern side of Summerton Road; thence southwesterly along that side to the southwestern side of Stanyford Way; thence northwesterly and northeasterly along sides of that way to the western side of Seabrook Way; thence generally northwesterly along that side and

onwards to the prolongation southwesterly of the northwestern side of Tucker Street; thence generally northeasterly to and along that side and north-easterly along the northwestern side of Bingfield Road West to the southwestern side of Medina Avenue aforesaid; thence northwesterly along that side to the southern side of Thomas Road aforesaid and thence north to the starting point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 1793/66.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is, inter alia, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in

WHEREAS it is provided in subsection (3) (a) of section 9 of the Local Government Act, 1960-1970, that from time to time the Governor may approve the Common Seal of a municipality; and whereas the name of the municipality of the Shire of Cockburn changed to that of the Town of Cockburn by notice in the *Government Gazette* of 24th December, 1970; and whereas the Council has requested approval to the alteration of the Seal so that it will bear the words Town of Cockburn Common Seal; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the power conferred by the said Act, hereby approves of the alteration of the Common Seal of the Municipality of the Town of Cockburn by substituting the words "Town of Cockburn" for the words "Shire of Cockburn".

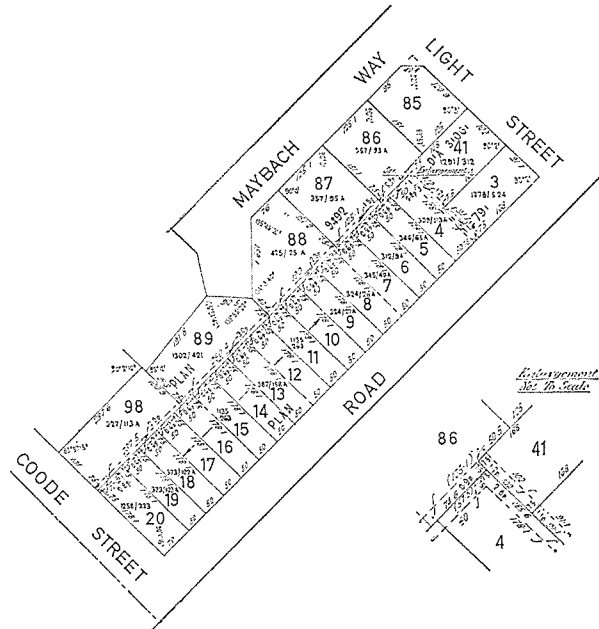

- Citation and comment.** 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Town Planning and Development Act (Appeal) Regulations, 1971.
- (2) These regulations shall take effect on and from the date the Town Planning and Development Act Amendment Act, 1970, comes into operation.
- Interpretation.** 2. (1) In these regulations, unless the contrary intention appears—
Vide ss. 3, 4, 39 Act No. 30 of 1918.
“Act” means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1970, and if that Act is amended means that Act as amended from time to time;
“appellant” means a person instituting an appeal under Part V of the Act;
“Courts Office” means the office established at Perth as the office of the Courts from time to time constituted under section 43 of the Act;
“matter” includes a refusal, demand, condition or question;
“Minister” means the Minister of the Crown to whom the administration of the Act is for the time being committed by the Governor, and includes any Minister of the Crown for the time being discharging the duties of the office of the Minister;
- (2) Expressions used in these regulations have, unless the contrary intention appears, the same respective meanings as in the Act.
- Notice of Appeal.** 3. (1) Every appeal, whether to the Minister or a Court, shall be instituted by notice in writing in the Form No. 1 in the appendix to these regulations.
- (2) A notice of appeal shall be executed by the appellant or by his Counsel, solicitor or agent.
- Fee.** (3) Every notice of appeal to a Court shall when filed be accompanied by a lodging fee of twenty dollars.
- Particulars to be stated on Notice of Appeal.** 4. Every notice instituting an appeal shall set out—
(a) the substance of the decision, determination or matter appealed from;
(b) the date of such decision, determination or matter;
(c) the grounds on which the appeal is brought and particulars of the land building or work, if any, affected;
(d) an address for service within the State at or to which notices, plans, drawings and all other documents of whatever kind relating to the appeal may be delivered to or served on the appellant.
- Time for lodging appeal.** 5. (1) Where an appeal is to—
(a) the Minister, the notice of appeal shall be lodged with the Secretary to the Minister; or
(b) a Court, the notice of appeal shall be entered by the appellant in the Courts office and notice of appeal shall be filed therewith,
within thirty days of the date of the decision, determination or matter in respect of which the appeal is made.
- (2) A copy of the notice of appeal shall be given as soon as practicable after it is so lodged or so filed, as the case may be, where the appeal is an appeal of such a kind as is referred to in—
(a) subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of the definition “appeal” in section 37 of the Act to the Minister and to such responsible authority as is therein referred to;
(b) subparagraph (ii) of that paragraph—to the Minister and to the Town Planning Board;
(c) subparagraph (iii) of that paragraph—to the Minister and to the Council of the Municipality against whose demand the appeal is instituted;
- Persons on whom notice of appeal to be served.**

- (d) paragraph (b) of that definition—to the Minister and the responsible authority specified in the town planning scheme in respect of which the question the subject of the appeal arose;
- (e) paragraph (c) of that definition—to the Minister and to The Metropolitan Region Planning or local authority against whose decision or determination the appeal is instituted.
6. Where an appeal has been made to a Court and a copy of the notice instituting the appeal has been served on the Minister as required by regulation 5 of these regulations, the Minister may, within fourteen days after receiving the copy, by notice in writing lodged in the Court's office, object to a Court hearing the appeal on the grounds that upholding the appeal would be contrary to town planning principles, in general or in respect of land the subject of the appeal, and would tend to prejudice the public interest.
7. (1.) Where the Governor makes a declaration pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section 42 of the Act, the appellant in the appeal to which the declaration relates may elect, by notice in writing in the form No. 2 in the appendix to these regulations, that the appeal shall become an appeal to the minister.
- (2) The notice of election shall be served on the Minister and a copy thereof on a Court within fourteen days of the date of the Governor's declaration.
- (3) A copy of the Governor's declaration shall be served on a Court as soon as practicable after it is made by the Governor.
8. A determination of the Minister or a Court made on appeal shall be given effect according to its tenor within the period stipulated therein or within such extended period as the Minister or a Court, as the case may be, determines.
9. An appeal shall be withdrawn if—
- (a) the appellant, by notice in writing in the Form No. 3 in the appendix to these regulations—
- (i) served on the Minister, in the case of an appeal to the Minister;
- (ii) served on a Court, in the case of an appeal to a Court. withdraws the appeal; or
- (b) the appellant either in person or by his counsel or solicitor intimates to the Minister or a Court that the appellant withdraws the appeal.
10. A party to an appeal to a Court who wishes to refer at any hearing of the appeal to any law report, Act, regulation, by-law, document or writing of any kind shall, unless the Court hearing the appeal otherwise directs, at least six days before the hearing, serve notice in writing on the Court, giving details of the law report, Act, regulation, by-law, document or writing to which reference will be made, and serve a copy of the notice on each other party to the appeal.
11. A party to an appeal to a Court intending to tender in evidence, at any hearing of the appeal, any map, plan, photograph, drawing or sketch shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, at least six days before the hearing serve on the Court three copies of the map, plan, photograph, drawing or sketch and on every other party to the appeal, one copy thereof.
12. (1) Any document or copy thereof required to be served in pursuance of these regulations may be served—
- (a) by delivering it personally to the person so required to be served or to his agent;
- (b) by post, as certified mail pursuant to the regulations made under the Post and Telegraph Act 1901, of the Commonwealth Parliament, addressed to the usual or last known place of abode or business of such person;
- (c) in the case of a document or copy thereof required to be served on a council or any body corporate, by delivering it to the Town or Shire Clerk, as the case requires, or to the secretary of the corporate body, or by leaving it at the office of such clerk or secretary with some person apparently employed there, or by sending it by post as such certified mail addressed to such clerk or secretary at his office;
- (d) in the case of a document or copy thereof required to be served on a Court, by lodging it at the Court's office.
- (2) Where a document or copy thereof is served, pursuant to this regulation by post, the service thereof shall be presumed unless the contrary is shown, to have been effected at the time when, by ordinary course of post, it would be delivered.
13. In addition to any powers conferred on a Court by or under the Act, a Court is empowered, of its own motion or at the request of any party to an appeal, to direct the appellant or the party against whose decision, determination or matter the appeal is instituted, as the case requires, within such time as the Court directs to deliver to

DRAFT MODEL BY-LAWS.

Principal by-laws. 1. In these by-laws, the Local Government Model By-laws (Street Lawns and Gardens) No. 11 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th February, 1963, are referred to as the principal by-laws.

By-law 2 substituted. 2. By-law 2 of the principal by-laws is revoked and the following by-law substituted:—

2. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
“the Act” means the Local Government Act, 1960 (as amended) and, except as otherwise in this by-law provided, words and expressions have the same meanings as they have in the Act;

“carriageway” means a portion of a road that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, and includes the shoulders, and areas, including embayments, at the side or centre of the road, used for the standing or parking of vehicles; but does not include a lane, right of way or driveway;

“footpath” includes that part of a road set apart or constructed for the use of pedestrians and every established footway, pavement, lane, thoroughfare or any other part of a road set apart for the use of pedestrians, and, where any part of a road is not so set apart or constructed, that portion on both sides of a road ten feet in width measured from the property line and extending alongside such road;

“intersection” includes the area comprised within imaginary straight lines joining in succession the points of transection of the property lines of two or more roads that meet each other; except that where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection of the property lines shall be regarded as the point on the curve nearest to the point at which those property lines, if extended in straight lines from each end of the curve, would meet;

“junction” includes that part of a road lying between imaginary straight lines at right angles to the road commencing from the points of transection formed by its own property lines with the property lines of a road which abuts thereon; except that where the property lines are curved at any corner, the point of transection formed by the property lines shall be determined in the same manner as is provided in the definition of “intersection”;

“property line” means the boundary between the land comprising a street and the land that abuts thereon.

By-law 12 amended. 3. By-law 12 of the principal by-laws is amended by adding after sub-by-law (2) thereof new sub-by-laws as follows:—

(3) Where an offence is alleged to have been committed against this by-law by the driver or person in charge of a vehicle, that person shall, if required by a member of the Police Force or an officer of the council, furnish the member or officer with his full name and address.

(4) The owner of a vehicle shall, if required by a member of the Police Force or an officer of the council so to do within seven days of the commission of the alleged offence, inform the member or officer as to the identity and address of the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at the time when the offence is alleged to have been committed.

(5) Where the owner at the time the offence was alleged to have been committed, fails, when required so to do, within seven days of the commission of the alleged offence, to inform a member of the Police Force or an officer of the council as to the identity and address of the person who was the driver or person in charge of the vehicle at that time, the owner shall be deemed to be the person who committed that offence and

shall then be liable to the penalty prescribed in respect thereof, unless the owner could not reasonably have been aware of the identity of the driver or person in charge, or unless the vehicle was stolen or being unlawfully used without the knowledge of the owner at the time the offence was alleged to have been committed.

(6) Where the member of the Police Force or the clerk of the council is satisfied that the owner of a vehicle could not reasonably have been aware of the identity of the driver or person in charge, or where the vehicle was stolen or being unlawfully used without the knowledge of the owner at the time the offence was alleged to have been committed, no proceedings shall be taken against the owner for the recovery of the penalty prescribed in respect of the offence.

(7) For the purposes of this by-law the expression "owner" in relation to a vehicle shall be deemed to include any person who would be an owner of that vehicle within the meaning assigned to the expression "owner" by section 4 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1970.

4. Every owner or occupier of land upon whom a notice is served under by-law 3 of these by-laws, shall comply with such notice within the time therein specified and any owner or occupier of land who fails to comply with the terms of the notice so served, shall be guilty of an offence.

Shire of Kojonup.

By-laws for the Control of Dogs.

L.G. 119/59.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Dog Act 1903, the Shire of Kojonup doth hereby make the following by-laws for the control of dogs within the area of the Shire of Kojonup and repeal all by-laws at present in force within the Shire of Kojonup in so far as they relate to the above subject matter.

1. In these by-laws the term "Shire Council" means the Shire of Kojonup.
2. The Shire Council may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903.
3. A dog seized by the Police or by an officer authorised by the Shire Council may be placed in a pound.
4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Shire Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
5. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Shire Council.
6. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees specified in the schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the Poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Shire Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Shire Council in respect of the delivery of the dog in good faith.
8. If the dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Shire Council may sell the dog.
9. Upon the sale of the dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Shire Council and may be disposed of in such manner as the Shire Council thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Shire Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
10. If within the time mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.
11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of Section 19 of the said Dog Act 1903, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk, of the Shire Council if, in the opinion of the Shire Clerk, the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.
12. If the Shire Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Shire Council the fees specified in the Schedule hereto.
13. No person shall—
 - (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Shire Council duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound.
 - (b) destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
 - (c) destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.
15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
 - (a) A public building.
 - (b) A theatre or picture garden.
 - (c) A house of worship.
 - (d) A shop or other public business premises.
16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
 - (a) A Sportsground.
 - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
 - (c) A car park.
 - (d) A school.
 - (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Shire Council other than a road.

17. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from wandering at large without any effective control upon any road being vested in or under the control of the Council.

18. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Shire Council or member of the Police Force in the performing of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

19. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

20. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.

1. In these by-laws the term "Council" shall mean the Capel Shire Council.
2. The Council may establish a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903.
3. A dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Council may be placed in a pound.
4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Council shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then, upon payment of the fees specified in the schedule hereto together with the prescribed licence fee relating to that dog, the dog shall be released to such person.
6. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Council.
7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Council in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
8. If a dog should not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if the dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Council may sell the dog.
9. Upon the sale of a dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Council and may be disposed of in such a manner as the Council thinks fit. The owner of the dog pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Council in respect of the proceeds thereof.
10. If within the times mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog, the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Shire Clerk of the Council if in the opinion of the Shire Clerk the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

12. If the Council shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Council the fee specified in the schedule hereto.

13. No person shall—

- (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Council duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from the pound;
- (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;
- (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

Any person who shall commit a breach of this clause shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40.

14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture gardens.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop or other public business premises.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sportsground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
- (c) A carpark.
- (d) A school.
- (e) Beaches being more specifically:—
 - (i) The foreshore of the Indian Ocean within 40 chains north or south of Peppermint Grove Road at Peppermint Grove Beach.
 - (ii) The foreshore of the Indian Ocean within 40 chains north or south of Forrest Beach Road at Forrest Beach.
- (f) Any land vested or under the control of the Council other than a road.

17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Council or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903 or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of these by-laws.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$20, provided that for a breach of clause 13 the penalty shall not exceed \$40.

(6A) Where any substance to which this regulation applies is prescribed under regulation 51B of these regulations the provisions of paragraph (b) of subregulation (6) of this regulation shall apply in relation to that prescription.
