Schedule.

By-laws.

1. These by-laws may be cited as the Albany Regional Hospital (Traffic and Grounds) By-laws.

2. In these by-laws unless the contrary intention appears—"hospital" means the public hospital known by the name of the Albany Regional Hospital; "vehicle" has the same meaning as that term in and for the regulation and control of traffic enacted in substitution for that Act, for the time being in force.

3. A person shall not without lawful excuse, be in or upon the hospital premises or the grounds attached or belonging thereto, whether enclosed or fenced or not.

4. A person shall not park, or cause or permit to be parked, a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto except in an area set apart by the Board of the hospital for the purpose and so designated by suitable notices or signs.

5. A person shall not drive a vehicle within the grounds attached to the hospital or belonging thereto at a speed in excess of ten miles per hour.

6. A person shall not, except with the prior approval of the Managing Secretary of the Hospital, drive within the grounds of the hospital, a vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds two tons.

7. A person who contravenes any provision of these by-laws commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten dollars.

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT, 1893-1970.

Rules of The Barristers' Board.

WHEREAS by the Legal Practitioners Act, 1893-1970, (hereinafter called "the Act") The Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered from time to time to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the said Act mentioned; and whereas it is desired to amend the rules of the Board as reprinted pursuant to the provisions of the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, including amendments up to and including Government Gazette (No. 69) of 31st August, 1962, and published in the Government Gazette (No. 6) of 21st January, 1963, and thereafter amended by amendments published in the Government Gazette (No. 45) of 27th May, 1964, and the Government Gazette (No. 44) of 19th April, 1967, and the Government Gazette (No. 44) of 21st May, 1968: Now, therefore, the Board, by virtue of the powers vested in it by and under the Act, doth hereby, at a meeting held on the 19th day of February, 1971, make and publish the following amendments to the said rules, to take effect upon the date of the publication of this notice in the Government Gazette:—

AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES.

Rule 1 is amended by inserting after Part V.—Managing Clerks—Rules 39-50, the following viz:—

Part VA.-Control of Certain Practices-Rule 50A

BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

By-laws of the Nungarin Shire Council, Relating to the Establishment, maintenance and equipment of Bush Fire Brigades for the Shire or any part of the Shire of Nungarin.

Establishment of Brigade.

1. (a) On the resolution of the Council to establish, maintain and equip a bush fire brigade under the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, and regulations thereunder, the brigade shall be formed in accordance with these by-laws; and a name shall be given to the brigade and application accompanied by the resolution of the Council forming the brigade shall be made to the Bush Fires Board for its registration accordingly.

(b) A bush fire brigade may be established for the whole of the Shire or for any specified area thereof.

Appointment of Officers.

2. The Council shall appoint a captain, a first lieutenant, a second lieutenant and such additional lieutenants as it shall deem necessary to act as officers of the brigade and who, in the Council's opinion, have the necessary qualification and knowledge of the district required in such capacities.

3. The Shire Clerk or such other person as the Council may appoint, shall be the Secretary of the brigade.

4. The Council may appoint an equipment officer who shall be responsible for the custody and maintenance in good order and condition of all equipment and appliances acquired by the Council for the purposes of the brigade. Such officer may station such equipment at a depot or depots approved by the captain, where, if possible motor trucks can easily be called upon. If there is more than one such depot in the area, the equipment officer shall appoint at each depot a person to look after the equipment and have it ready for immediate use when required.

5. The Council shall appoint bush fire control officers in accordance with the requirements of the district and may prescribe the area over which each such officer shall have jurisdiction. The employment, dismissal and payment for services of persons (other than officers) employed for duties under this Act shall be vested in the President and Shire Clerk of the Council conjointly.

Duties of Officers.

6. The duties of all officers appointed under these by-laws shall be as laid down in the provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, and each officer so appointed shall be supplied with a copy of the Act and regulations. The captain shall have full control over the members of the brigade whilst engaged in fire fighting and shall issue instructions as to the methods to be adopted by the firemen. In the absence of the captain, the first lieutenant; and in the absence of the first, the second lieutenant or senior officer of the brigade present at the fire shall exercise all the powers and duties of the captain.

Membership of Brigades.

7. (1) Members of a bush fire brigade shall be those persons being ablebodied members of either sex, over 15 years of age, who are willing to render service or assistance at any bush fire when called upon; and who sign an undertaking in the form contained in the Schedule to these by-laws.

(2) The enrolment of persons as members shall in every case be subject to the approval of the Council.

Finance.

8. The expenditure incurred by the council in the purchase of equipment, payment for services and generally for the purpose of this Act, shall be a charge on the ordinary revenue of the Council, but the Shire Clerk shall keep record of the expenditure incurred under this Act.

Meetings of Brigades.

9. Meetings will be held as necessary.
