# Land Act, 1933-1969. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. 3773/59.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1969, it is inter alia, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 30820 (Esperance Lot 678) should, subject as aforesaid be granted in fee simple to the Recherche Aged Welfare Committee Incorporated to be held in trust for "Aged Peoples Homes": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the aforesaid body, to be held in trust for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Corres. 1879/70.—That Reserve No. 30818 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Esperance in trust for the purpose of "Staff Quarters—Shire of Esperance".

Corres 943/69.—That Reserve No. 30824 should vest in and be held by the Shire of Dandaragan in trust for the purpose of "Parking Area".

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned Reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies, in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.




