PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major-General Sir Douglas TO WIT, DOUGLAS KENDREW, Governor. [L.S.] Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886-1937, it is enacted that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include the City of Perth, and every place being within a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth and every other place outside that circle of five miles to which the Governor may, from time to time, by proclamation declare that the Act shall extend; and whereas it is also provided by that section that the Governor shall not make or issue any proclamation under that section to extend the limits of the Act to any place situated within the limits of any municipal council or of any road board outside that circle of five miles unless and until the municipal council or the road board concerned, as the case may be, has by resolution consented thereto; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Kwinana has, by resolution passed on the twenty-seventh day of January, 1971, consented to the extension of the limits of the Act to the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Kwinana: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Kwinana which is a place outside a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

[L.S.] Anthony Kendrew, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section four of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1970, that the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister and the Totalisator Agency Board, from time to time, and at any time, by proclamation declare any portion or portions of the State to be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act and it is also so enacted that a proclamation so made may be cancelled or from time to time varied by a subsequent proclamation; and whereas by various proclamations so made the Governor did declare certain portions of the State to be totalisator agency regions; and whereas the Minister and the Board have recommended that those proclamations be cancelled and that each portion of the State to which each of those proclamations respectively relates together with the portion of the State consisting of the area comprising the Municipal District of the Shire of Roe-bourne, be declared a totalisator agency region for the purposes of the Act: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby-

- (a) cancel each proclamation made under section four of the Totalisator Agency Board Betting Act, 1960-1970, prior to the publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette; and
- (b) declare that the portion of the State which comprises the whole of the State less the area comprising the townsites of the towns of Cranbrook, Ravensthorpe, Watheroo and Wyndham shall be a totalisator agency region for the purposes of that Act,

with effect from and including the 29th day of March, 1971.

THE Shire of Merredin under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon it in that behalf by the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928 (as amended), hereby makes the following Town Planning Scheme.

SCHEME TEXT.

Citation.

1. This Town Planning Scheme may be cited as Shire of Merredin Town Planning Scheme No. 5—Industrial Area Scheme (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

Responsible Authority.

2. The authority responsible for enforcing the observance of this Scheme is the Shire of Merredin (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Maps.

3. The following Maps are attached to this Text and form part of the Scheme:—

Land Use Map.

Scheme Map.

Scheme Area.

4. The Scheme shall apply to the land contained within the inner edge of a broken black line on the Land Use Map. The said land is hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme Area".

General Objects.

- 5. The general objects of the Scheme are—
 - (a) To make land available for use for industrial and light industrial purposes.
 - (b) To make suitable provision for roads and traffic within the Scheme Area.
 - (c) To ensure the proper drainage of those parts of the Scheme Area that require drainage.
 - (d) To make provision for public open space within the Scheme Area.
 - (e) To make available suitable land within the Scheme Area for relocation thereon of industries carried on upon land elsewhere in the District of the Council and without limiting the generality of the foregoing to make available suitable land within the Scheme Area for relocation of bulk fuel installations now situate elsewhere in the District of the Council.

Scheme Works.

6. The following works shall be carried out within the Scheme Area:---

- (a) The Area shall be surveyed in conformity with the design shown on the Scheme Map with such amendments as may from time to time be approved by the Town Planning Board and the Council.
- (b) The land shown as roads on the Scheme Map of which the carriage-way is coloured yellow shall be constructed and drained and any necessary earthworks undertaken.
- (c) Levelling, filling and drainage works shall be carried out where necessary and land shall be acquired for drainage reserves.

- (d) Those buildings and fences which in the opinion of the Council interfere with the proper development of the land within the Scheme Area according to the new subdivision will be demolished or otherwise removed and in cases considered destrable by the Council such fences and buildings may be re-erected.
- (e) The land coloured light blue on the Scheme Map should be set aside for public open space and drainage reserves.

Acquisition of Land.

7. The land within the Scheme Area or so much thereof as is in the opinion of the Council necessary to implement the Scheme shall be resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. The Council shall not be obliged to resume the whole of the Scheme Area at one time but may acquire such part or parts thereof progressively and in such manner as it shall from time to time determine.

Scheme Costs.

8. The costs of the Scheme shall be as follows:—

- (a) The administration costs of the Scheme.
- (b) The costs of carrying out the Scheme works and of such other works as shall in the opinion of the Council be of benefit to the Scheme Area.
- (c) All compensation payable and all costs and expenses of determining and settling compensation.
- (d) The costs of acquisition of any land within the Scheme Area in the event of such land being acquired other than by resumption.

Sale of Lots Created by the Re-survey of the Scheme Area.

9. Subject to the powers of the Council hereinafter contained the Council shall sell the lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area. Such lots may be sold by public auction or private contract as a whole or in separate lots upon such terms and conditions as the Council may think fit. In the event of a sale by private contract the price shall not be less than the price recommended by the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia unless after submitting the land for sale by public auction or tender that price has not been obtained.

Valuation of Lots.

10. The Council may instead of selling all or any of the lots created by the re-survey of the Scheme Area ascertain the value of them or of those unsold from the Chief Valuer of the Taxation Department of Western Australia and credit the Scheme with the value so ascertained and in that event the lots shall be the property of the Council and shall be retained sold or otherwise dealt with in such manner as the Council thinks fit.

Development of Land by Owners.

11. If an owner of land wishes to subdivide and develop his land within the Scheme Area and shall pay his proportion of the Scheme Costs and enter into such agreement as the Council considers necessary or desirable in the circumstances the Council may permit such owner to develop such land accordingly. For the purpose of this clause the owner's proportion of the Scheme **c**osts shall be that proportion of the costs of the Scheme works as the area of land to be subdivided and developed by the owner bears to the total area of land within the Scheme Area.

12. If in the circumstances of any particular case the Council considers it desirable to alter the Scheme Map in order to meet the site requirements of an industry it may with the consent of the Town Planning Board make such alterations to the subdivisional design on the Scheme Map as it considers desirable.

Profits of the Scheme.

13. If the Scheme shall show a profit the amount of such profit shall be distributed among the owners of privately owned land from whom land has been resumed or otherwise acquired. The distribution shall be in proportion to the value of each owner's land at the date it was resumed or otherwise acquired by the Council. For the pur-pose of this clause the value of any parcel of land shall in the case of purchase be the price thereof and in the case of resumption be the value agreed upon by the parties or assessed by a competent tribunal for the purpose of compensation

Loss of Scheme.

14. If the Scheme shall show a loss the amount of the loss shall be met by the Council.

Council's Land.

15. If the Council owns any land in the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of the Scheme it shall in respect of that land for all purposes have the same rights and be under the same obligations as an owner of land within the Scheme Area.

Zoning.

16. It is intended to apply for the consents of all necessary Authorities for the change of zoning of the land within the Scheme Area progressively as and when such lands are ready for development to permit the lands to be used for Industrial and Light Industrial purposes.

Time Limit for Claims for Compensation.

17. Claims for compensation by reason of the operation of this Scheme shall be made within six (6) months of the coming into operation of this Scheme or the date of the issue of a notice of resumption whichever is the later.

Powers of Council.

18. The Council in the conduct and management of this Scheme shall have the following powers:-

- (a) To enter and inspect the land within the Scheme Area.
- (b) To enter into agreements or arrangements with the owners of any land within the Scheme Area.
- (c) To acquire by purchase or otherwise any land within the Scheme Area.
- (d) To dispose of any lots to which it be-comes entitled as the owner of land within the Scheme Area at the date of the coming into operation of this Scheme upon such terms and conditions as it may think fit. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing the Council may sell the lots singly or in groups and on the con-dition the buildings of a specified character shall within a limited period be con-structed thereon or that the land and buildings be used for a specified purpose.
- (e) To transfer any land acquired by it in pursuance of this Scheme as compensa-tion or part compensation and to enter into agreements relative to the determination and settling of compensation.
- (f) To grant drainage and sewerage easements and dispose of land subject to such easements.
- (g) To grant rallway reserves and for that purpose to transfer land to the Commis-sioner of Railways.
- To enter into agreements with the owners (h) of industries carried on upon land in areas of the District of the Council other than land within the Scheme Area in relation to the relocation of those industries upon land within the Scheme Area.
